# **ED'S COMMENT**

By the end of June we will finally know the outcome of the Referendum on Britain's membership of the European Union. Are we in or out? Have we voted to stay or leave? Remain or Brexit? Regardless of everyone's opinions on this huge debate, whoever chose the 23rd of June as the day for the referendum either knew their history, or, even more spookily, did not! For the 23rd June has cropped up before regarding our relationship with the rest of Europe.

Between 20th and 24th of June in 1520 on what was called The Field of the Cloth of Gold a meeting was arranged to 'increase the bond of friendship' between the king of England, Henry VIII and the king of France, Francis I. The meeting was held at Balinghem near Calais, which in those days was still part of England! This famous meeting took place in order for Henry to try and get the French king's help in having his first marriage declared illegitimate. Amidst the splendour of the two kings trying to outdo each other with hundreds of servants in dozens of marvellous tents spread over the area, nothing much was gained by the event, apart from two powerful rulers in Europe talking to each other!

On Saturday 23rd June a large and well-appointed chapel was set up on the grounds for a special mass and then the kings and queens, together with their nobles dined in great style and went home the next day.

However, just twelve years later in 1532 they met again. This meeting was rather different for it was there that King Henry VIII, signed a secret treaty with the King of France, creating an alliance in order to stop King Charles V taking over the whole of Europe! Charles V was the heir of three of Europe's leading dynasties: the Houses of Valois-Burgundy (Netherlands), Habsburg (Holy Roman Empire), and Trastámara (Spain). He inherited the Netherlands and the Franche-Comté as heir of the House of Valois-Burgundy. From the Habsburgs, he inherited Austria and other lands in central Europe. He was also elected to succeed his Habsburg grandfather, as Holy Roman Emperor. From the Spanish House of Trastámara, he inherited the crowns of Castile, which was developing an empire in the Americas and Asia and a Mediterranean empire that extended to Southern Italy. As a result of all this, his domains spanned nearly four million square kilometres, and were the first to be described as "the empire on which the sun never sets". This huge domain was the closest Europe would ever come to a universal monarchy and why King Henry VIII and the French King felt the need to create an alliance, to prevent the very real fear that Charles V was trying to create one vast European landmass led by just one country under one leader. The two kings, Henry and Francis, sought to limit Charles' power across Europe which threatened their own interests. When was that treaty signed in 1532? Thursday 23rd June! What goes around, comes around, or to put it another way, "Those who do not learn history are doomed to repeat it."

## **COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER**



Early one night mid April, Angie let the two Spaniels out into the back garden. Furious barking ensued. Billy the young Springer had caught a Hedgehog and was strutting around the lawn with the hapless creature securely held in his jaws and seemingly unconcerned by the prickles that were making his gums bleed. A glass of cold water flung in his face was a shock he had not expected and he dropped the Hedgehog which was curled up tight. By the morning it was gone. There is now pretty convincing evidence that hedgehogs are declining severely in Britain, doing

just as badly in the countryside as they are in our towns and cities. It seems that several different factors are at play. We've lost a third of all our hedgehogs in the last ten years. Hedgehogs are found across the UK, absent only from some Scottish islands. Gardens, hedgerows, woodlands, grasslands, parkland and cemeteries are all important hedgehog habitats. Adult hedgehogs travel between 1-2km per night over home ranges between 10-20 hectares in size. In suburban areas, this means they range over entire housing estates and neighbourhoods. Our gardens provide a space for wildlife larger than all our National Nature Reserves, so by gardening in a wildlife-friendly way, we can help our spiny companions to find a home and move safely between habitats to find mates and food. Get together with your neighbours to cut a 13cm2 (5in2) hole in your fence or dig a channel beneath garden boundaries to connect your gardens. Keep an eye out for neighbours doing work on their gardens, or using fencing contractors - this is the perfect opportunity to get a hedgehog hole put in and influence connectivity.

Log and leaf piles, wilderness areas and purpose-built hedgehog homes make great places for hedgehogs to nest and hibernate. Fallen leaves also make the perfect nesting material, so make sure you don't clear all of these away! Try to pile these in quiet, undisturbed corners of your garden to allow hedgehogs a safe, secure area to breed and hibernate. Hedgehogs have poor eyesight but are quite curious, meaning they fall into holes and get stuck, so make sure you cover up any open drains and gullies. If you have a pond, make sure you provide an access point so that hedgehogs can climb back out - this can be achieved by using a ramp or placing some stones at one end. Attract plenty of natural hedgehog food by keeping your garden diverse with a wide variety of habitats. Mulch beds with garden compost will encourage plenty of earthworms, woodlice and beetles as it begins to rot down while wood piles encourage a rich feast of earwigs, centipedes and woodlice! Don't be afraid to let your grass grow a little wild and leave some leaf litter - as both are important homes for the hedgehog's prey including ground beetles and leatherjackets! Every year numbers of hedgehogs die or suffer injuries due to bonfire piles not being checked before being lit. To help prevent hedgehogs and other wildlife from suffering, it is advised by The British Hedgehog Preservation Society to avoid building your bonfire until the day it is going to be lit - this will reduce the chances of hedgehogs taking up residence in the bonfire pile for hiberation. Always make sure you build your bonfire on clear ground (not on top of leaf litter) and don't forget to check your bonfire before lighting too. Mike Biddulph






## Recipe of the Month The Bildeston Crown's pastry chef Nick Henn's recipe for Summer Fruit Pavlova

#### Ingredients

Serves 6

- · 200g egg white
- · 200g caster sugar
- · 200g icing sugar
- 300 g double cream
- · 100g icing sugar
- 1/2 tea spoon vanilla extract

- 1 punnet raspberries
- 1 punnet strawberries
- 1 punnet blackberries
- 100g caster sugar



#### Method

- Pre heat the oven to 120 c and prepare a baking tray by lining it with greaseproof paper.
- Whip the egg whites and the caster sugar to a nice firm meringue texture and gently fold in the icing sugar with a metal spoon.
- Spread the meringue niece and evenly into a circle on the baking tray and bake in the oven for 90 minutes.
- Leave to cool at room temperature for 5 6 hours.

- When cool whip the cream with the vanilla extract and the sugar until medium peaks form. Spread evenly over the meringue base and set aside.
- Wash all the berries and cut into desired shapes.
- Coat gently in the caster sugar and they are nicely glazed.
- Scatter over the meringue base and dust with icing sugar.
- Serve and enjoy with some sunshine and Pimms!







#### C08/16/17 CALENDAR OF MEETINGS

It was AGREED: That the calendar of meetings for 2016/17 be approved subject to the meeting in August being held on the first Monday of the month (all other meetings to be held on the second Monday of the month) and an extraordinary meeting be convened as necessary with regard to progressing the Parish Council's application for judicial review (Minute 19/1617 refers).

#### C09/16/17 POLICE REPORT

The Clerk reported that PCSO Mansell of Suffolk Police had been appointed as Parish Liaison Officer for the area and was seeking a meeting with the Parish Council.

It was noted that as the Police would no longer be providing a representative at Parish Council meetings, the standing item on the agenda of "Police Report" was no longer appropriate. A specific item could be included whenever, the Police attended a meeting.

It was AGREED: That Councillors Bullen and Hubbard meet PCSO Mansell on behalf of the Parish Council.

#### C10/16/17 DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

There was no report on this occasion.

#### C11/16/17 COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

County Councillor Mrs Antill had submitted a written report on the following matters:

- Political Control of County Council: As a result of a recent by-election in Haverhill which had been won by UKIP, the Conservative Group no longer had overall control of the County Council.
- Household Waste Recycling Centres: All sites would be closed on Wednesdays from Wednesday, 1st June, 2016 with longer opening hours on Sundays, Bank Holidays and on Thursday evenings during the summer months.
- Community Transport: The newly re-organised community transport services would be launched on 13th June, 2016. There would be an opportunity to meet the new service provider at Hadleigh Town Hall on Friday, 27th May, 2016 between 10.30am and 11.30am.

#### C12/16/17 VILLAGE AMENITIES AND OPEN SPACES

Councillors Hubbard and Taylor had undertaken a site visit to Grove Cemetery and had identified an area for planting memorial trees with a marked copy of a plan of the cemetery with the planting area being submitted to the meeting. Councillor Hubbard had liaised with Notcutts and Crown Nurseries and a list of six trees which grew no more than 10 metres in height had been produced including holly, hawthorn, crab apple, cherry, acer maple and mountain ash. The current charge made for a licence to plant a tree in the cemetery was £100 with additional costs arising from providing a tree and planting it. The consensus of the meeting was that the arrangements for planting memorial trees should be made by the Parish Council when requests were received from members of the public. This would ensure that approved specimens (or appropriate alternatives), were planted properly to give them the best possible chance of survival.

#### It was AGREED:

- a. That the Clerk and Councillor Hubbard prepare guidelines on the provision of memorial trees in the village;
- b. That memorial trees be planted in the Autumn each year:
- c. That the maximum size of a memorial plague shall be 20cm x 15 cm; and
- d. That the Clerk places a copy of the site plan for the planting area at the Cemetery on the Parish Council's intranet.

Councillor Hubbard had moulded the topsoil up the sides of the skate park. The Grounds Maintenance Operative had indicated that two replacement bins were required at the skate park as the fixings were broken and beyond repair.

It was AGREED: That the Clerk replenishes the Parish Council's stock of bins so that two new bins can be provided at the Skate Park.

Councillor Lester referred to the article in "The Bugle" publicising a picnic at Kings Pightle at

the end of June. The trustees were due to hold an extraordinary meeting once advice had been received from the Parish Council's legal advisers concerning the appointment of additional trustees to the Kings Pightle Management Committee as part of the arrangements for administering the bequest from Henry Morphew.

Councillor Taylor referred to a fundraising event at the Sportsfield on 18th June, 2016 to mark the impending summer solstice with live music, dancing, refreshments, family camping etc.

It was noted that the clock in the Market Place was not showing the correct time. The Clerk was asked to pursue this matter with the clock winder.

#### C13/16/17 CLERK'S REPORT

There were no new issues for consideration by the Parish Council.

#### C14/16/17 GENERAL POWER OF COMPETENCE

The Clerk reported that the Parish Council fulfilled the criteria for adopting the general power of competence in terms of the clerk's qualifications and training and the electoral mandate of the Parish Council with two-thirds of councillors having stood for election at the last Parish Council elections, being returned, uncontested.

Parish Councils relied upon various legal powers to perform their functions. The power of competence provided a single source of wide-ranging powers which entitled a Parish Council to do anything that individual generally could do. This avoided the necessity for a Parish Council to cite each legal power it was relying on in respect of any income generated or expenditure incurred including Section 137 expenditure where no other power was available.

Members of the Parish Council supported the proposal as a positive step in administering the Parish Council's affairs and safeguarding its legal position.

It was AGREED: That with effect from 9th May 2016, Bildeston Parish Council resolves until the next "relevant" Annual Parish Council meeting, that having met the conditions of eligibility as defined in the Localism Act 2011 and Statutory Instrument 965 of the Parish Councils (General Power of Competence) (Prescribed Conditions) Order 2012, to adopt the General Power of Competence.

### C17/16/17 PUBLIC SESSION

There were no issues.

#### C18/16/17 MATTERS TO BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE COUNCIL

Councillor Dempsey referred to the increasing problem of dog fouling in the village and noted that the bin half way along Smock Meadow did not appear to have been emptied in recent weeks. The Clerk undertook to report this to the District Council.

Councillor Hubbard reported that the obstruction to the footpath down Mill Lane had been cleared by a local resident. He suggested that the war memorial should be professionally cleaned and Councillor Guttridge proposed that this could be done ahead of the commemoration of the ending of the First World War.

Councillor Taylor had been asked to highlight a problem as children had been observed on various occasions skateboarding and scootering down Wattisham Road from the skate park. It was believed that there had been one "near miss" with a passing motor vehicle and that parents

should be alerted through "The Bugle" and the Clerk was asked to prepare an article.

Councillor Taylor reported that work had been completed in replacing the streetlight on Rotheram Road with an LED light.

#### C19/16/17 CONFIDENTIAL BUSINESS

It was AGREED: That the public be excluded from the remainder of the meeting in accordance with the Public Bodies (Admissions to Meetings) Act 1960.

### a. HENRY MORPHEW'S BEQUEST

The Chairman had presented a cheque for £20,000 to the Friends of Bildeston Surgery on Thursday, 5th May, 2016 from the proceeds of Henry Morphew's estate. Councillor Dempsey was optimistic that the proceeds for the Sportsfield would be released shortly.

#### b. COUNSEL'S OPINION

In respect of planning application B/15/01433/OUT/GP – Erection of 48 dwellings on Land to the east of Artiss Close and Rotheram Road, the Chairman of the Parish Council, Councillor Guttridge, reported that a letter before action had been served on the Planning Authority in accordance with the pre-action protocol for judicial review. Babergh District Council had responded that it would resist any application to apply for judicial review and seek to recover its costs in doing so. Freeths, solicitors, acting on behalf of the applicant, had also responded in their capacity as an interested party with similar comments although the Parish Council understood that the opportunities for interested parties to recover any costs were limited.

The matter had been progressed so far, by the Chair and Clerk in accordance with the previous decisions of the Parish Council (Minute Nos. 181/15/16 and 205/15/16 refer). The witness statement was due to be completed the day after the Parish Council meeting with the Chairman continuing to represent the Parish Council's interests and signing any relevant documentation on behalf of the Parish Council. The Clerk, in his capacity of Responsible Financial Officer, would continue to have oversight of all proposed costs and the Chair appraised Members of the Parish Council of the cost risks at this stage.

Legal advice had been sought by the Parish Council on the potential costs of pursuing a judicial review. It was recommended that the Parish Council should seek a cost protection order to manage its financial exposure in pursuing the action. However, if such an order was not be granted, the potential costs could be beyond the Parish Council's available financial resources.

## It was AGREED:

- a. That the Parish Council would discontinue proceedings if an order for cost protection is not awarded at, or before, the permission stage; and
- b. That the Chairman of the Parish Council be authorised to conduct and advance the proceedings on the Parish Council's behalf.

It was further AGREED: That all costs incurred in pursuing a judicial review be monitored by the Clerk so that they are contained within approved expenditure which is currently identified at Minute Nos. 181/15/16 and 205/15/16.

The meeting closed at 9.15pm.
