

BREAKDOWN OF CRIME

Between 0230 and 0430 on 9th June 2012, an attempt was made to enter a building on the High Street. This was unsuccessful but damage had been caused to a window and frame. There are no suspects for this.

Item 11c brought forward C35/12/13 BNatural

Nick English and Mark Powell-Davis, organisers B Natural, gave a short presentation regarding plans for the 2012 music festival. It was proposed, weather permitting, to extend the Sunday session and to have more workshops that people could join in with.

Regarding finance for the event, there was no funding expected from the County Council this year. The stage could be borrowed free of charge again. The most expensive item would be the public address system for use on the square and funding towards this was sought from the Parish Council.

Proposed by Cllr Guttridge and seconded by Cllr Lester that, in accordance with minute **C4/12/13** of 16 April 2012, a grant £1,000 be awarded for the purpose of financing a public address system at the appropriate time.

Permission was given to the organisers of the BNatural Music Festival to use part of the Market Square on 7th July 2012 for entertainment, refreshments and sale of items. To promote and raise funds for Bildeston's Bnatural Music festival in September

C36/12/13 SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL

C38/12/13 ADOPTION OF 'NEW' CODE OF CONDUCT

Traffic Calming

There had been a lower than expected turn out to the meeting held 16 May. However, concern regarding the speed of traffic in the village had been identified in the Village Plan. After some discussion on the various options being considered for traffic calming, it was AGREED that the optimum solution would be:

- Gateways at both ends of the High Street and on Ipswich Road;
- · Flashing sign at least at the Hitcham end of the village,
- Pavement widening outside Tower House
- Pushing the 30mph zone further out of the village at Ipswich Road and north and south ends of the High Street

In parallel with this, Cllrs Lindsay and Cartwright would approach the County Council's cabinet transport member to ask if Bildeston could join other villages undertaking 20mph limit pilot schemes.

Cllrs Lindsay and Cartwright would also approach the County Council's officers to try to obtain a firmer estimate of costs.

PROJECTS AND FUNDING

Sportsfield (item 10 on the agenda)

Cllr Lester gave a presentation describing improvement works at the Sportsfield. With the aid of photographs, he showed the problems and explained various proposals for enhancement of the facility. There was still a problem with fly tipping. The main proposal was to have the rubbish cleared, a bund created around the car park and to have the area levelled and reseeded. He had received a quotation for £2,500 to complete this work. He also proposed the adoption of a maintenance regime at a cost of a further £290 per annum. **RESOLVED** that this work be proceeded with in accordance with the quotation.


