ED'S COMMENT



November, month of remembrance. I am very grateful to Stuart Law, the Bugle's Assistant Editor, for taking on the task of completing the October issue. This enabled us to get away and tour France. One of the many highlights was our stop at Sainte Mere Eglise, in Normandy, on our way to get the ferry home at Cherbourg. Throughout Normandy there are reminders of the intense fighting that took place following the 1944 D Day landings on the beaches of Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno and Sword. The village of Sainte Mere Eglise lies just inland from the beaches attacked by the US forces and was an important strategic objective for them. First, though, pathfinders were parachuted in, some in planes and some in gliders towed by planes. Sainte Mere Eglise became famous across the world after the film *The Longest Day* re-enacted the actual event of the paratrooper John Steele of the 505th Parachute Infantry Regiment, getting stuck on part of the church's steeple. John Steele was left hanging for two hours and watched helplessly as some of his unfortunate companions were shot beneath him. Taken prisoner by the Germans, Steele managed to escape and joined his Division when it entered the village at 4.30am. One of the permanent, and perhaps most famous, reminders is a model of the paratrooper still hanging from the church today. Inside the lovely church there are two wonderful stained glass windows. One shows the Virgin Mary surrounded by paratroopers; the other shows St. Michael (patron saint of paratroopers). Today, outside the Town Hall of Sainte Mère Église is a pink marker stone depicting "Kilometre Zero". These markers were put in place along the route taken by the Free French Army as they helped liberate their own country, from Normandy across the rest of France. Sainte Mère Église is a favourite venue throughout the year. Veterans and visitors crowd the town square. In June any Veterans of the D-Day Landings are celebrities. Bands play, the Square is filled with local people milling around with tourists from many countries, lots of beers and tears as the memories come flooding back for those that are left who participated.

Sainte Mere Eglise houses a most impressive and extremely poignant museum to the fateful events of the first few days of the D Day landings, but it's the paratrooper hanging from the church that captures everyone's attention. It remains hugely important to the French to remember the events of their liberation at the end of World War II. The veterans of that conflict are fast disappearing, but their families remain. When you get a poppy for this year's November Remembrance, if you have no personal connection to any conflict, you can always think of the paratrooper above, hanging around for ever!

COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER

September proved to be a great month for weather, the hottest on record, pleasing but also worrying. If we are to believe all we read about global warming we can expect more of the same. For gardeners this means a longer growing season, more demands on water etc, and a gathering influx of European species both insect and mammals to our shores. The Asian Hornet has arrived, fortunately so far as I am aware, not yet in Bildeston. They are a destructive insect killing honey bees not to eat but to allow free access to their hive once the colony has been slaughtered.



They carry out their task by sitting in numbers on the edge of a hive, biting off the heads of the hapless bees as they emerge or return from the hive. I am told the sting of a wasp is worse than that of a Hornet! We had a Hornets nest in close vicinity to our house last summer, periodically one would drone past returning to its home, but they never bothered us. The first week of September we took a week's break renting a chocolate box thatched cottage in Osmington, Dorset. Up the lane was the former rectory with a blue commemorative plate on the wall. Close inspection revealed that none other than "our" John Constable English romantic painter stayed there on his honeymoon in 1816. We toured Dorset in lovely sunshine, eating out at pleasant pubs and walking the dogs. It's a county of rolling downlands, studded with woodlands and fertile valleys, a landscape typical of Cranbourne Chase. At harvest time this largely arable region on the borders of Dorset, Wiltshire and Hampshire turns a deep gold as Wheat, Barley and other crops ripen under the late summer sun.

Cranbourne Chase is surprisingly little visited, yet offers delightful villages, crystal clear chalk streams, and some of the loveliest wild flower meadows to be found in southern England. One day we went to Torquay along the coast over the border into Devon. The Dorset/Devon coastline is in complete contrast to Suffolk's with major cliffs and small bays reached via narrow winding descending lanes with few passing places.

The Isle Of Wight was visible in the distance. With a magnificent landscape, a stunning coastline and a climate two or three degrees warmer than the mainland. As well as beaches perfect for surfing, cycle routes that take you on a taste tour of the island's best eateries, it has something for everyone.

I have always liked the word gather. It feels hopeful, natural and very human. It's a word that embodies many of the simple actions we perform every day. As people we gather every day in one form or another it's what we do. Whenever I have time my own gatherings take me out into the local countryside as I believe that sometimes to get the best ingredients, go straight to the source. When you're walking through autumn woodlands this month, keep an eye out for emerging fungi, it's peak mushroom season. Do however take great care should you be foraging to eat, make sure you are one hundred percent certain what you pick is edible, never ever take a chance.

The blackthorn or Sloe as we know it keeps a low profile for much of the year. Now it's reaching its peak and as other trees shed their leaves lovely round swollen black Sloes are there for the taking. Their berries are eagerly sought in autumn, most finding their way into bottle of gin with Sloe liquor offering us an inner warmth against the developing winter chill.

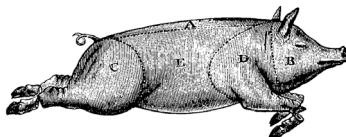

Having recently read an article concerning the increase in the number of gangs using the technique of door knocking, pretending to be ex criminals selling over priced cleaning products, it occurred to me how many times we have had this since moving to Bildeston.

In the short time we have lived here we have had at least six instances of men with a hold-all trying to sell cloths for £10 knocking on our door. Given the number of elderly residents in the village, and also the spate of 10 plus burglaries that occurred in Monks Eleigh in the summer, which some residents think was linked to door step sellers in the villages prior to the crimes. Unfortunately our Parish Council seems to be fixated with a Judicial Review to block a housing development that, by strange coincidence happens to be near the homes of a number of Parish Councillors and along with the self appointed "Guardians of Bildeston" seem to be intent on seeing houses built on land that floods, perhaps you could mention in the Bugle something to draw people's attention to what may be potential criminal activity that could affect any of us. We should all look out for each other.

As an aside, it is interesting that Keep Bildeston Beautiful has not mentioned anything about the attempts to build 45 houses on the Brook Farm Garage, and the greenfield meadow behind, which was put to the Parish Council a year ago. Nor have they made any comment on Babergh Council's Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment that has identified 3 other potential housing sites in the village, next to the allotments, the field next to Brookfield and the next field along the Ipsich Road. A cincial person would think that there could be an agenda at work here...

Recipe of the Month

Spanish Paella

with thanks to Chris Lee Head Chef at The Bildeston Crown

Ingredients

- 170g/6oz chorizo, cut into thin slices
- 110g/4oz pancetta, cut into small dice
- 2 cloves garlic - grated
- 1 large Spanish onion finely diced
- 1 red pepper, diced
- 1 tsp fresh thyme leaves
- ¼ tsp dried red chilli flakes
- 570ml/1pint Spanish short-grain) rice
- 1 tsp paprika
- 125ml/4fl oz dry white wine
- 1.2 litres/2 pints fresh chicken stock, heated with ¼ tsp saffron strands
- 8 boneless chicken thighs, each chopped in half and browned in olive oil
- 18 small fresh clams cleaned
- 110g/4oz fresh or frozen peas
- 4 large tomatoes, de-seeded and diced
- 50ml/2fl oz good olive oil
- 1 head garlic cloves separated and peeled
- 12 jumbo raw prawns in shells
- 450g/1lb squid - cleaned and chopped into bite-sized pieces (ask your fish monger to do this for you)
- 5 tbsp chopped flat leaf parsley
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- serves 4



Method

- Heat half the olive oil in a paella dish or heavy-based non-stick saucepan. Add the chorizo and pancetta and fry until crisp. Add the 2 cloves of grated garlic, onion and pepper and heat until softened. Add the thyme, chilli flakes and rice and stir until all the grains of rice are glossy. Add the paprika and dry white wine and when it is bubbling, pour in the hot chicken stock, add the chicken thighs and cook for 5-10 minutes.
- Place the clams into the dish and add the peas and chopped tomatoes - continue to cook gently for 10 minutes.
- Meanwhile, heat the remaining oil with the garlic cloves in a separate pan and add the prawns. Fry quickly for a minute or two then add them to the paella. Now do the same with the squid and add to the paella too.
- Garnish with chopped parsley over the paella and bring the pan to the table

The Chairman, Councillor A Guttridge opened the meeting and welcomed everyone present.

C87/16/17 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence had been received from Councillor Bullen and County Councillor Mrs Antill.

C88/16/17 DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY AND NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

The following declarations were made:

Kings Pightle Management Committee – Councillors Drury, Hubbard, Lester & Taylor;
Sportsfield Management Committee – Councillors Drury, Lester & Taylor;
Parish Council's representative on the Parochial Church Council – Councillor Lester; and
Parish Council's representative on the Chamberlin Hall Management Committee – Councillor Guttridge.

C89/16/17 DISPENSATIONS IN RESPECT OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS

There were none.

C90/16/17 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

It was AGREED: That the minutes of the meetings held on 12th September, 2016 and 3rd October, 2016 be signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

C91/16/17 DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

District Councillor Creffield reported upon the following matters:

- a. There had been no further progress with regard to devolution for East Anglia and a decision did not appear likely in the short term;
- b. Babergh District Council had confirmed that it would be moving its offices to Endeavour house at Ipswich along with Mid Suffolk District Council; and
- c. An exhibition was being displayed at Sudbury Town Hall from 3rd to 25th October, 2016 on proposals for a new bus station at Sudbury.

C92/16/17 APPLICATION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW ON PLANNING DECISION (B/15/01433)

The Chairman, Councillor Guttridge, reported on the Parish Council's application to the High Court for a judicial review of the planning decision in respect of Land East of Artiss Close and Rotheram Road, Bildeston (B/15/01433/OUT). The court hearing was due to take place on 26th and 27th October, 2016.

The planning authority, Babergh District Council, had written to the Parish Council inviting it to withdraw its application for judicial review with both sides meeting their respective costs. The proposal had been made following a further permission granted by the planning authority in respect of the same site (B16/00859 refers). The application had been made under Section 73 of the Town and Country Planning Act (1990) to vary condition 29 attached to planning permission B/15/1433 to replace parts of the boundary hedge to the front of the site in accordance with the details supplied by the applicant. Not only had Babergh District Council considered the variation but it had taken the opportunity to re-consider the whole proposal for development without notifying the Parish Council of its intention to do so. It was difficult to determine whether or not the new decision would materially affect the chances of a positive outcome in respect of the application for a judicial review. However, it was appropriate to consider the proposal made by Babergh District Council before any further steps were taken.

Mr Targett and Mr Beales spoke of the “mandate” given by Keep Bildeston Beautiful and the wider community to the Parish Council to continue with its legal action. Donations and community fundraising activities had helped to provide significant funds to help meet the costs faced by the Parish Council should the action be unsuccessful. The financial contributions reflected local and wider opposition to the type of greenfield development applied for in B/15/1433 as a “matter of principle”. They had not been given on the basis of any specific expectations about the likelihood of success of the legal challenge.

Councillor Guttridge thanked the representatives of Keep Bildeston Beautiful for the clarity of their views and indicated that the Parish Council would consider the legal advice it had received in the confidential part of the meeting (see Minute C100/16/17 below).

It was AGREED: That the representations made by Keep Bildeston Beautiful be taken into account in determining the Parish Council’s next steps with regard to the application for judicial review.

C93/16/17 VILLAGE AMENITIES AND EVENTS

Councillor Lester reported that ten trustees had been appointed to the Kings Pightle Management Committee. Changes to its constitutional arrangements would be considered at its next meeting on 19th October, 2016. This should then enable the proceeds from the Henry Morpew estate to be released for the benefit of the village.

Councillor Taylor reported that a quiz night would be held at the Sportsfield Pavilion on Saturday, 12th November, 2016.

Councillor Guttridge asked for details from the Church via Councillor Lester for Remembrance Sunday. The Clerk indicated that a wreath would be purchased from the Royal British Legion and a donation given by the Parish Council in accordance with the practice adopted in previous years.

Mr Adam Keeton addressed the Parish Council on his hopes and fears for the future of Chamberlin Hall. Mr Keeton spoke of his desire to see a range of new users being encouraged to use the building and cited in particular, the need for a youth club which he was happy to help run. Mr Keeton believed it was the role of the Parish Council to implement changes that would help improve community use of Chamberlin Hall.

Members of the Parish Council discussed the issues raised and responded in terms of the following:

- a. That the Chamberlin Hall Management Committee was set up as a separate charity and did not fall under the direct management and control of the Parish Council;
- b. That matters concerning the management and operation of Chamberlin Hall were best dealt with at the Annual General Meeting of the Management Committee;
- c. That the Parish Council very much wished to see Chamberlin Hall run successfully for the benefit of the local community; and
- d. That the Parish Council would be happy to work with all parties to promote Chamberlin Hall and would be prepared to offer start-up funding for new groups wishing to use the building.

Mr Keeton was invited to consider how a youth club might be formed and could operate from Chamberlin Hall as a user. Members of the Parish Council indicated their wish to work with such groups and the Chamberlin Hall Management Committee as part of a constructive dialogue, to help broaden the offer and appeal of Chamberlin Hall.

C94/16/17 CLERK'S REPORT

The Clerk read out the contents of a letter received from a local parishioner who was seeking a "No Through Road" sign or "10 mph" speed limit in Artiss Close to reduce the speed of motorcycles and motor vehicles particularly in view of the number of small children using the play area next to the road.

It was AGREED: That the matter be referred to the Highways Authority, Suffolk County Council.

C95/16/17 EXTERNAL AUDITOR'S REPORT

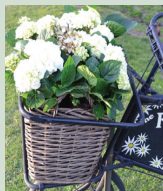
