

The wonderful Ladies Club provided refreshments with a choice of cakes so vast and delicious, people had to go back several times to make sure they had chosen the nicest one! The Red Fox largest of the fox species has the greatest geographic range of all members of the Carnivora order, being present from the arctic circle, to north Africa, north America and Eurasia. Its range has increased alongside human expansion, having been introduced into Australia where it is considered harmful to native mammals and bird populations and is included among the list of the world 100 most invasive species. A male fox is called a 'Dog', a female called a 'Vixen', a young fox is called either a 'Kit', 'Pup' or 'Cub'. A group of foxes is called a 'Skulk'. The red fox originated from

smaller-sized ancestors from Eurasia. Apart from its large size it

is distinguished from other fox species by its ability to adapt guickly to new environments. It often produces other colourings, including albinos and occasionally all black. Red Foxes are usually together in pairs or small groups consisting of families, such as a mated pair and their young, or a male with several females having kinship ties. The mating season is December to February when the female fox (vixen) can be heard at night uttering her eerie, high pitched scream. The Foxes primarily form monogamous pairs each winter, stay together to act as parents to the new born kits (cubs or pups) after a gestation period of between 51 and 53 days. Red foxes are mainly carnivores but are generally classed as omnivores, feeding mainly on small rodents such as field mice, voles and rabbits, however, they will also eat birds, insects, earthworms, grasshoppers, beetles, blackberries, plums and mollusks and crayfish, amphibians, small reptiles and fish, often eating carrion or preving on new-born lambs in the spring. Foxes are superb hunters, able to sprint, turn and jump with surprising ease. Surplus food is buried in shallow holes 5 -10 centimetres deep. This is thought to prevent the loss of their entire food supply in the event that another animal finds the store. The species has a long history of association with humans, having been extensively hunted as a pest and furbearer for many centuries, as well as being represented in human folklore and mythology. Too small to pose a threat to humans, though they have been known to enter open doors in surburbia, and recently there was a case of a young baby being bitten. The Fox has an elongated body and relatively short limbs. The tail, which is longer than half the body length (70 per cent of head and body length) is fluffy and reaches the ground when in a standing position. Foxes pupils are oval and vertically oriented but move only when the eyes are closed. The forepaws have five digits, while the hind feet have only four and lack dew claws. Foxes are very agile, being capable of jumping over 2m high fences, and they swim well. Vixens normally have four pairs of teats though vixens with seven, nine, or ten teats are not uncommon. Foxes are extremely cunning and once they know of a food source especially poultry they will complete a full circle where possible looking for any weak point in the hens run that will allow access. Hens not secured at night are in grave peril and a Fox once inside the hen house will go into a frenzy of blood lust, killing and decapitating every bird without exception, taking just the one for food.

Did you know the name "foxglove" is derived from a legend which claims evil fairies gave a fox the flower petals to put onto his toes so that he could sneak into the chicken house without being heard! **Mike Biddulph**





Recipe of the Month

Summer Chicken, Lobster & Summer Vegetables

with thanks to Chris Lee Head Chef at The Bildeston Crown

Ingredients

Serves four

- One free range or organic chicken
- · One medium lobster
- · One bulb fennel
- Bunch of asparagus (approx.16 spears)
- 8 baby leeks
- Jersey Royal Potatoes

- 500ml of good chicken stock
- 100ml double cream
- Lemon
- Fresh mint
- * Best to use vegetables in season. Peas, broad beans, green beans are all good alternatives to those suggested in the recipe.



Method

- Remove the legs from the chicken and slow cook in the chicken stock until cooked through and tender enough to easily remove the thigh bones. Leave to cool.
- Cook the lobster in boiling salted water but first put a knife through the head. For a medium lobster you will need to cook for 7-9 minutes. Take out of the water and leave to cool.
- When cool remove the meat, keeping the claw meat intact.
- Boil the Jersey Royals in salted water with plenty of fresh mint, until the potatoes are tender.
- Trim the leeks and asparagus to approximately the same size. Thinly slice the fennel. Boil or steam the vegetables until just tender.
- Portion the remaining chicken so that you have two chicken supremes (breast of chicken with the wing bone attached). Pan-fry the supremes until three-quarters cooked. Take out and leave to rest. When cooler cut supremes in to three so that with the legs you have eight pieces.
- Remove from pan and add a knob of butter over a medium heat.
- Put all the potatoes and the vegetables and toss in the butter until warmed through.
