

ED'S COMMENT

Here we are in October, and below are a few snatches from a poem by Robert Frost.

O hushed October morning mild,
Thy leaves have ripened to the fall;
Tomorrow's wind, if it be wild,
Should waste them all.
The crows above the forest call;
Tomorrow they may form and go.
O hushed October morning mild,
Begin the hours of this day slow.

He could have also been writing about last month with its wild wind. We saw the awful scenes around the Carribbean and into the Southern states of America, as Hurricane Irma wreaked its havoc and devastation across a swathe of some of the most idyllic islands in the world. In his poem about October, Robert Frost was describing the way in which aspects of nature combine to complete the cycle of degradation and renewal, with leaves being ready to fall and a gentle wind helping to complete the process.

But mentioning wild wind is also a reminder that 30 years ago this month on 16th October Britain experienced its own hurricane force winds, the Great Storm of 1987. For those of you who do remember, maybe even experienced it, 18 people lost their lives, 15 million trees were lost and it cost the British economy £1.5 Billion. At its peak, wind speeds of 120 miles per hour were recorded. People awoke that morning to our own scenes of terrible damage and devastation, homes without electricity, squashed cars, ruined buildings and impassable roads. October, then, can be unpredictable.

Dylan Thomas also described the 'wind blow cold' in his similar take on October.

A springful of larks in a rolling
Cloud and the roadside bushes brimming with whistling
Blackbirds and the sun of October
Summery
On the hill's shoulder,
Here were fond climates and sweet singers suddenly
Come in the morning where I wandered and listened
To the rain wringing
Wind blow cold
In the wood faraway under me.

"October Summery'! Hopefully we will enjoy a mild autumn and a bracing winter. Whatever, it is still something to cherish that we live in a part of the world which goes through the four seasons in a very distinct way. Not that I can pretend to be an expert on nature. I was taken to task by Anne, representing King's Pightle, on writing in last month's Bugle about Owls 'poo' being analysed at the Chamberlin Hall Open Day. "It isn't 'poo'," she explained gently, "because it is regurgitated, it comes out from the top, not the bottom!" Apologies for the mistake. Let's leave all things natural to our own Mike Biddulph and his interesting and much better informed Countryside Observer articles!

COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER

As I write summer has faded away as surely as the nights are lengthening. Autumn is

a beautiful time in the British countryside and one of the most appealing of seasons to capture on film. From early morning mists to dramatic tree colours, dew hanging heavy in the grass its all there to photograph. In today's world none of us need to be a David Bailey, even the most basic of cameras and camera phones are capable of taking stunning pictures. Early morning at first light or towards dusk are the two best times to shoot. Take yourself to a local field or bridleway early one morning just before sunrise. Ideally you need the sun behind you, be well

wrapped, have a flask and small camping stool. Find a sheltered spot and you'll be amazed at what you may see as wildlife appears close by. Here are five easy-to-follow tips for capturing great snaps of this "season of mists and mellow fruitfulness".

Magical mornings - Autumn is great for photographing misty landscapes and if you get out early, you can often find a shallow layer of mist sitting at ground level. This can look magical through a lens. Warmth - To boost the richness of the colours in an autumn landscape, set the white balance to "shade" or "cloudy". Alternately, use a polarising filter for a digital single-lens reflex (DSLR) camera.

Trees - In dull weather, head for woodland as you will find it offers countless possibilities. Rule of odds - A photograph will generally appear to have more balance and beauty with an odd number of image elements. So if you have an even number of trees in your photo, it's best to recompose slightly so there is an odd number instead.

Bring the autumn indoors - If it's grim outdoors, you don't even need to leave the house. Collect colourful, fallen leaves and create a natural still life at home. Use the macro setting or a macro lens to photograph close up. Experiment by holding a leaf up against a window to see the hidden detail.

As the leaves turn golden and yellow, it is a great time of the year to get out and enjoy a walk enjoying the autumn colours. One of the nicest local walks is Bradfield Woods. This is an extraordinary place to visit now managed by the Suffolk Wildlife Trust. The woods have been under continuous coppice management since 1252 and you can still buy your firewood and hazel products near the entrance. Some of the coppiced ash "stools" are thought to be over 1,000 years old. There are 370 plant species recorded there and you might spot stoats. Yellow Necked mice, Dormice and badgers too. Dormice have to be one of the most enchanting of our indigenous rodents but rarely seen. Dormice are small rodents, with body lengths between 6 and 19 cm. They are generally mouse like in appearance, but with furry rather than scaly tails. They are extremely agile, and well adapted to climbing. Dormice have an excellent sense of hearing and signal each other with a variety of vocalisations. Dormice need well managed woodlands connected by hedgerows so that they can spread. They thrived when hazel trees in woodlands were regularly cut back (coppiced) because this provided plenty of fruiting trees for food. Despite the revival of coppicing in some areas, many woodlands have changed too drastically to support dormice. The loss of two thirds of our nation's hedgerows, and the lack of suitable management of many that remain, makes matters worse. The dormice that do remain have limited living space and are increasingly isolated. Mike Biddulph





ONE OF THE RESIDENTS OF OUR LOVELY VILLAGE NEEDS SOME HELP

Kaz Hayes is a local gardener. Kaz was left homeless at the beginning of 2015 and spent two years sleeping where she could - some times a friend's sofa, or in a tent in a relative's garden. After two years, in Spring this year, she was finally offered a one bedroom flat on Newberry Road, Bildeston. For Kaz, life seemed to have taken a small turn for the better. This middle-aged very proud, stubborn and unassuming lady is self employed and relies on what small amount she earns during Spring through to Autumn to see her through the Winter months when work is scarce. She lives without carpets, a television and many other things we all take for granted.

At approx. 4pm on Friday 1st September, Kaz was riding her 175cc motorbike along Landseer Road, Ipswich. A car pulled out of a side road and broadsided her, (the driver stayed with her and had admitted full liability). Kaz was rushed to Ipswich Hospital. On arrival, the staff assessed her injuries and sent her straight to Addennbrookes. Kaz is lucky to be alive! She suffered a break and dislocation in her left arm (which now has a plate in it), a broken left leg (another plate), multiple breaks in the pelvis, a fracture in her lower spine and a laceration of one of her kidneys! I am in daily contact with her. She thinks she will be back to work in a couple of weeks! Addennbrookes are saying two months in hospital and probably another two months in a wheelchair. Kaz's daughter, Kerry and I are trying to raise money to put carpets, a television and a tall fridge-freezer into Kaz's flat before she comes home. Can you help? I am organising a Curry (food and quiz) night which will take place at The Bildeston Sportsfield Pavilion on the evening of Saturday 14th October. Paul (Purple People Eater) has kindly agreed to cater. There will be a curry related quiz and a raffle. ALL profits will go towards making Kaz's return home a little more comfortable. Recipe of the Month

Hot Chocolate Mousse with Black Cherry Sorbet

with thanks to Chris Lee Head Chef at The Bildeston Crown

Ingredients

Serves 8

For the mousse

- 130g 70% cocoa dark chocolate
- 20g egg yolk
- 40g boiling water
- 20g cocoa powder
- · 200g egg whites
- · 20g caster sugar

For the Sorbet

- 500g fresh cherry purée – made from fresh black cherries
- 1 cinnamon stick
- Pinch of cracked black pepper
- I vanilla pod scraped and de seeded
- 2 cardamon pods
- 10g sugar



Method

For the Mousse:

- Melt chocolate in a plastic bowl in the microwave
- Whisk the boiling water with the cocoa powder to make a paste
- Whisk egg yolks into the paste
- Whip your egg whites with the caster sugar until soft peaks form
- Add the egg yolk mixture onto the melted chocolate and whisk
- Add $\frac{1}{4}$ of the whisked egg whites in to the mix and whisk
- Then fold in the remainder of the egg whites
- Ladle evenly into ramekins and put into the fridge to set for 2 hours
- Preheat the oven to 170C place the ramekins on a heavy based tray

and bake for 5-7 minutes

Serve with the sorbet

For the sorbet:

- Boil the purée and add the sugar and aromatics to infuse for 30 minutes
- Pass through a fine sieve and churn in an ice cream machine for 30 minutes

The Chairman, Councillor R Taylor, welcomed everyone to the meeting.

C69/17/18 DISPENSATIONS IN RESPECT OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS

There were none.

C70/17/18 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

It was AGREED: That the minutes of the meeting held on 31st July, 2017 be signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

C71/17/18 CHAMBERLIN HALL AND VILLAGE DAY

Councillor Hutchings reported upon arrangements being made with regard to the finances and governance of the Chamberlin Hall Management Committee including changing signatories on the bank account following the AGM. He provided an overview of the new initiatives that were being pursued to increase the use of Chamberlin Hall by the local community. In addition, to the existing bowls club, a new snooker club had been launched. The main hall had been marked out ready for the formation of a badminton club and a table tennis club would start shortly. Also a musical youth club for children over 10 would be started soon. The Village Open Day on Sunday, 20th August, 2017 had been well-attended with positive feedback received and it was intended that the event be held annually in the future. There would be a dance night with band on 16th December. Price lists including discounts for villagers had been produced and the updating of the website and information elsewhere on the internet were being addressed.

It was AGREED: That the following be paid for from the Margaret Bishop Chamberlin Hall Fund upon presentation of invoices to the Clerk:

a. Marking out the main hall as a Badminton Court at a cost of £375; and

b. Purchase of an indoor/outdoor table tennis table (to be gifted to the Chamberlin Hall Management Committee).

Councillor Taylor had been in contact with Mrs Marshall of the First Responders and enquired if the Management Committee would be prepared to host a training course on the use of defibrillators and CPR. Councillor Hutchings asked that Mrs Marshall contact Chamberlin Hall to make arrangements.

C72/17/18 BNATURAL

Members of the Parish Council referred to the BNatural music festival which had been wellattended and they paid tribute to the work of the organisers for making it such a success. It



was noted that it had been necessary to purchase new signage for the event.

It was AGREED: That the Parish Council meets the cost of the new signage for village events and arranges for its safe storage.

C73/17/18 REMEMBRANCE AND ARMISTICE DAY

The Clerk referred to arrangements for Remembrance Day.

It was AGREED: That, in accordance with the Parish Council's normal practice, a wreath be purchased and a donation of £100 be made to the Royal British Legion. (It was noted that the Clerk would also purchase a wreath for the Deputy Lord Lieutenant on the basis that the Parish Council will be reimbursed).

Councillor Lester referred to the centenary of Armistice Day in 2018 and suggested that a weekend of events be held in the village to mark this occasion. Representatives of different organisations and the local community could be approached to form a coordinating group. Members of the Parish Council supported the proposal and requested that further details be drawn up in the form of a short briefing note so that they could be shared more widely. Direct approaches would then be made by Parish Councillors and the Clerk to local bodies who might play a part in arranging the event.

It was AGREED: That the Parish Council supports the outline proposals for commemorating Armistice Day.

Members of the Parish Council had previously discussed cleaning the War Memorial before the centenary of the Armistice and it was identified that steps should be taken to undertake these works after March 2018.

It was AGREED: That Councillor Hubbard, in liaison with the Clerk, seeks a qualified person (or company) to clean the War Memorial.

C74/17/18 VILLAGE AMENITIES

Councillor Hubbard reported upon various matters he had been dealing with in respect of burials and the cemetery. A letter of thanks was circulated from a local parishioner. There was some excess spoil that needed to be removed from a grave and it was agreed that this would be placed in the top corner at the Chelsworth end of the cemetery.

Councillor Lester reported that the Annual General Meeting of the Kings Pightle Management Committee had been advertised in The Bugle.

It was noted that there had been a reasonable amount of activity with regard to hirings of the Sportsfield pavilion.

C75/17/18 DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

District Councillor Creffield reported upon the following matters:

- a. An outline proposal raised with District Councillors by the Chief Executive of Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils regarding the possibility of formally merging the two Councils;
- b. Steps being taken to consult over the preparation of a Joint Local Plan by Babergh & Mid Suffolk District Councils.

C76/17/18 COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

County Councillor Lindsay reported upon the following matters:

- a. Steps being taken to install further bollards along Newberry Road. Parish Councillors advised that they had not been installed and County Councillor Lindsay said that he would pursue this matter.
- b. The County Council had agreed that enhanced special responsibility allowances would be paid to Members of the County Council's Cabinet.
- c. The County Council had agreed to appoint to a series of Cabinet Committees which because of their advisory status, would regrettably, meet in private rather than in public.
- d. The Cabinet would be considering proposals on Tuesday, 12th September to remove free travel to school for children up to the age of 16 and remove the current subsidy for those 16 and over studying at school/college.

The Parish Council was asked to consider arrangements for the strategic planning briefing by the Corporate Manager for Planning Policy which was due to take place on the evening of the next Parish Council meeting.

It was AGREED: That the time of the presentation on strategic planning on Monday, 9th October, 2017 and the commencement afterwards of the Parish Council meeting be confirmed by the Clerk in consultation with the Chairman and circulated to Parish Councillors. (It was noted that the presentation would be open to members of the public).



A letter from Manor Road.... Well the Charity catalogues for Christmas have been arriving for over a month to remind us that the summer is over and December looms. Usually I would be well advanced with planning and shopping for Christmas by now, what with December being so busy in the churches and schools - but this year I will have time to be relaxed about it all - well that's the plan anyway.

Time does seem to run faster the older I get though. And I can't say I have slowed up at all, but life fills the days and there never seems to be time to sit and relax. We have two deckchairs in the garage which Stuart bought for my birthday at least five years ago and they still have their plastic wrapping round them. Will next year be different? Not if what other retired people are telling me!

One of the vows I made when I was ordained was to pray every day: for you - the people of the parishes where I work, for the bad news places we see on our televisions, for peace, for our Queen and government and especially for the sick and bereaved. But prayer is also a time of peacefully sitting in God's presence, to see if God is saying anything to me. It's just a conversation really, or a pleasant sitting together in silence as two old friends can do. The best time of the day!

In the last few weeks one or two bits of vandalism have occurred which is sad. A couple came to the Produce Show and went to show me the page from their wedding day in the Visitor's Book. All of their friends and family had signed their names that day. But the pages had been torn out. Why would anyone do that we asked? Just to annoy or upset? Maybe they are angry with God about something and this is the only way they know to communicate it. I'd just like to say to them, God hears and knows and understands. He listens and if you do to, he may be able to help.
