WARNING OF WINTER FUEL THEFTS

Homeowners in Suffolk on oil fired heating and hot water systems are reminded about the risks of oil thefts during this winter season. Suffolk Police are warning residents to remain vigilant throughout January and February when the demand for oil tends to increase. Apparently oil is the third most attractive commodity for thieves targeting rural properties. The best solution is to make it as hard as possible for thieves to get at your oil tank. Measures that you can take include:

- ensuring the filler cap and manual fuel dispensing nozzle has a secure, robust lock
- · sensor lights illuminate the tank area
- disguising or 'hiding' the tank with fencing or shrubs, especially prickly ones!
- regularly checking your tank for signs of tampering
- look out for each other if you notice suspicious activity by strangers
- alert your Neighbourhood Watch representatives
- never attempt to approach criminals yourself, things could get nasty.
 Always call the police.

'THE RIDDLE OF THE SANDS: A RECORD OF SECRET SERVICE'

This is my favourite book, the one I turn to time after time again. The one I read if I'm away from home or feeling poorly or just can't find anything better.

The Riddle of the Sands by Eskine Childers is a cross between an adventure and a spy story. I like it for the descriptive and atmospheric writing describing the watery desert of a particular coastal area of muddy river estuaries and sandy islands just off the German coast.

The book was written, and set, in 1903 a few years before the First World War, so I doubt very much that one would find that same place now. Rather like The Camargue that used to appear in an early TV programme. I once went there, in search of the same place but found only a rather oily looking stagnant lagoon beside a road, although there were a few flamingoes having a paddle. No white horses galloping through the long wind swept grasses! Does this prove that it's better to travel in hope than to actually arrive!

The book's plot was used to make a film of the same name starring Michael York and Simon McCorkindale in 1979. An official in the Foreign Office is invited by a friend for a holiday on a sailing yacht in the Baltic. The friend then admits that he suspects the Germans are planning an invasion of Britain. Together they sail dangerous waters in more ways than one in order to find evidence of the plot. There is excitement, adventure and a love interest!

REMEMBER THE 1970'S?

You may be aware that the **Museum of East Anglian Life** at Stowmarket are putting on a brand new exhibition starting in March called 'Escape to the Country'.

The intention is to explore why city folk upped sticks and left all that dirt, grime, smoke, hassle, noise and bustle and came to live in rural East Anglia during the 1970's. Why would you want to come to a place full of greenery, clean, clear air, the sounds of bird song, life at the pace of the farming year, local markets, friendly neighbours, thatched cottages, decent beer? Why, oh why?

The museum is asking people throughout this month to tell them which objects they think represent 'the good life' from that time. They have already received loads of suggestions but now the Museum of East Anglian Life wants to go one stage further and actually get examples of objects that reflect and represent our way of life in that decade. Is there anything from Bildeston for the exhibition?

As a reminder of the 1970's think on this:

- only 64% of people owned a washing mashine
- 91% of people owned a television, just the one, huge great cathode tube!
- the first domestic microwave was sold in 1974
- VHS recorders went on sale in 1978
- 1971 Britain's money was decimilised, no more pounds, shillings and pence
- platform shoes and flared trousers and hot pants were all the rage!
- space hoppers and Raleigh Chopper bikes were very popular
- Ford Cortina was best selling car
- the first Star Wars film came out along with all the plastic figures
- the first Jumbo jet Boeing 747 landed at Heathrow PanAm 1970
- the world's first (and only) supersonic airliner, Concorde, came into service in 1976
- The Queen's Silver Jubilee celebrations in 1977, street parties everywhere!
- the first email sent in 1971 invented by Ray Tomlinson
- Digital watches and cameras invented and the first true mobile phone, though it was larger than a house brick!

Recipe of the Month

Classic Beef Bourguignon



Ingredients

4 rashers of streaky smoked chopped bacon

750g/1lb 10oz large diced stewing steak

4 tbsp flour

12 baby onions or shallots, peeled 1 carrot, peeled sand chopped

225g/8oz quartered mushrooms

400ml/14fl oz boiling water

1 beef stock cube

300ml/half pint red wine

1 tbsp tomato paste

2 cloves garlic, chopped

1 tsp dried thyme

2 bay leaves

salt and freshly ground black pepper

Method (serves 4 people)

- 1. Make this classic beef dish in your slow cooker and leave to stew for a rich tasting dish. A perfect winter warmer the whole family will love.
- 2. Preheat the heating base to Low. In a large frying pan, add the streaky bacon and cook until slightly crispy then place in the slow cooker.
- 3. Toss the beef in the flour. Heat the oil in the frying pan, and cook the floured beef in small batches to colour slightly. Add the bacon in the slow cooker.
- 4. Lightly colour the baby onions or shallots and carrots in the frying pan then add to the slow cooker along with the mushrooms. Mix together the boiling water, stock cube, red wine, tomato paste, garlic, thyme and bay leaves and pour over the meat.
- 5. Season well and place the lid on top. Cook for 5-6 hours on Low, or until the meat is tender, or 2-3 hours on High.

- 6. Once cooked remove the lid and thicken slightly if needed mix cornflour with a little water to make a paste then add to the dish and stir through. Heat on High for a few minutes to thicken.
- 7. Serve with mashed potatoes and green beans or cabbage.

FACTS ABOUT FEBRUARY

The Celts and Romans regarded February as the start of Spring, but country lore has this warning:

When the cat lies in the sun in February
She will creep behind the stove in March.

Of all the months of the year, curse a fair February.

If it thunders in February, it will frost in April.

If February give much snow,

A fine summer it doth foreshow.

The Anglo Saxons called February 'Sol-monath' meaning cake month, because cakes were offered to the Gods during this month. In Shakespeare's time the second month in the year was called 'Feverell'. In Isaac Newton's time 100 years later, it was called 'Februeer'. The modern name February is only just over a hundred years old and comes from the word 'februa' which means cleansing or purifying. It more than likely commemorates the ritual purification of Mary forty days after the birth of Jesus.

There are some important and interesting dates in February. For example, 2nd February is Candlemas. This ancient festival marks the midpoint of winter, halfway between the shortest day and the spring equinox. It was the day when all the candles, due to be used in the coming year, were brought into church and blessed.

Then 14th February brings St. Valentine's Day. Traditionally thought to be the day on which birds chose their mates! There are many traditions associated with romantic activities on Valentine's Day, such as:

- The first man an unmarried woman saw on the 14th would be her future husband!
- If a woman saw a robin flying overhead on Valentine's Day, it meant she would marry a sailor. If she saw a sparrow, she would marry a poor man and be very happy, and if she saw a goldfinch she would marry a rich man!

Each year we spend around £53 million on cards, flowers, chocolates and other gifts on our partners! Some garages sell more flowers than petrol on that day!! Shrove Tuesday is usually in February, but because it is 47 days before Easter Sunday and that date varies from year to year in 2014 Shrove Tuesday is actually 4^{th} March! Pancake Day, the last day before Lent, the time to use up fat, butter and eggs which used to be forbidden during Lent. Ash Wednesday is 17^{th} February, the shortest, but very interesting month.

Councillor Taylor opened the meeting and welcomed everyone present.



C168/13/14 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Guttridge and Lindsay, and also from District Councillor Keane

C169/13/14 DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY AND NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

The Clerk recorded a non-pecuniary interest by Councillor Taylor with respect to Kings' Pightle and the Sportsfield

C170/13/14 DISPENSATIONS IN RESPECT OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS

There were none.

C171/13/14 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

It was AGREED: That the minutes of the meeting held on 9th December, 2013 be approved and signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

C172/13/14 MID-SUFFOLK CAB

Roger Colthorpe gave a presentation on the work of Mid-Suffolk CAB.

It was AGREED: That posters about the CAB be placed on the Parish Noticeboard, at the Doctor's Surgery and taken to the Baptist Church and that the CAB be invited to prepare an article on their work for inclusion within "The Bugle".

C173/13/14 POLICE REPORT

There had been 4 crimes in the High Street committed in the early hours of the morning on 28th December 2013. There had been no further crimes reported between 9th December, 2013 to 9th January, 2014.

It was AGREED: That the Clerk contacts the Police about crime on the High Street.

C174/13/14 DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT

There was no report on this occasion

C175/13/14 CO-OPTION TO THE PARISH COUNCIL

It was noted that there had been an expression of interest from Mr Peter Bullen with regard to the two vacancies that existed on the Parish Council. Mr Bullen addressed the Parish Council in support of his expression of interest.

It was AGREED: That Mr Peter Bullen be co-opted to serve on the Parish Council.

(Mr Bullen signed the declaration of acceptance of office and received a copy of the Code of Conduct.)

C176/13/14 STREET LIGHTS

There was a brief discussion about priority areas within the village that had fault histories and options were considered for replacement of street lights or provision of new lights using existing columns in such areas. More energy efficient lighting could also be examined as part of the forthcoming review.

It was AGREED: That members of the Parish Council canvass local residents about street lighting arrangements in the village and report back to the next meeting

C177/13/14 SKATE PARK UPDATE

Councillor Taylor confirmed that bins had been delivered and installed and that a picnic bench would be installed at the Coronation Playground in the early Spring. The actions of the Clerk regarding site ownership be noted.

It was AGREED:

- a. That the Clerk liaises with the Skate Park Group over inspection arrangements for the Skate Park and emptying of bins on site: and
- b. County Councillors Taylor and Lester attend to the tree overhanging the Playground from the neighbouring property, following the Parish Council's recent letter to the landowner, and remove one set of football goals.

C178/13/14 TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES

There had been no response received from the County Council regarding the gateway treatments.

C179/13/14 - VILLAGE GROUND MAINTENANCE ARRANGEMENTS

Councillor Taylor referred to the proposals to consolidate grounds maintenance arrangements in the village. Issues of local supply and preferred equipment manufacturer were discussed. It was noted that the current contract could roll forward until the new maintenance arrangements were put in place.

It was AGREED: That the Chair and Clerk examine procurement issues and report back to a future meeting.

C180/13/14 SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT

Councillor Mrs Antill had submitted a report on the following matters:

- 80 new apprenticeships being created in the County details could be found at local Job Centres (Councillor Antill was requested to provide information for inclusion within "The Bugle")
- A Conference on Rail Services in Suffolk focussing on future needs and electrification of the route from East Midlands to Felixstowe

The deadline of 15th January for School Admissions applications. 92% of applicants in 2013 had been allocated their first choice school.

- The County Council Cabinet Member, Councillor Newman, had agreed that Parish Councils could procure their own VAS (Vehicle Activitation System) subject to assessment of the proposed site by a County Council Road Traffic Engineer

Councillors Guttridge and Taylor were asked to confirm the preferred location of the new

village sign on Ipswich Road and notify Mr Merry at the County Council.

Councillor Lester referred to the number of traffic accidents on the Hadleigh Road and the Clerk was asked to seek the incident record for the road from the County Council.

The impact of accidents upon road verges and the need to rebuild those verges was raised and Councillor Antill responded that she would raise it during her next meeting with County Highways officers.

It was AGREED: That the report be noted

C181/13/14 UPDATE ON VILLAGE AMENITIES

Councillor Drury referred to a recent booking enquiry by a band seeking a regular spot at the Sportsfield pavilion. The Police had dealt quickly with recent reports of problems being caused by people riding their motorbikes in the area.

C182/13/14CLERK'S UPDATE AND MATTERS CONSIDERED AT A PREVIOUS MEETING

The Clerk.would refer once again the overgrowth near to the garages at Brooksfield to Tenancy Services as it had not been resolved.

The Clerk would seek the removal of the black wheeled bin in Paddocks Way by the District Council and notify the District Council of the new bins at Coronation Playground and Paddocks Way so that they would be included as part of the collection route.

The grants round would be opening and local groups and organisations were invited to apply for grant funding as part of the Parish Council's Annual Grants round. The bin on Chamberlin Close required holes to be drilled into the bottom to improve drainage.

It was AGREED: That the report be received and noted

C183/13/14 FINANCIAL MATTERS

a) Parish Precept

The Clerk submitted the Budget Book for 2014/15 and answered questions from members of the Parish Council about the draft budget. It was noted that the tax base for 2014/15 had been significantly reduced by the District Council following a change in the application of its tax base methodology. Some compensatory grant support had been awarded but there had also been a reduction of 25% grant support provided under the Local Council Tax Grant Support Scheme. The implication was that the overall Precept would reduce when compared with the previous year unless there was a small increase in Council Tax.

The budget and Precept was considered with reference to the Parish Council's extensive work programme for the ensuing year including proposals for new traffic calming measures, street lights and grounds maintenance. In addition, it was identified that works were required to the Clock Tower.

It was AGREED: That the Precept for 2014/15.shall be set at £19,500 (including grant of £2,024) which is an annual increase of £1.46 for a Band D property (3.01%).
