ED'S COMMENT

Many villagers, past and present attended the special and very splendid service at St. Mary Magdalene Church on Saturday 23rd July. To coincide with the Patronal Service in honour of St. Mary Magdalene, Reverend Liz Law organised for the dedication of the new kitchen and toilet facilities which were only just finished by a superb band of builders and volunteers working right up to the night be-

fore. They were determined to complete the task set in motion by Reverend Liz almost from the moment she arrived to try and resolve an issue that had affected the church for so long.

The difference with Reverend Liz, as one of the speakers eloquently pointed out, is that she made it happen. The change of ownership of the surrounding land and buildings opened an opportunity which she grasped with both hands and brought to completion an issue that had seemed impenetrable for so long. It reminds me of an inspirational piece found on the internet about how the world's most powerful leaders get things done. James Webb, a former US Navy Seal and White House staff member has distilled his experience down to four simple aspects.

- 1. **Be responsive**. Get back to people who leave messages by email, phone, text or letter. Sort through them and respond to those that cry out for an immediate response. If you leave it, the moment might have gone.
- 2. **Don't over analyse, make a decision**. Sometimes if you think too deeply, you can think of all the reasons for not doing something above why you should, and end up not making a decision at all.
- 3. **Always learn**. Learning is lifelong, it never stops, no-one knows everything nor cannot hope to, but keep an open mind and be prepared to learn new things. As Muhammed Ali once said, "A person who believes the same thing when they're 50 that they belived when they were 20, has wasted 30 years!"
- 4. **Have passion**. Believe in, and care for, what you feel strongly about, because if you don't why should you expect others to? Your passion will enthuse and inspire others and help get the job done.

These are lessons anyone can put into practice, not just the world's successful leaders! Reverend Liz quietly and naturally seemed to adopt those four rules to such success playing a significant part in providing the village with a lasting gift of facilities in the church which will enhance it for generations to come. Well done to all the Church supporters and people who helped to make it happen. Rev'd Liz is also a member of the Bildeston choir pictured on page 5 but modestly stepped aside!

COUNTRYSIDE OBSERUER



This month we are looking at another of our regular Raptor sightings, the Kestrel which can be seen quite often around the lanes and fields of Bildeston. Kestrels can hover in still air, even indoors in barns. Because they face towards any slight wind when hovering, the Kestrel is called a "windhover" in some areas. Unusually for falcons, plumage often differs between male and female, although as is usual with monogamous raptors the female is slightly larger than the male. This allows a pair to fill different feeding niches over their home range. Kestrels are bold and have adapted well to human encroachment, nesting in

buildings and hunting by major roads. Kestrels do not build their own nests, but use nests built by other species. Kestrels are the most common bird of prey in Europe, although their numbers have declined in Britain over the last few years. Their habit of hovering, particularly near motorways, means they are also one of the easiest to spot and sadly often killed when flying into fast traffic after a vole or mouse catch. Whilst hovering they have the extraordinary ability to keep their head totally still, even in strong winds. This allows them to pinpoint and catch small mammals by sight alone. If prey is abundant, kestrels sometimes kill more than they need and cache what they don't eat

Just returned from Normandy where we rented a large country farm house set in eight acres of land complete with ornamental lake. Sitting outside one evening my attention was drawn to a moving object at the lake which turned out to be a Coypu. The Coypu is a large semi aquatic rodent originally native to South America but introduced to Europe in the last century because of the fur trade. Some escaped and others were released into the wild when the fur trade declined. It is widely distributed across France and is present in many lakes and waterways feeding on aquatic vegetation, roots, stems, water lilies and lake side plants. Unfortunately for the Coypu it is responsible for much damage to river banks, vegetation and consequently native species, and in most countries including France it is considered a pest, with many local authorities taking steps to eradicate it.

For years, they were the enemy here in East Anglia, foreign invaders that caused havoc on the Broads and weakened Norfolk's flood defences. The last coypu was seen in the county in 1989 - thanks to a long and expensive campaign that included financial rewards for anyone handing over a carcass. Now, 25 years on the successful war against the rampant rodents has caught the eye of the South Koreans. Experts from there recently joined their Norfolk counterparts on the Broads to pick up tips about how to deal with the beaver-like creatures, which are causing similar problems on the other side of the globe. They were taken to the Broads to meet the experts and some of the trappers who caught the coypus during the campaign. It was expensive to eradicate the species, but it was possible, with a systematic, concerted effort. The Coypu became a threat across the south of England in 1945, with hundreds making themselves at home along 4 miles of Norfolk's rivers. Their prolific breeding and the lack of natural predators ensured that their numbers grew quickly. Today there are none. **Mike Biddulph**

Recipe of the Month Summer Lamb with Gnocchi

with thanks to Chris Lee Head Chef at The Bildeston Crown

Ingredients

- 2 rumps of lamb 6 oz each
- Lamb gravy
- 200g fresh peas podded
- 200g fresh broad beans podded
- 100g baby onions peeled and blanched
- 10 mint leaves
- Cream

- lemon
- 8 spears of asparagus peeled and blanched
- For the Gnocchi
- 300g mash potato
- 2 eggs
- 100g of flour



Method

- For the Gnocchi:
- Bake the potatoes in their skin for 45 mins at 200 degrees C. cut in half remove the flesh from the skin, put through potato ricer, add eggs, flour and seasoning until forms soft dough. Roll into 1 cm long piece and then cut into 1.5 cm dice. Blanch in salted boiling water until they float to the surface – remove and put into ice water to refresh – drain and dry.
- Roast lamb skin side down until crisp
- Bake in the oven for 12 minutes and then rest.
- Using the same pan sauté the gnocchi until golden – add the halved baby onions and cook until golden. Add lamb gravy, add cream. Finish with peas, broad beans, mint and lemon.
- Slice the lamb and place over the pea mixture and then lay the asparagus on top.





The "Keep Bildeston Beautiful" brigade are holding various fund raising events and this is an excellent way in which to generate community spirit; it should drag people away from their televisions and laptops and neighbours can actually talk to one another. The required £5,000 has now increased to £15,000 but it is ever thus when dealing with the legal profession and this money is required to fund a High Court Judicial Review to prevent unnecessary housing from blighting the open fields adjacent to our village. I suspect the costs will spiral out of control – but it is worth a shot.

Whilst totally understanding the point of this (my sister lives in a rural Norfolk village where 240 houses are to be built on good, productive agricultural land; building on this scale will leave doctors' surgery, schools and the local infrastructure unable to cope) the scheme for 48 houses near Bildeston is something which should be carefully considered.

Certainly, any incursions into the countryside need to be weighed up; we do not want to sit back and watch fields and woods disappear all around us. On the other hand, we should, maybe, give consideration to the future of Bildeston; I have felt for a long time that we badly need an injection of fresh life into the village in order to prevent total decline; it would be a great shame were we to become a dormitory village for nearby towns.

The closure of so many businesses in Bildeston is something which should worry us. Many of the surrounding villages have lost all commerce and, along with it, all sense of community. Not so here...yet. We have a Health Centre, a School, and a Village Hall; local activities such as the two Churches, the Tennis & Bowls Clubs, Football Club and Pub Darts Team are always appealing for new members: should we not consider that an expansion of the village is actually needed? Only 48 houses are planned at present and these might just give us the necessary argument to prevent the building of huge housing estates which might well be in the pipeline. I really do think Bildeston needs to expand just a little if we are to keep our community going but we do need to protect ourselves against further incursions: a few extra houses might help our local youngsters start up on their own here in the village which they cannot do at present. The other side of this argument is the fact that our towns and cities are heaving thanks to Tony Blair's Open Door Policy and the EU's Free Movement requirement. It is patently obvious that the UK will have to undertake a massive house building programme. Maybe, by agreeing to 48 houses, we can protect ourselves from much larger developments. With our population increasing by the millions we are going to have to expect rural England to be targeted on a massive scale; at the risk of being a NIMBY I have to say "Please, not here in Suffolk." Yes, we need small scale development to keep the community thriving, but the thought of all the fields and woods which were my stamping grounds as a young man disappearing under the bulldozers really is quite unthinkable.

The downside, of course, is that with 48 new houses there might well be an increase in dog fouling on our paths and pavements but, there, you cannot win them all, can you? Tim-o-thy



A letter from Rev'd Liz I seem to have spent an inordinate amount of time over the last few months, talking about toilets! I've even sung about them. It's not exactly what I trained to be a priest for and I'm not even sure why I am so pleased about having a church toilet either - except it makes my work and my life at church so much easier and more pleasant.

We also raised enough money at our 'toilet blessing' service and the service we ran at St Mary's Hadleigh the following week to build two new toilet blocks in schools in Africa or Nepal and to twin our own toilet with a household toilet there too. Thank you to you all for making that possible. We had great fun when the Bishop came to bless the toilet and it has been well used with two big village weddings and the jazz evening as well as all of the Sunday services. The next big service will be Harvest Festival and lunch, so do look out for the date and come along. We have had a note left at the church asking why the toilet is locked when there is no service. The main reason is toilet cleaning I guess - it's so that when we do need to use our new facilities they will be pleasant and clean and those who look after the church and do the cleaning don't have any unpleasant surprises to clear up. In the past when we had a camping toilet in the little room on the outside corner of the church it was abused so much that we had to abandon it. Now the **new outside toilet** on the north east corner is also finished and can be used. It will be unlocked so that ramblers and visitors can enjoy a 'comfort stop'. I hope we will be able to trust that it is not abused and keep it that way.

While we were still enjoying the novelty of our new facilities we were very sad to discover the vandalism to gravestones in the parish cemetery across the road from the church. It is very hard to understand why it was done, what kind of person would do something that hurt and upset bereaved folk so much? It makes saying 'forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us,' a thought provoking prayer!
