

### **ED'S COMMENT**

Throughout history humans have felt the need to explore. Indeed, in many cases, history is about exploration, of humans going somewhere new to them on our planet, only to discover other humans already there! Apart, as far as we know that is, from one place; space. Recently we have learned about the scientific and technological achievement of the US space agency's New Horizons probe and its successful flyby of the lump of rock world known as Ultima Thule. The encounter occurred some 6.5bn km (4bn miles) away, making it the most distant ever exploration of an object in our Solar System. Not to be outdone, at the same time the Chinese announced they had landed a space probe on the far side of the moon complete with two rovers searching for minerals.

Ultima Thule is nicknamed 'The Snowman' due to its shape of a round body and smaller round head stuck on top. Being so far from the sun, and protected within a belt of 'rocks', scientists believe the shape demonstrates a moment in time when fragments from the 'big bang' exploded out and merged together to form larger planets. Space exploration has quite a history of its own. It's hard to believe that we have been building and sending an array of probes into our solar system for the past 50 years!

Pioneer 10 was launched way back in 1972; Pioneer 11 in April 1973; Voyager 1 in September 1977; Voyager 2 also in1977; Galileo in 1989; Ulysses in 1990. They are still going, still travelling through space in different directions through our own system. Voyager 1 is the most distant, Pioneer 10, the next most distant, about 15.4 billion kilometers (9.6 billion miles) away from the sun on the opposite side of the solar system. Voyager 2 is about 14.2 billion kilometers (8.8 billion miles) away from the sun on the same side of the solar system as Voyager 1, and still carrying the famous golden plaques engraved with information for aliens, if they exist, to find, decode and know about 'us', humans! But why is there the overwhelming desire to explore space? Goodness knows that, along

with us and Europe, the US and China have enough problems to sort out down here! Stephen Hawking once said, "I don't think the human race will survive the next thousand years, unless we spread into space. There are too many accidents that can befall life on a single planet. But I'm an optimist. We will reach out to the stars."

And Astronaut John Young, "Knowing what we know now, we are being irresponsible in our failure to make the scientific and technical progress we will need for protecting our newly discovered severely threatened and probably endangered species--us. NASA is not about the 'Adventure of Human Space Exploration,' we are in the deadly serious business of saving the species. All Human Exploration's bottom line is about preserving our species over the long haul."

The greatest prize, then, seems to be the ultimate saving of humanity. The costs are huge, but the drive is incessant. What a thought though, that future generations, millions of years from now (hopefully!), might be living somewhere other than Earth! Perhaps that's the other lesson to take from all this. The future is yet to be, but we live in the here and now, the present. It is just as important to live in the moment as it is to dream of what might be sometime in the future. There are so many issues, challenges and problems humanity needs to sort out for those of us living through the new year of 2019, let alone way ahead in the future. So, meanwhile, let's celebrate and appreciate what we have right here on Earth, in England, in lovely Suffolk and our own beautiful haven of Bildeston. As winter merges into spring, you won't find anywhere lovelier, nicer or better to live!

### **COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER**

This month we are looking at a crustacean. Crayfish are extremely distinctive freshwater crustaceans. Their large anterior-most pairs of legs have powerful claws which are efficient tools for defense, food gathering, and object manipulation. Their four pairs of walking legs assist them in rapid locomotion across the bottom substrates of their water habitats. Surprisingly, they are not really capable of swimming although they can use powerful thrusts of their tails to rapidly propel themselves (backwards) through the water. This movement is particularly effective when the crayfish is attempting to elude a

predator. Species of crayfish are widely distributed throughout the world. They live in ponds, streams, rivers, and lakes most typically under submerged rocks and logs. Some species are also capable of digging burrows frequently topped with tall, distinctive "turrets" that are often located some distance from the water's edge. In Suffolk, crayfish are found in the flowing waters of our streams and surrounding isolated wetlands. Crayfish extremely hardy animals that can tolerate wide ranges of water temperatures. They can survive the drying up and loss of their streams and ponds and respond to these extreme habitat disruptions by hiding in burrows or by migration to still intact water. Crayfish are very intolerant of pollution and other human-generated fouling of their environment. A rich crayfish population is a very positive index of habitat quality. When food sources are abundant, a crayfish tends to forage (i.e. leave its refuge under a rock or log) a very small percentage of the time. When food is scarce, though, crayfish will spend a considerable amount of time foraging. Crayfish consume both plant and animal materials and will, depending upon seasonal and local availabilities, consume a great variety of types of foods. Almost all aquatic plants, mollusks, insect larvae, mature insects, tadpoles. amphibian eggs, and small fish are common foods. Also taken opportunistically are small rodents and even small birds. Young crayfish must consume 1 to 4% of their body weight each day and tend to concentrate upon animal food sources. Adult crayfish only require an intake of 0.3 to 1% of their body weight each day and tend to primarily take plant materials for their food. Crayfish breed in the early spring and females carry the fertilised, developing eggs inside their bodies for 4 to 6 weeks. These developing eggs are then transferred to the outside of the female's body and glued via an adhesive called "glair" to the female's tail. The eggs then hatch by the end of spring. Only 20 to 40% of the eggs, though, actually produce young. Crayfish are eaten by many species of animals including foxes, rats, grass snakes and many types of birds. Last summer my brother caught dozens in the Grand Union canal. Three cooker grills with wire attached to all four corners and connected together were lowered into the canal. Bait was some cooked chicken. The following morning each grill was hoisted and contained at least six good sized Crays. These were collected over a couple of days until we had around fifty then cooked in boiling water and eaten. I have to say having partaken in the feast they were delicious and free. The North American crayfish was introduced to the UK over 60 years ago and has all but wiped out the common native variety being more aggressive and successful. Our local Barn Owl population appear to be thriving and holding its own. I have seen three owls in different areas leading me to believe they are individuals and not the same owl. However a tough period of winter weather may well see some succumb to lack of food Mike Biddulph page 9 - issue 340 - February 2019

# Recipe of the Month Beef and Ale Stew with Dumplings

with thanks to Alison

#### Ingredients

1Kg braising steak cut into large pieces 4 carrots chopped

2 cloves 2 onions cut into quarters

1/4 cinnamon stick 4 celery stalks

2 star anise 3 large cooking apples cored and diced

Plain flour for dusting 500ml Ale

1 tbsp salt 1.5Litres chicken stock

3-4 tbsp vegetable oil 1 bunch rosemary and 5 bay leaves

**Dumpling Ingredients** 

115g fresh white breadcrumbs 115g beef suet

115g self raising flour 1 egg beaten

2 tbsp chopped parsley 2 tbsp milk

Pinch salt oil for glazing

#### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 140C/275F
- 2. Wrap cloves, cinnamon and star anise in muslin. Set aside.
- 3. Dredge the beef in seasoned flour and heat the oil in a large, heavy bottomed casserole over a medium heat.
- 4. Fry the beef for a few seconds on all sides until browned all over. Set aside
- 5. Add the carrots to the pan and fry until sticky and golden brown 6-8 minutes. Set aside
- 6. Add the onions and fry 6-8 minutes then the celery. Set aside
- 7. Add the beef and vegetables back to the casserole, add the muslin bag and the apples stirring well, then pour in the ale and bring to the boil.
- 8. Pour in the stock, rosemary and bay leaves, cover and reduce heat until simmering. Season to taste
- 9. Transfer to the oven and cook for  $2 \frac{1}{2} 3 \frac{1}{2}$  hours until the beef is tender.
- 10. Dumplings next mix together the breadcrumbs, suet, flour, salt and parsley in a large bowl, whisk together egg and milk and add to dry ingredients.
- 11. Roll the dough into eight equally sized dumplings.
- 12. After 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  3 hours dot the dumplings onto the surface of the stew leaving a space between each.
- 13. Return to the oven for 20 minutes, after brushing the tops with a little oil.
- 14. Increase oven temp to 200C/ 400F for 10 minutes for crisp and golden brown dumplings.




