

ED'S COMMENT

If it had been written in April, we would have read it, read it again and then decided it's an April fool! But Suffolk County Council's request for a consultation on how local volunteers can take over aspects of the council's Highways responsibilities is for real! This is what was written in last month's minutes:

"The Clerk reported that the County Council was conducting a survey seeking the views of Town and Parish Councils about their willingness to take on services currently provided by the County Council in respect of its role as the Highways Authority."

To be clear, here are just some of the main services the Highways Authority perform:-

Checking which roads are gritted and kept free from snow and ice; Managing details of road, pavement and verge maintenance and defects, including potholes, roadworks, drainage, resurfacing and vegetation; Maintaining information on parking including, how to apply for a dropped kerb and residential parking schemes; Managing current and planned roadworks or road and street closures; Keeping information on who holds the responsibility for flooding and how to report a flood; Responding to reports on problems with a street light, pedestrian crossing or traffic signal; Working with freight and haulage companies to ensure that HGV or lorries use the most suitable routes, roads or villages; Transport planning, strategy and plans. That's just part of the list.

We are well aware of these times of austerity, and the way central government has cut council funding way past the bone and deep into the marrow, 77% cuts over the last few years! So what could this survey by Suffolk, seeking to save even more money, lead to? Could we see working parties humping wheelbarrows full of steaming tarmac to fill up potholes? Or could we 'work with local freight and haulage companies to ensure their HGV vehicles use the most suitable route', for example the main roads of A134 and A14 preventing the use of the B1115 as a rat run! Oh, OK, they can use the B1115, but only between Stowmarket and Hitcham one end, and Hadleigh and Semer, the other. Could we construct our own transport strategy and plans thereby enabling improved infrastructure before building developments? Could we organize our own parking restrictions and establish penalty notices for poor parking, like outside the village shop, and allow our own Parish Council to make use of monies raised? Could we report the flooding that emerges by Chamberlin Close, flows down Wattisham Road and collects by the High Street so that it is actually fixed, permanently? Could we? Actually, maybe not.

To save money it was suggested we might be asked to simply get our step-ladders, bucket of soapy water, soft sponge and keep the street signs clean. However, this is not as simple as it sounds. Street signs (rather than street names) are a minimum 210cms high which is just under 7ft tall, only reached by ladders. This is crucial because according to recent statistics around 40% of 'falls from a height accidents' investigated by the Health & Safety Executive were from ladders! According to ROSPA the most dangerous type of ladder is the step-ladder, accounting for 8,959 accidents. Our clock-winder, Jayne Harrison, must be an absolute walking miracle! Shrewdly, she does not use a step ladder! Last year's data from the government's own Health and Safety Executive showed that the highest number of *fatal* accidents was falls from a height (28%), followed next by being hit by a moving vehicle (17%). To be involved as a volunteer for the Highways Authority working on high signs on a road or street environment with nearby 'moving vehicles', therefore potentially puts you in both first and second place, increasing your risk of a serious accident to 45%! A step too far! No wonder the Parish Council recommended a polite no!

COUNTRYSIDE OBSERUER

I recall the "Mamas & Papas" song in the sixties including the words, "the darkest

hour is just before dawn." The dark pre-dawn hours strike home today as the weather threw a cocktail of wind and rain through the atmosphere. I went to see the film "Darkest Hour", the brilliant account of Winston Chuchill's return to Westminster as the PM, whose fortitude and resilience steered us from almost certain defeat. A powerful film that does not need endless CGI effects to make its point. Thankfully Winston did not give in to the weaker minds of Westminster who wanted to negotiate "terms" with Mussolini who would act as a go-between with Hitler, just

imagine! Suffolk today lay shivering under a dark, leaden sky, browbeaten by a bitter wind that has blown all day. Storm surges laid siege to the coast, breaching the sea defences at Snape and awakening memories of the disastrous floods in January 1953 when more than 300 lives were lost. Flooding is no stranger in this part of the world. It is, after all, England's low country, and as soon as you cross the A12 and head east towards Aldeburgh you can feel the land spreading out to meet the 50-odd miles of marshland. mudflats, creeks and shingle spits that lie between Felixstowe and Kessingland. Here you are on hallowed ground, for you have just entered the Suffolk Coast and Heaths, a much-loved Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty on the outermost edge of England. Its defining features are the five reed-fringed estuaries: Stour, Orwell, Deben, Alde and Blyth (Benjamin Britten's Curlew River), each one receding into a dissolving distance whose low-lying hinterlands offer 155 square miles of gorse and heather to explore, together with ghostly glades of silver birch and ancient woods where red deer roam. Along its shores, at Southwold, Aldeburgh, Orford and Woodbridge, you are never far from a good meal and an open fire the perfect destination for a winters walk. It says a lot for this unique corner of rural England that even on the rainiest dark days there is so much to see and do. At Minsmere, the RSPB's flagship reserve you can watch Marsh Harriers revelling in the wind, drifting and sideslipping over acres of reeds.

I remember the words of a Suffolk friend of mine. "Suffolk people talk about what they call a lazy wind," he said. "That's too lazy to go around you so it goes straight through you." But when it blows you come alive and so do the huge watercolour cloudscapes, filled with the constant movement of birds. There are few places in Britain more picturesque than Constable country here in Suffolk. Set within an area of outstanding natural beauty this rural landscape was where the painter John Constable was born, and where he painted his most celebrated works. John Constable was born in 1776 in East Bergholt. Throughout his life he felt great affection for the Suffolk landscape and the villages surrounding his home, telling a friend: "I should paint my own places best, painting with me is but another word for feeling." Of all the paintings by John Constable, perhaps the most famous is The Hay Wain. It depicts a horse and cart crossing the River Stour by a white cottage on the river bank. The place is Flatford, and like so much of Constable Country, it remains unchanged to this day. You can still explore the white cottage (which belonged to Constable's neighbour, Willy Lott). Flatford Mill, which was owned by the Constable family and Bridge Cottage, which houses a John Constable exhibition. Mike Biddulph

The final bequests have now been released by the solicitors administering the estate. Based on advice from the Charities Commission, the residue from the estate was passed on to the trustees of Bildeston Kings Pightle Trust to distribute and administer in line with Henry Morphew's will.

From the estate, the trustees will be releasing previously specified amounts to Chamberlin Hall, Bildeston Sports Field and the Kings Pightle.

Further specified amounts will be invested by the trustees with annual interest being used to provide an annual party for the retired residents of the village and also to provide an annual outing for the children of Bildeston. Any surplus income, at the discretion of the trustees, may be made available for the benefit of the local community, following the spirit of Henry's wishes.

Gardening first for Chamberlin Hall.

Chamberlin Hall is proud to be the new home venue for meetings of the East Anglian Garden Group. At their first meeting in the hall on February 17th a packed audience was treated to a rare appearance by one of the gardening



world's best known designers, multi Gold Medal Chelsea winner, Cleve West.

Cleve does not often give talks, but on this occasion he was here to share his passion for the garden as a place of healing. His talk, which told of his own life growing up near the moors of southern England and his work as a designer over the years, was given in support of Horatio's Gardens – a charity which raises funds for and installs healing gardens in hospitals.

This charity is named for Horatio – a teenager aspiring to become a doctor, who was tragically killed by a polar bear, whilst on an expedition on the arctic island of Spitzbergen. You may remember this tragic story from the press at the time. Horatio himself had come up with the idea

of a healing garden at the hospital in Salisbury where his father worked as a surgeon treating spinal injuries. Cleve was the designer of that garden, which has become the first of many. Cleve was passionate and inspirational and rounded off his talk with a plea to us all to consider our human impact on the planet – and maybe even to consider becoming vegan!

Recipe of the Month

Parsley Risotto with Salsify and Wild Mushrooms

with thanks to Chris Lee Head Chef at The Bildeston Crown

Ingredients

- x4 shallots, finely diced
- x2 cups of Arborio rice
- ½ a large glass of good quality white wine
- 1 ½ litre of good vegetable stock, warmed
- 100g grated parmesan cheese
- 1 onion, finely sliced
- 50g butter

- 1 bunch of curly parsley
- 1 bunch of flat parsley
- 2 medium sticks of salsify, cooked until tender in red wine, rosemary and garlic
- 500g wild mushrooms sautéed in butter
- serves 4 people



Method

- Peel the salsify and marinade in red wine overnight, then cook in red wine, garlic and bay leaves till tender.
- Sweat off the shallots in butter till soft with no colour, then add the rice, sweat off for one
 minute.
- Add the wine and reduce.
- Add a litre of stock, a little at a time, stirring until absorbed.
- Whilst the rice is still al dente, remove from the heat and spread on a flat tray to chill quickly.
- Make a parsley purée by sweating off the sliced onion. Add the parsley stalks remaining ½ litre of warm stock. Simmer until soft. Add leaves and cook for further 4 minutes and blend to a smooth purée, then chill.
- When ready, heat the parsley purée in a pan until boiling. Add the chilled rice and simmer until rice is tender.
- Finish the risotto with the parmesan cheese, a knob of butter and a squeeze of lemon.
- Dress with the salsify and sautéed mushrooms.

C170/17/18 DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY AND NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

C171/17/18 DISPENSATIONS IN RESPECT OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS

There were none.

C172/17/18 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

It was AGREED: That the minutes of the meeting held on 14th February, 2018 be signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

C173/17/18 PUBLIC SESSION

The proprietor of Bank House Stores presented an outline proposal to place tables and chairs on the Market Square to operate as an outdoor café in good weather. The practicalities of the arrangement were considered including disposal of cups, safety, parking and ensuring that the initiative would not conflict with community fundraising events that took place, from time to time, on the Market Square.

It was AGREED: That a fuller proposal be developed for the outdoor café and submitted to the next meeting.

Mrs S Ashton referred to the closure of the Sheltered Housing Scheme on Newberry Road with the withdrawal of on-site support and wondered if the Day Room could be made available for exercise classes or other activities for the benefit of the local community which, she would be happy to organise.

It was AGREED: That District Councillor Creffield be requested to make enquiries of Babergh District Council about the community use of the facility and if the proposal could be linked to any wider initiative in the district, whereby they would be able to provide advice and support.

C174/17/18 UPDATE ON VILLAGE AMENITIES

Councillor P Hutchings referred to the use of Chamberlin Hall and its financial performance for the year to date. The table tennis and badminton evening was proving to be popular with in

excess of 25 people participating each week. There had been an increase in the membership of the Bowls Club compared with the end of the previous season and it was hoped that the promotion of Carpet Bowls during the winter months might lead to more playing Members. The playing surface of a new table tennis table had deteriorated and following representations to the supplier, a new one had been provided, meaning that there were now three table tennis tables available at Chamberlin Hall. Details were provided of a 1940's event on VE Day (8th May), which would feature a 15-piece Big Band with themed dress to be worn by attendees.

Initial enquiries had been made, with regard to installing solar panels on the roof of Chamberlin Hall.

In response to comments received from new users of Chamberlin Hall from outside the village, Chamberlin Hall Management Committee was seeking to improve orientation in the village for people seeking to find "the Village Hall".

It was AGREED:

- a. That Councillor Hutchings and the Clerk would liaise further about information and support that may be available concerning the installation of solar panels; and
- b. That Councillor Hutchings would contact the County Council about the type of signage that could be erected and wording that could be used.

Councillor Lester reported that Taylor Made Joinery had made and installed two new signs for Kings Pightle.

Councillor Taylor reported that the roof of the Sportsfield Pavilion had been repaired. Further to Minute C161/17/17, Councillors Taylor and Guttridge had met with the Maintenance Operative to discuss the feasibility of cutting the football pitch, rather than being outsourced, and of implementing new grass cutting arrangements for the rest of the site. The need to provide greater flexibility in terms of Maintenance support was discussed and the consensus was that a further part-time Maintenance Operative be recruited to help with Maintenance services.

It was AGREED:

- a. That the Sportsfield Management Committee be invited to consider giving notice of the cancellation of the grass cutting service provided by Vertas in respect of the football pitch, whereupon, this work shall be included in the arrangements overseen by the Parish Council for maintaining open spaces at various sites in the village; and
- b. That a position of Maintenance Operative be advertised in The Bugle.

C175/17/18 CLERK'S REPORT

The Clerk reported upon issues raised with him since the last meeting including Broadband speed in the village, ownership of land on which a footpath was situated between Chamberlin Close and Brooksfield and render which had fallen off the inside of the Clock Tower. In respect to this latter point, Councillor Hubbard had met on site with the Clock Winder to examine the problem and established that because it was in the enclosed upper level of the Clock Tower, there was no danger to public safety.

It was AGREED: That Councillors Guttridge and Hubbard would meet on site to consider further, if any repairs are required.

The Clerk reported upon the draft recommendations prepared by the Local Government Boundary Commission on new electoral arrangements for Babergh District Council. The deadline for representations was 30th April, 2018. It was noted that under the proposals, Bildeston would form part of the North West Cosford Ward which would include parishes such as Brettenham, Hitcham, Kettlebaston and Thorpe Morieux. It was considered unfortunate that the Commission had not recognised Bildeston's significance within the network of local villages locally and had included it at the edge of a ward rather than placing at the centre of a ward.

It was AGREED: That the draft recommendations on the electoral review be noted.

C176/17/18 DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Councillor Creffield reported on the following:

- The District Council had set its budget for 2018/19 with an increase of 3.25% in Council Tax with the backdrop of further reductions in funding from central government which would reduce to zero in 2019/20.
- The existence of a Multi-agency Safeguarding Hub which was contactable through Babergh District Council where suspicions about adult or child abuse could be reported.
- Babergh's Affordable Housing Programme with advice available from 0300 123 4000 or www. babergh.gov.uk;
- Further information was being sought about the public survey concerning the proposed merger between Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils.

C177/17/18 COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

County Councillor Lindsay had submitted a written report on the following matters:

- The County Council had set its budget for 2018/19 with an increase of 4.99% in Council Tax which would still require cuts in many services.
- The Raising the Bar strategy for 2018 to 2020 had been published. This was the third phase of the strategy launched in 2012 to raise educational standards in Suffolk with the ultimate goal being to place the education system in Suffolk within the top 25% nationally.
- A new contract to provide intensive therapeutic support for adolescents funded by a social impact bond with private investors providing investment capital and receiving a return if the venture was successful.

C178/17/18 INTERNAL CONTROL AND RISK MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

The Clerk reported on a number of administrative and governance matters.

It was AGREED:

That the Council confirms that is has conducted a review of its internal control arrangements as per the report circulated prior to the meeting and notes the need to comply with the General Data Protection Regulations and the annual reporting requirements in respect of the Community Infrastructure Levy;
- c. That Standing Orders be approved unamended;
- d. That Financial Regulations be approved, subject to amendment of Financial Regulation 2.2 to permit a cheque signatory to review bank reconciliations throughout the year, and Councillor Lester be appointed to fulfil this role:
- e. That the General Risk Assessment be approved and adopted;
- f. That the Risk Assessment for the Maintenance Operative be approved and the Clerk meets with the Operative to go through the document, as soon as practicable;
- g. That the Calendar of Meetings for 2018/19 be approved;
