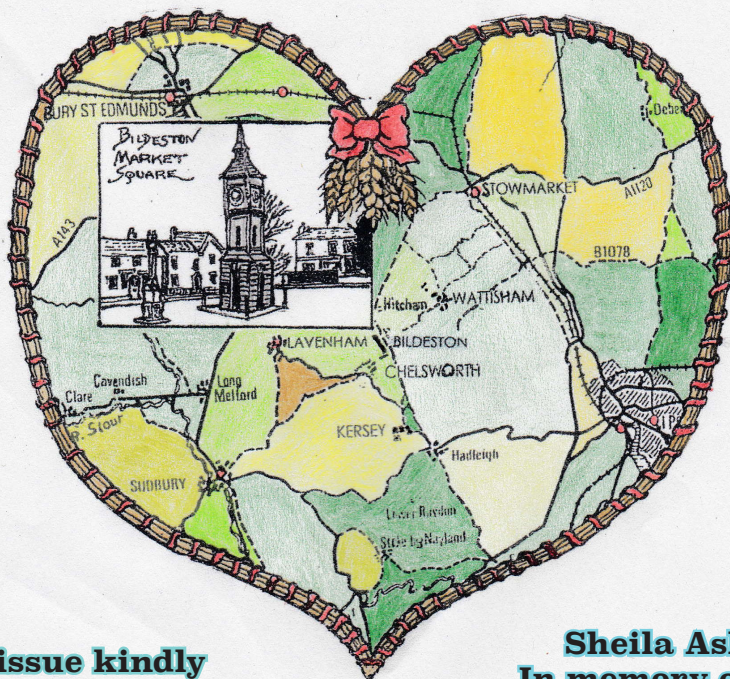

ED'S COMMENT

Chamberlin Hall Management Committee (CHMC) held its AGM recently. Thirteen people attended of which nine had close links to the management of the hall. It highlighted a problem CHMC raised as its most worrying issue. The lack, they say, of support for the hall. The Bugle has raised and received concerns about Chamberlin Hall, but those concerns have been rooted in a deep desire for our village hall to be successful; socially, culturally and economically. It would be inconceivable for Bildeston not to have its own village hall. Yet at the AGM the CHMC raised the danger of the hall's demise and possible ultimate closure. "Use it or lose it," it was said. They cited two main reasons. First the lack of support for events put on, or in some cases, planned to be put on and the second was the concern over where the next generation of village residents willing to help run the hall and join the committee will come from. CHMC are seeking committee members and a new secretary. Both issues continue to need consideration. Firstly, what activities and events could be organised which would help bring in more revenue on a regular basis and would help make the hall our first choice of venue? Why isn't it the first choice now? We need to be honest with the committee and help them to understand better what we would like from our village hall and what they could do differently. It can't be the quality of the building, the facilities, the parking, the potential for space and catering. So, is it the cost of hire? Is it the size of the hall? Is it a lack of information about what can be used, when and how? Exactly what is it? CHMC need to be told. The second issue is one shared by some other committees organising activities Bildeston residents enjoy. The age profile of those willing to get involved in supporting aspects of the village is creeping up and up! Given the sheer complexity and busy schedules of modern family life perhaps it should not be surprising that those who are retired may have more time to join committees. But it means those committees do not fully represent a wider age profile and all sections of the village. The committees worry, just like the CHMC, about what will happen when long standing members finally leave. In a Bugle article a while ago these same questions were raised and some suggestions offered. The village hall needs our support before it is too late.

Meanwhile, please read the item from Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils on page 33 announcing their organisation of a series of public forums inviting all local residents to discuss their plans for future housing needs and developments. Bildeston's event is planned for 6th July. This is the opportunity for people to voice concerns, find out what the strategic plans from the council actually look like across the piece and clarify what basis are such decisions being taken regarding scale in the context of neighbourhood plans and the Parish Council's decision to progress a Judicial Review.

COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER



I have a variety of local walks I like to do with the dogs, and not having been on a number recently, my last foray was virtually blocked by the sheer growth along the bridleway. A broad bean field that was five inches tall two months ago was now towering over six foot in places, the growth with all the rain and humidity has been phenomenal. Will the rain ever stop I hear people saying, forget flaming June more like a flaming washout.

On a recent walk I came across the remains of several Pheasant nests that had been raided by rodents, the smashed egg shells

were scattered all around. A hen Pheasant will lay as many as three clutches of eggs, and even if she is successful in hatching a brood, the young chicks are vulnerable to attack by predators including Stoat, Weasel and Mink. Amongst the shattered shells I found one unbroken egg that I carefully carried home in a cupped hand to keep it warm. With a broody hen sitting on half a dozen eggs it will be interesting to see if this egg hatches, I will let you all know the outcome.

Lately I have noticed a considerable increase in the amount of Buzzards in our area. Now the commonest and most widespread UK bird of prey, it is quite large with broad, rounded wings, and a short neck and tail. When gliding and soaring it will often hold its wings in a shallow 'V' and the tail is fanned. Birds are variable in colour from all dark brown to much paler variations, all have dark wingtips and a finely barred tail. Their plaintive mewing call could be mistaken for a cat. The greatest numbers are in Scotland, Wales, the Lake District and SW England, but are now breeding in every county of the UK. Found in most habitats particularly woodland, moorland, scrub, pasture, arable, marsh bog and villages. They may even be seen in towns and cities including Glasgow. Look for our local birds soaring over wooded hillsides in fine weather, or perched on fence posts and pylons.

It's currently breeding time for common buzzards. Males can be seen performing aerial displays as they try to impress females and warn off rivals. They rise and drop rapidly, in a manoeuvre known as the "roller coaster", and complete loop-the-loops. The shows they put on are really quite spectacular and the degree of danger in their aerobatics depends on how easy or difficult the female is to impress. Some of them get really near the ground when they're doing the roller coaster. Once they find mates, they stay together for life.

In the early 1900s, Buzzards were killed off by gamekeepers, frightened they would destroy their pheasants and grouse, there were as few as 1,000 breeding pairs in the UK. Nowadays there are up to 68,000. Common buzzards

Its main prey is small mammals, including voles, mice, rats, moles, rabbits and hares, but it can live on worms and insects when these are scarce. Buzzards also search for carrion (dead meat), such as road kill, the reason drivers see them hovering over roads and motorways. They've been known to take bones from rubbish tips, allowing them to live in or on the outskirts of cities. But, unlike seagulls, who can eat chips, bread and discarded pasties, buzzards need to consume flesh, so are unlikely to be found rummaging in dustbins. **Mike Biddulph**

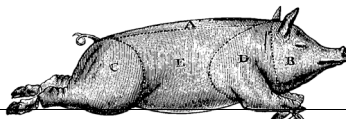

Balsam Bashing Morning

Do you fancy a bit of gardening with a difference?

The “Kings Pightle” committee are holding a Balsam bashing morning on the 1st of June, where we hope to continue with our aim to rid the reserve of this noxious weed.

We would love to have your company to help us and to have a wander around the reserve.

Please come and join us any time during the morning. Gloves, scythes and shears advised.



The Himalayan balsam (impatiens glandulifera) may look like a harmless and pretty addition to our gardens with the pretty pink trumpet shaped flows. But watch out – it’s a rapidly growing, aggressive invader, creeping in to our hedgerows, river banks and gardens and, unless kept under control, will expand triffid-like across the landscape.

Coiled Spring

They multiply by dispersing their seeds across the surrounding area. You just have to touch the top of the plant when the seed pods are ripe and with the power of a coiled spring, they’ll ‘explode’ firing seeds at high speed out of their cases.

Did you know?

Did you know there was a nature reserve in Bildeston?

The Kings Pightle nature reserve can be reached on foot through the access at the far corner of the village sports field.

There’s an information board that tells you about a huge variety of flora and fauna that can be found there.

The late John Artiss was the driving force behind obtaining a Nature Reserve for Bildeston. John promoted and sold the idea to Bildeston Parish Council, working tirelessly to find a suitable site and negotiate purchase. After many years of effort, the nature reserve was officially opened in September 2010.

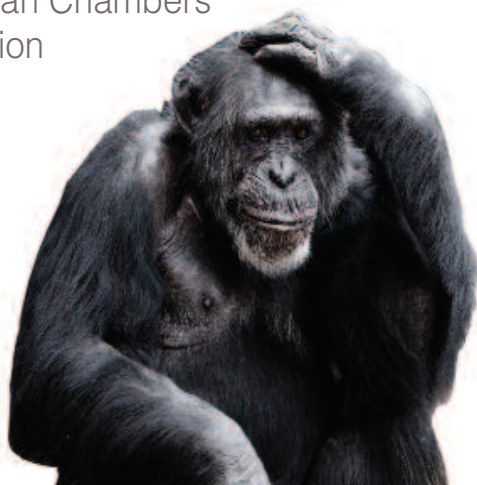

Recipe of the Month

To go with the Jazz and Curry event at St Mary Magdalene Church a recipe for your own

Chicken Jalfrezi

our thanks to Alison Sims

Ingredients

makes 8

- 75g vegetable oil
 - 1 onion finely chopped
 - 2 cloves garlic peeled, sliced
 - 1 tsp chillimpowder
 - 3 tsp ground turmeric
 - pinch of salt
 - 750g chicken breast, cut into large chunks
 - 500g chopped tomatoes
 - 2 tsp ground ginger
 - 3 tsp ground cumin
 - 3 tsp ground coriander
 - 2 tbsps melted butter
 - 1 lemon - juice only
-

Method

- Heat the oil in a pan and fry the onion and garlic over a low to medium heat for 4 - 5 minutes, or until softened
- Mix the chilli powder, turmeric and salt together in a bowl until well combined, then add the chicken pieces and mix well to coat. Add the coated chicken to the pan and fry for 10 -15 minutes, or until golden brown and cooked through.
- Stir the tomatoes, ginger, cumin and coriander into the pan, then reduce the heat until the mixture is just simmering. Cover the pan with a lid and cook for 20 -30 minutes, stirring occasionally and adding a tablespoon of water every so often if the mixture appears too dry.
- Stir in the butter and add the lemon juice to taste.
- To serve, spoon the chicken jalfrezi on to serving plates. Serve with rice, naan and lime wedges on the side, then garnish with the chopped coriander and sliced red chillies.

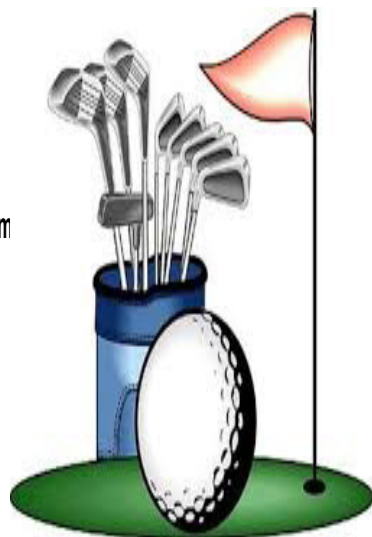

C24/16/17 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence had been received from Councillor P Bullen and County Councillor Mrs J Antill.

C25/16/17 DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY AND NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

Councillor Lester declared a non-pecuniary interest by reason of being a member of the Sportsfield Management Committee, Kings' Pightle Management Committee and the Parish Council's representative on the Parochial Church Council. Councillors Drury and Taylor declared non-pecuniary interests by reason of being a member of the Sportsfield Management Committee. Councillor Guttridge declared a non-pecuniary interest as the Parish Council's representative on the Chamberlin Hall Management Committee.

C26/16/17 DISPENSATIONS IN RESPECT OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS

There were none.

C27/16/17 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

It was AGREED: That the minutes of the annual meeting held on 9th May, 2016 and extraordinary meeting held on 8th June, 2016 be signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

C28/16/17 DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

District Councillor M Creffield reported upon the following matters:

- a. Progress with devolution in East Anglia in creating a new combined authority with an elected Mayor for the region;
- b. The Joint Strategic Plan Refresh document which had been approved by Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils (a copy was supplied at the meeting); and
- c. New guidance issued by Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils on the Community Infrastructure Levy (which had been circulated prior to the meeting by the Clerk)

C29/16/17 COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

There was no report on this occasion.

C30/16/17 IMPROVEMENTS TO PARISH CHURCH

Councillor Lester reported that significant progress had been made with works to create a new kitchen and toilet facilities at the Parish Church. In the churchyard, a 29 metre drainage trench had been dug. The Bishop had agreed to attend the official opening and the first event would be "Jazz and Jalfrezi" on Saturday, 16th July, 2016 with tickets £10 each.

C31/16/17 TRAVELLING FRIAR

In view of demand for the Travelling Friar on the Market Place on Thursday evenings, a small extension to operating hours was considered.

It was AGREED: That the trading hours of the Travelling Friar be extended to 7.30pm on Thursday evenings.

C32/16/17 MARKET BOLLARDS

Councillor Taylor reported that the Parish Council had a number of steel cored aluminium bollards, some of which required adaptation before use. However, it was noted that traffic cones were used for parish events on the Market Place as they were easier to take out of storage and deploy on site.

It was AGREED: That the Chair makes enquiries into the relative costs of:

- a. adapting the base fittings of the current bollards should some be retained; and
- b. obtaining new bollards in the future should the Parish Council decide, at this point in time, that it needs to hold fewer, or no bollards.

C33/16/17 LITTERING ON NEWBERRY ROAD CAR PARK

The landlord of a property on Newberry Road had asked for an additional bin to be provided. next to the car park which was owned by Babergh District Council. Members considered the request but were not convinced that there was a pressing need for a bin, or indeed, that it would resolve any problem that existed. It was noted that should the person who made the request wish to take the matter further, they should be asked to contact Babergh District Council.

C34/16/17 COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

The Clerk reported that the speed gun had been returned following re-calibration and new signage had been purchased. Hitcham, Great Finborough and Bildeston all now had trained teams of volunteers to conduct Community Speedwatch monitoring. Buxhall Parish Council had also expressed an interest in participating in the initiative if the existing partners agreed. It was noted that collaborative working between neighbouring villages would be a positive step in allowing volunteers to conduct speed monitoring in their own and other villages.

C35/16/17 UNOFFICIAL CAMPSITE

A report had been received of unofficial camping at the Coronation Playground at some point during the Spring Bank Holiday week. A tent had been abandoned and some cleaning up was required which the Parish Council's Grounds Maintenance Operative would be asked to undertake.

C36/16/17 VILLAGE AMENITIES AND EVENTS

Members of the Parish Council discussed the annual accounts of the Chamberlin Hall Management Committee for 2015/16, noting the regular outgoings and income from operating activities and fund raising events which amounted to a loss of £1262 over the trading year up to 31st March, 2016.

Councillor Hubbard agreed to deal with requests for Memorial Trees in the village following the development of guidelines by the Clerk and Councillor Hubbard since the previous meeting. Councillor Hubbard also referred to the continuing efforts of a local volunteer in conducting litter picks at the Coronation Playground.

C37/16/17 CLERK'S REPORT

The Clerk referred to the forthcoming Farm Tour which would be conducted by James Buckle on Friday, 1st July, 2016 starting with a pick up in the village at 6.00pm. One trailer had been booked for Bildeston residents and Councillor Hubbard was compiling a list of attendees.

C42/16/17 MATTERS TO BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE COUNCIL

Councillor Dempsey referred to the deteriorating condition of the road surface along the High Street and it was agreed that this matter should be raised at the next meeting when County Councillor Mrs Antill was present. Councillor Dempsey would also seek to publish a further article in The Bugle about dog fouling once he had obtained some further information from Babergh District Council.

C20/16/17 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence had been received from Councillors P Bullen and D Dempsey.

C21/16/17 DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY AND NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

There were none.

C22/16/17 DISPENSATIONS IN RESPECT OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS

There were none.

C23/16/17 CONFIDENTIAL BUSINESS

It was AGREED: That the public be excluded from the remainder of the meeting in accordance with the Public Bodies (Admissions to Meetings) Act 1960.

The Chair provided a comprehensive report on progress made to date and advice received from Counsel in pursuing the application for judicial review of the Planning Authority's decision to approve planning application B/15/01433/OUT/GP – Erection of 48 dwellings on Land to the east of Artiss Close and Rotheram Road.

Members of the Parish Council considered in detail, the costs incurred so far and risks associated with each stage of the process moving forward.

Reference was made to the results of the Parish survey that had been undertaken for the preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan. They identified that the local community wished to see incremental development of the village over a number of years rather than large, single developments in the countryside as was proposed through planning application B/15/01433/OUT/GP. Members of the Parish Council also discussed the potential implications of planning permission in creating a precedent for further large scale development in the countryside beyond the edge of the existing village boundary in the future.

Given Counsel's initial opinion on the merits of the Parish Council's case, it was considered likely that the application for judicial review would be given permission to proceed to court, although this was not certain.

Members of the Parish Council wished to manage the financial risks of pursuing the judicial review and had taken a decision at the previous meeting to discontinue proceedings if a cost protection order was not awarded at the permissions stage (Minute C19/16/17 refers). However, Counsel considered it was likely that a cost protection order would be approved based on the information available to him, and it was noted that such protection had recently been granted to another parish council which was pursuing a judicial review of a planning decision taken by Babergh District Council. If the case proceeded to the High Court it was considered possible, that some additional funding might be available through fund raising or other contributions towards the Parish Council's costs.

It was AGREED:

- a. That all the actions taken so far by the Chair and Clerk be ratified by the Parish Council;
- b. That the Judge's decision on the application at the permissions stage be circulated to Parish Councillors and an article updating local residents be provided in "The Bugle";
- c. That the Parish Council's solicitors be authorised to lodge the court fee to proceed to the next stage, without further instruction from the Parish Council, if permission is granted by the judge considering the application and provided that the Parish Council has been granted a cost cap limiting the costs which can be awarded against it to £10,000 or less; and
- d. That payments to Counsel and the Parish Council's solicitors be made as follows:

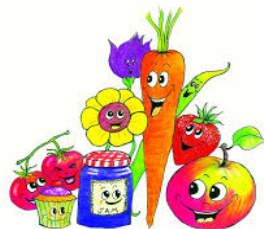
It was noted that, after drafting the letter before claim, all further work by Counsel would be instructed by, and paid via Gotelee solicitors on behalf of the Parish Council.

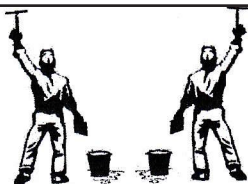
