

ED'S COMMENT

This year, March 11th is Commonwealth Day and the 53 nations of the Commonwealth have chosen a theme, as they do every year. This year is special as it marks the 70th anniversary of the forming of the Commonwealth. Given what is happening to the United Kingdom currently, it seems to be no coincidence that the theme is - 'A Connected Commonwealth' working together to protect our natural environment and the ocean that we share and cooperate on trade to encourage inclusive economic empowerment for all people - particularly women, youth and marginalised communities.'

Given the desire to seek new trade agreements across the world, debate about the place of the Commonwealth has increased alongside Brexit. Our place amongst the Commonwealth was significantly altered when we joined the EEC and we had to abide by its trade regulations which prevented us from carrying on with the relationships we already had. This changed the position of the United Kingdom within the Commonwealth, as the EU took over all responsibility for trade deals. Brexit, if and when it happens, provides the opportunity to once again open up those markets directly, so it's interesting to remind ourselves how the Commonwealth was established in the first place.

The British Commonwealth of Nations was built upon the concept of the old British Empire and the result of the 1926 Balfour Declaration which stipulated that the relationship between Britain and her Dominions was equal in status. In 1949 the association we know today, the Commonwealth came into being when the term 'British' was dropped. Since then, independent countries from Africa, the Americas, Asia, Europe and the Pacific have joined the Commonwealth. Membership today is based on free and equal voluntary co-operation. In theory, any country can join the Commonwealth, indeed the last two countries to join - Rwanda and Mozambique - never had any historical ties to the British Empire. In 1965, an office called the Commonwealth Secretariat was set up to run it. The Heads of State meet and recently agreed for Prince Charles to succeed Queen Elizabeth as head of the Commonwealth.

In the 1950s a little known, but extremely interesting discussion took place which could have altered the history of Europe considerably. After WW2 the two major powers in Europe were the UK and France. In 1956 they were involved together to protect their oil interests in the Suez when Egypt nationallsed its oil industry. This coincided with the time when France, together with Germany, Belgium, Italy, Luxembourg, and the Netherlands, were planning for what would become the European Union. Also, newly independent African countries were joining the Commonwealth. At that time British trade with the Commonwealth was four times larger than trade with Europe. In the midst of all this world wide political upheaval, the British government under Prime Minister Anthony Eden in 1956 considered a plan to create a European free trade zone while also protecting the favoured status of the Commonwealth. Britain also considered inviting Scandinavian and other European countries to join the Commonwealth so it would become a major economic common market. Presumably they knew about the discussions taking place regarding the EEC. It came to a head in October 1956 when Anthony Eden and the French Prime Minister Guy Mollet met and discussed the idea that France should join the Commonwealth. Nothing came of the proposals as the French Prime Minister does not have the same powers or responsibilities as ours. It is the President who is in charge and, behind the scenes at the same time, moves were well under way to establish what would become the Common Market. C'est la vie! COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER

Last month we looked at Crayfish found in our rivers and lakes, we are sticking with an aquatic theme this month with the freshwater shrimp. I recently stopped by the river Brett and sat for thirty minutes or so, and saw what I think was a freshwater shrimp. Fish and quite likely Shrimps exist here a food source for the brilliant looking Kingfisher that flashed past me in a blur of orange and electric blue plumage. The common European shrimp, or sand shrimp occurs in inland waters on both sides of the North Atlantic and grows to about two inches. it is dark brown with brown or reddish spots. The shrimp feeds on small

plants and animals. The young live in the shallows or a pool and then move into deeper waters. They live in schools among aquatic vegetation. Shrimp swim backward by rapidly flexing the abdomen and tail. Their food consists mostly of small plants and animals, although some shrimp feed on carrion. The female shrimp may lay from 1,500 to 14,000 eggs, which are attached to the swimming legs. The swimming larvae pass through five developmental stages before becoming juveniles.

Many freshwater shrimp species are very good at finding even the smallest food particle hiding in the sand. All freshwater shrimp moult their exoskeleton every few months as they grow larger and old exoskeletons become too small. Shrimps are very vulnerable for a period after moulting before their new exoskeletons hardened and they can during this period be eaten by fish that normally wouldn't touch them. The shrimp will mate several times per year. During this process the male carries the female on his back as they are swimming. The female carries about 50 fertilized eggs in her egg pouch and these are orange in color and show through her semi-transparent body. The young shrimp hatch within the egg pouch and emerge as fully developed young shrimp but microscopic in size. Sometimes discarded exo-skeletons can be seen floating on the waters surface. Since the shrimp have no natural defense mechanisms, except camouflage, they usually hide in weeds and are more active during periods of low sunlight or after dark. have been eating and their immediate surroundings usually determine the colouration of a shrimp. Being semi-transparent, the entire digestive tract of the shrimp shows through their shell. Although they scavenge on animal material, their primary food is often plant material and algae. The plants and algae causes most shrimp to appear as various shades of brown to green. However, the immediate surroundings can sometimes offset that color. For example, in lakes with reddish brown bottom mud, the mud is often ingested with the algae and the shrimp tend to take on the coloration of the mud. Whether plants or mud. the shrimp is usually well camouflaged with it's surroundings. Worthy of note is the orange coloration of the eggs carried within a pregnant female.

The shrimp will swim for 5 to 10 inches and then stop to rest and breath. When stopped, they sink toward the bottom, usually in a curled position. After a few seconds they will uncurl and swim another short distance. This swimming and sinking is very erratic. The legs of the shrimp are constantly in motion to circulate water over their gills. When mating, the shrimp can be seen swimming in tandem, one on top of the other. Sometimes flies are tied to imitate a mating pair of shrimp.







Recipe of the Month Hearty Wholewheat Pasta with brussel sprouts, cheese and potato

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients - serves 8

750g Brussels Sprouts, trimmed and halved

250g baking potato, peeled and diced into

2-3cm pieces

500g wholewheat penne pasta or tortiglioni Salt

100g ricotta

250g gruyere cheese cubed

50g softened unsalted butter

1tbsp garlic oil

4 sage leaves, shredded

50g grated parmesan cheese



Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 200C/400F/Gas 6 and fill large saucepan with water to cook the sprouts, potato and pasta.
- 2. When water boils add salt, the sprouts, diced potato and the pasta, bring back to boil and cook for 8-10 minutes.
- 3. Just before draining, remove two cupfuls of the cooking liquid and put to one side.
- 4. Tip the drained pasta, sprouts and potatoes into a baking tin. Add the ricotta and diced gruyere and a cupful of the cooking water, toss well to combine. Add more of the liquid if you feel the pasta is dry.
- 5. Warm the butter and garlic oil in a small pan and when melted, add the sage and fry for 30 seconds before drizzling over the pasta bake.
- 6. Sprinkle with the parmesan and bake for 20 minutes. Surface will then be topped a lovely light gold in colour.
