COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER

Another month gone, consigned to history with just memories as we move from summer into autumn. August despite our hopes turned out to be one of the coolest on record with little in the way of sunshine. A promise of an Indian Summer is forecast. I wondered where the saying Indian summer originated. The most probable origin goes back to the very early settlers in New England. Each year they would welcome the arrival of cold wintry weather in late October when they could leave their stockades unarmed. But then came a time when it would suddenly turn warm again, and the native Americans would

decide to have one more go at the settlers. "Indian summer," the settlers called it. Sounds plausible (just) !!! It's around this time of year thoughts turn to the rich pickings available to us in the surrounding hedgerows. Sloe berries are around but still a little early to pick. Blackberries are in abundance, damsons and wild bullace are all there for the taking. Our home brew this year is a rich wild garden berry liquor consisting of blackberry, raspberry, black and red currants. These fruits are mashed with a fork to break and release the juices then put inside a sterilised demijohn. A goodly quantity of gin is added along with sugar, a cinnamon stick, pinch of cloves and you're done. Turing the bottle daily and giving a good shake dissolves the sugar, the drink should be ready to decanter and strain for Christmas. If it survives the 'tastes'!

The main hedgerow crop seems to be blackthorn (Prunus spinosa) covered this year with sloes only on trees that face west (the eastside catches the early morning sun that dispels spring frosts too quickly and destroys the earliest off-white fluffy blossom). These tiny rock-hard fruits with their blue-black bloom will stay on the boughs until the frosts, but can be picked with the cold spell replicated in the freezer, then steeped in gin and sugar with a twist of lemon peel in time for Christmas. The strained fruit pulp can be set in slabs of chocolate for post-festivity dental kamikaze. Put on the compost heap can result in black birds staggering around high on the alcohol content! Ancestor of the cultivated plum, blackthorn makes an efficient hedge, its spiny branches will keep out all creatures great and small, while attracting many others, but its peripheries need to be regularly clipped to keep suckers at bay. One size up is the cherry plum (Prunus cerasifera) and the French mirabelle (Prunus institia). Varieties including 'Ruby', 'Golden sphere' and 'Mirabelle de Nancy' are delicious in jams, and make a mean plum brandy. While I was on one of my foraging walks in the Bildeston area I caught a glimpse of something in the corner of my eye. It was a large, light-colored orb in a tree. My first thought was oak galls, which can be found on some of the oaks around here. I stopped and looked. This was no oak tree, and those were not galls! They were wild plums and the tree was loaded with them. How this tree got there is a mystery. Maybe it is the result of a long forgotten autumn picnic where a plum stone was tossed into the hedgerow. These plums are very different from the cherry-plums in suburbia. The wildlings taste, well, wilder. More tannic, coated in a pretty bloom like a white wine grape. Tart like the cherry plums, but not as sugary, my kind of fruit. And they are all mine. No one else knows about this tree. It is well off the beaten path, and even though the tree is loaded and the fruit is ripe, not one had been picked. It is my Mike Biddulph secret treasure!



THE BUGLE INTERVIEW

Bildeston has a budding young international sailing champion. Matthew Smith, an up an coming 15 year old, who came 3rd in a recent World sailing competition.

What sailing class do you compete in, what type of boat and competitions?

Until very recently I raced in the RS Tera class, a youth single handed sailing boat, but I have now moved on to Racing an RS Feva, another youth class, this time double handed. The RS Tera has one sail and is a relatively new type of boat, providing competitive, high performance racing for young people. The RS Feva has three sails, this is why lots of people start in a single sailed boat like the RS Tera and then move onto a boat with more technical aspects. I race people around my age, some a bit younger some a bit older, there is an age limit on the youth classes of 18, so some people can be up to 3 years older than me. Although most tend to be my age. I race in all kind of events, ranging from local zone championships, National Championships to International events.

Tell us about your recent success in Holland?

I went for the RS Tera World Championships, in Bruinisse, Holland. I had a really great event and managed to come back with third after the week's racing. It came after lots of hard work and training, I spent lots of hours with my coaches whenever possible, and when I couldn't get out training in the boat I was out running, cycling or doing circuit training and exercises set by my coaches. I couldn't have come back with the result if it wasn't for all the support from my coaches, parents and sponsor.

Sailing is such a technical sport, how did you first learn what to do?

The first time I went out sailing I was ten and some of my friends already did it. They offered to take me and my brother Dom out in their boat, and after a taste we both wanted to continue, so we did a beginners' course at Alton Water, where I now work as an Assistant Instructor. It was fun and great to learn in but after a while we decided we wanted to start racing, so we joined Alton Water's 'Sailing Academy'. After a couple of years I got my own boat. That year lots of people started taking up RS Teras at Alton Water so an Eastern Squad was put together, based at Alton. I have now been in the squad nearly four years, and am now leaving as I move on to sail other classes. However at the end of last season I was offered a place in the National Squad, the team trained by the class to represent the country at national and international events. So last winter as well as training with the Eastern Squad I trained with the National Squad, to try and improve my sailing as much as possible.

Who are your sailing heroes and how do they inspire you?

One of my heroes has to be Sir Ben Ainslie. What inspires me about him is how he shows that there are transferrable skills across all the disciplines of sailing. He started off dinghy racing, then yacht racing, and now one of the best skippers in the America's Cup. What inspires me is his motivation and work ethic. Another Hero is Paul Larsen, the man who holds the sail powered water speed record, whom I was lucky enough to meet last year. My last inspiration in sailing is Steve Cockerill, the owner of my sponsor, Rooster. He is a very skilled sailor who holds multiple National and world titles in various different classes. I have extremely supportive parents who drive me to events, I am very grateful for that and understand that without them I would have had nowhere near the amount of success I have had.



Recipe of the Month

Salted Caramel and Apple Rolls



Ingredients For the filling

- 200g caster sugar
- 1 tbsp water
- 200ml whipping cream
- 3 cooking apples peeled, cored, chopped into small cubes
- 3/4 tsp sea salt

For the dough

- 250 ml milk
- 25 g butter
- 500g strong white flour
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 x 7g sachet fast-action dried yeast
- vegetable oil for greasing

Method

- For the filling, heat the sugar and water in a large saucepan set over a medium heat until the sugar forms a caramel. (Do not stir the caramel)
- 2. Meanwhile gently warm the cream in a saucepan. Carefully add one third of the cream to the caramel and once bubbling has subsided, whisk in the remaining cream and sea salt. Pour the mixture in a bowl and set aside until completely cooked.
- For the dough, warm the milk and butter in a saucepan until the butter has melted and the mixture is lukewarm.
- Sift the flour and salt into a large bowl. Make a well in the centre and add the yeast.
- Stir the milk mixture into the flour mixture until the contents of the bowl comes together as a dough.
- Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured surface and knead for five minutes, or until the dough is smooth and elastic.
- 7. Lightly oil a bowl with a little of the vegetable oil. Place the dough into

- the bowl and turn until it is covered in the oil. Cover the bowl with cling film and set aside in a warm place for one hour, or until the dough has doubled in size.
- 8. Lightly grease two baking trays and line with greaseproof paper.
- Knock the dough back to its original size and turn out onto a lightly floured work surface. Roll the dough out into a large rectangle.
- 10. Drizzle half of the caramel over the dough then scatter with the chopped apples. Roll the dough into a tight cylinder and cut twelve 4cm slices from it.
- Place the rolls, cut side facing upwards, onto the baking trays.
 Cover with a tea towel and set aside to rise for 30 minutes.
- 12. Preheat the oven to 200C/400F/Gas
- 13. Bake the rolls in the oven for 25-35 minutes, or until risen and golden brown. Remove the rolls from the oven and set aside to cool. Drizzle with the remaining caramel.





C74/15/16 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence had been received from Councillors Hubbard and Lester.

C75/15/16 DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY AND NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS Councillors Councillor Taylor declared a non-pecuniary interest as a member of the Kings Pightle Management Committee and Sportsfield Management Committee. Councillor Drury declared a non-pecuniary interest by reason of being a member of the Sportsfield Management Committee. Councillor Guttridge declared a non-pecuniary interest by reason of being a member of the Chamberlin Hall Management Committee.

C76/15/16 DISPENSATIONS IN RESPECT OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS There were none.

C78/15/16 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

It was AGREED: That the minutes of the meeting held on 10th August, 2015 be signed by the Vice-Chair as a correct record.

Councillor A Guttridge, the Chair of the Parish Council, referred to the BNatural Music Festival which had been held in the village during the previous weekend and congratulated the organisers for arranging such a successful event. He welcomed the attendance of representatives of the Neighbourhood Planning Working Group at BNatural and their significant efforts to re-invigorate community interest in the development of a neighbourhood plan for the village. The visit of the Tour of Britain cycle tour to Bildeston had been enjoyed by local people and the Chair referred to an article that had appeared in a recent edition of "Motorhomes" magazine on Suffolk which featured an extended section on Bildeston. Given the healthy attendance at the meeting, Councillor Guttridge took the opportunity to identify that there were two vacancies on the Parish Council and invited anyone who was interested to attend one or two meetings to find out more about the role of Parish Councillor.

C78/15/16 FORMER TAYLOR'S GARAGE SITE

Mr Will Nicholls of Strutt and Parker gave a presentation on outline proposals for residential development of the brown field site at the former Taylor's Garage site and the green field to the rear. A mixed development of approximately 45 properties was proposed containing a range of 3 and 4 bed family homes with possibly two, five-bedroomed homes. In the region of 35% of the development would be affordable homes in accordance with the District Council's planning policies. Planting around the edge of the site would be retained and there was an opportunity to help the local community through, for example, easing congestion near to the school by the creation of a new drop off arrangement with access from the new development or the implementaion of other measures to alleviate the problem. Mr Nicholls indicated his wish to engage with the Parish Council, the Neighbourhood Plan Working Group and the Keep Bildeston Beautiful Group in



developing proposals for the site. However, he indicated that the extent of the development would need to take into account the viability of the site and its attractiveness to potential developers in terms of size and scale.

The Chair of the Parish Council indicated that the Parish Council would wish to reserve its position until a formal planning application was submitted, when it would be able to examine the full proposals in detail. In providing some feedback to the developer at this stage, it was suggested that the scheme should integrate effectively with the rest of the village with direct pedestrian access provided to the centre of the village. It was also suggested that the developer might wish to consider the results of the community survey that had been undertaken for the neighbourhood planning process in assessing the local demand for bungalows and the extent to which they might be incorporated within the proposals.

Mr J Target and Mr S Moffat of the Neighbourhood Plan Working Group expressed a strong wish that the growth of the village should be achieved through phased development. It was essential that any new residential developments should deliver proportionate and sustainable growth which was well-integrated with the existing village and preserved its integrity. The position of the District Council on the replacement of commercial premises with residential premises might also be ascertained by the developer.

Mr J Beales of Keep Bildeston Beautiful recognised that Bildeston was a core village within the Babergh Local Plan and that growth was planned. However, he suggested that growth had to be sustainable and must be appropriate and complimentary to the existing village. Mr Beales referred to the results of the neighbourhood planning consultation in which villagers had expressed their clear preference for smaller, rather than larger new residential developments, comprising 2 and 3 bed properties. He suggested that the developer might wish to be aware of the views that had been expressed in the residents' survey.

A local resident, Mr D Hudson, highlighted the risk of flooding in the area which was evidenced by the fact that the field to the rear of the garage had flooded in two of the past four years. It was suggested that extending the built area of the village through green field development would exacerbate this problem. The green field formed part of the flood plain and any proposed development on the land was likely to be viewed with serious concern by local resdients.

Mr Nicholls indicated that the views of the local community would be considered in determining the size and scale of development and in response to the risk of flooding, he indicated that a flood risk assessment would be conducted and measures could be introduced to address any problems that were identified.

In response to a proposal by Mr Nicholls, the Chair indicated that the Parish Council would be willing to accept a further presentation at a later date on more detailed proposals for the site prior to the submission of a planning application.

In closing the item, the Chair thanked local residents and representatives of the Neighbourhood Planning group and Keep Bildeston Beautiful for their contributions to the discussion.

C79/15/16 POLICE REPORT

During the period 1st to 30th August 2015, it was noted that there had been two crimes committed in the village. In both cases, the victims had requested that there should be no publicity of the details.

C80/15/16 DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Councillor M Creffield referred to the government's agenda for growth in terms of the provision of new housing, a recent visit from the Police and Crime Commissioner and Acting Chief Constable and actions he had taken to call-in for consideration by committee, planning applications where objections had been made by the Parish Council.

C81/15/16 COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Councillor Mrs Antill reported on the following:

- Councils across Suffolk had submitted a joint expression of interest to government about the devolution of powers from central to local government.
- The impact of the government's decision that employers must pay the living wage to their employees which could have a significant effect upon the County Council's finances where suppliers and contractors sought to pass on their additional staff costs to customers.
- Exam results across the county had improved with Suffolk ranked 118th out of 150 education authorities nationally.
- The Suffolk Waste Partnership had announced that aluminium screw tops could be recycled under a new process if the top was screwed back on to the bottle.
- It had been identified that the risk of contracting meningitis was most acute amongst 17 and 18 year olds. Therefore, free vaccines were now being offered at GP surgeries which local people were encouraged to have.
- Further to Minute 72/1516, the sign which had been removed at the junction of Hadleigh Road and Chelsworth Road would be replaced. This would be a smaller sign as suggested by a Parish Council in place of the motorway sized sign that had been in place previously in some parts of the village. It had been clarified that finger sized pointers would not be acceptable to the County Council.

C82/15/16 CLERK'S REPORT

The Clerk raised no new issues.

C83/15/16 RESPONSIBLE FINANCIAL OFFICER'S UPDATE AND AUTHORISATION OF PAYMENTS

The Parish Council noted that there had not been any substantive issues raised by the external auditor concerning the Parish Council's financial and governance arrangements for 2014/15.

It was noted that the Parish Council appointed representatives to serve on the management committees of Chamberlin Hall, Kings Pightle and the Sportsfield and reports were submitted regularly to Parish Council meetings, especially where funding from the Parish Council was involved. The editorial in "the Bugle" had made specific reference to the management of the Chamberlin Hall being delegated by the Parish Council. The Chair indicated that the Chamberlin Hall was a separate charity which was managed in accordance with its constitution by a Management Committee. Hence, it was a separate legal entity from the Parish Council with powers and responsibilities in its own right, rather than delegated from the Parish Council. The Parish Council's formal role was limited to that of custodian trustee holding the title to the property asset. However, the Parish Council would continue to be enagaged in operational aspects through its representation on the Chamberlin Hall Management Committee.

C86/15/16 MATTERS TO BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE COUNCIL

Councillor Drury reported that further to the problems discussed with County Highways about congestion along Newberry Road, a vehicle had been seen parking fully on the pavement. Councillor Dempsey indicated that the oak posts were due to be erected when re-surfacing took place.

Councillor Drury indicated that local residents had raised with her the hazards caused by two bollards when the streetlights went out at night. It was noted that the bollards were probably painted black because they were situated in the conservation area. The Chair and Vice-Chair undertook to investigate the matter.

It was noted that Councillor Lester had received an approach from a local reside nt about cows being in a field which had a public footpath through it.
