ED'S COMMENT

A special meeting took place recently at Chamberlin Hall to introduce the Active Wellbeing team to Bildeston, explain its purpose and confirm that Bildeston is the next area for the project. Active Wellbeing is a partnership between Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils to support older adults who, for a variety of reasons, are physically inactive, that is, do less than 30 minutes of some kind of activity each week. This could be due to ill-health, lack of mobility, osteoarthritis, mental issues, lack of transport or even financial worries preventing joining an activity. The team look into all those areas, identify people affected by inactivity and support a range of solutions. The Active Wellbeing team is currently working in Long Melford and Lavenham and the meeting confirmed that the next phase is a specific project based at the Bildeston Health Centre to be launched Monday 3rd June lasting for a year with the planning next meeting scheduled for this month.

Typically, activity levels steeply decline as people progress through old age and are often lower still amongst those living alone. Ageing of itself should not stop us staying as active as possible, for as long as possible. Indeed, living alone and the sense of isolation is such a sad state when Bildeston has so many activities in which villagers of all ages could participate. Given how fortunate we are in Bildeston, with the resources to support activities for all ages and abilities, it is so sad to discover that living amongst us are neighbours whose health and well being could be much better if we could just help a little to encourage and support them to join something that would improve the quality of their lives. Data shows that 27% of patients aged 50+ registered with the Bildeston Health Centre are inactive, that's around 1000 people in Bildeston and the surrounding villages.

The Active Wellbeing project aims to help improve quality of life, individuals' physical and mental wellbeing and tackle loneliness and social isolation. Many lessons have been learned from the current phase and the local project co-ordinator, Nick Pringle, who will be based for at least a day a week at Bildeston Health Centre, will support the village to establish activities to help residents stay active and healthy, support others to lead on specific activities and help resolve barriers that currently keep people inactive. Staff from Bildeston Health Centre attended the meeting and, excited by the project, already had ideas for patients to be signposted towards appropriate activities relevant to their condition when they come to the surgery. These range from health walks to gentle exercise classes, falls prevention, Fit Villages projects and even adapted sports. The plan is to help people find the right option for them, taking into account their interests, location, transport issues, any additional needs, budget and other concerns. Active Wellbeing will be working closely with Bildeston Health Centre to help identify any patients who need this support. The team want to celebrate and link to the great work already taking place within the communities of Babergh in general and Bildeston in particular, as well as support the development of any new activities local people feel are needed and would benefit from to help older people stay physically active, healthier and more socially supported if living on their own.

The most heartening fact that emerged from this first meeting was the enormous benefit that has already been achieved in the Long Melford and Lavenham area. The simple fact that joining an activity with a group and having a chat, cup of tea and biscuit was all it took to boost peoples' well being, as much if not more, in some cases, than the activity itself! A mark of any community is the extent to which it cares for its most vulnerable, and choosing Bildeston Health Centre area for the next phase was no accident. Hopefully Bildeston will play its part in making Active Wellbeing a great success!

COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER

The year is rolling along quite nicely. The dawn chorus participants are limbering up ever earlier ready for their summer concerts. I guess the birds can see their song sheets that much earlier. Squirrels (greys) not my favourite rodent due to the damage they cause eating song birds' eggs and fledglings given the chance. Reds in medieval times were dispersed right across the UK. Victorians in their wisdom imported Greys from north America in the 1870's as novelty pets. Needless to say some escaped, met up and hey presto we're overrun with them. As a result the beautiful red which is a smaller non aggressive species

has been forced to retreat and can only be found in small parts of the UK. The Isle of wight is grey free with a strong population as is Brownsea Island, Thetford forest and parts of Wales and the border country. Red squirrels are among our best-loved woodland animals and is the UK's only native squirrel species. Once a common sight, but for decades have been in decline. Red squirrels (Sciurus vulgaris) live in coniferous forests and deciduous woods. Since the Victorian period, the UK population of reds has dropped from around 3.5 million to between 120,000 to 160,000 individuals (according to different estimates). The population in England is thought to be as low as 15,000. If you want to see them in the wild, prime spotting times are morning and late afternoon because that's when they're most active Grey squirrels carry a disease, a Parapoxvirus, which does not appear to affect their health but often kills red squirrels. Grey squirrels are more likely to eat green acorns, so will decimate the food source before reds get to them. Reds favour the green acorns because they are less able to digest the polyphenols in mature acorns. When red squirrels are put under pressure they will not breed as often. Another huge factor in their decline is the loss of woodland over the last century, but road traffic and predators are all threats too. Red squirrels are recognisable by their red to russet fur, ear tufts and long. fluffy tails. But the colour of their coat can vary with some reds appearing very grey (and some grey squirrels can have red fur down their backs and on their feet). Reds have small ear tufts that develop into large tufts in winter. Red squirrels are very elusive and spend much of their time in the tree canopy. Look out for large dreys in trees, scratch marks on bark, and chewed pine cones that look like chewed apple cores. Listen out for their 'chuk chuk' noise which is a vocalisation they often use. They have a mainly vegetarian diet that includes seeds, hazelnuts and green acorns, fungus, bark, and sapwood. They especially favour pine seeds, but also eat larch and spruce seeds. Because they disperse seeds, they play a vital role in the reforestation process. Reds do not hibernate and store fungi in trees to eat over the winter months. When food is plentiful, they put on weight in the autumn to help them through the winter. This is important for breeding females, so that they are in good condition for producing young in the spring. Red squirrels usually produce 2-3 young, called kittens, in Feb to April and they often produce a second litter from May to June. Outside of the breeding season, red squirrels tend to live alone, but in early spring, watch out for their courtship displays in the trees. Babies are born 45-48 days after mating and are looked after by their mothers. Kittens are weaned around 10 weeks when they develop a complete set of teeth. Some stay with their mothers over winter. Between 20 and 50 per cent of red squirrel kittens survive to adulthood. I have studied our local woods avidly since we've been in Suffolk; sadly as yet I have not seen one Red, just the Greys. 



FIRES BEHIND TAYLORS' GARAGE SITE

I am writing to the Parish Council to ask that they investigate the following issue.

There have been a number of fires during the day on the meadow behind the Taylors Garage site. It appears that material is being brought to the site and burnt. The most recent fire today (19/2/19) was extensive, prolonged and caused nausea and headaches amongst those in my property who were forced to breathe the fumes in.

Not only is this activity antisocial, it is potentially very dangerous to residents and also children at Bildeston Primary School when these fires are lit during term time. We have no way of knowing what is being burnt on this site, but the fumes are not those of "garden waste".

As you will be aware there are strict laws governing the disposal of waste and I ask that the Parish Council seeks clarification from both Babergh District Council and the land owner that they have all the appropriate permissions for what could amount to the commercial disposal of waste on this site. I remind the Council that they have undertaken a similar task regarding permissions in relation to a fast food trailer operating in the village.

I have copied this to the Bugle asking that it be published to ascertain whether any other residents have suffered adverse health impacts as a result of being forced to breathe these fumes in and if so that they contact the Parish Council. Yours J Stock

A COUPLE'S LIFE IN BILDESTON (so far) ARE THEY LOCALS?

Fifty years ago, in April 1969 a very young married couple together with their new born baby son moved into Manor Road Bildeston. Having been brought up in the backwaters of Hitcham, with no electric no mains water and an outside "bucket & chuck it" for a toilet during most of their childhood, moving to the metropolis of Bildeston with its shops and pubs was quite a welcome shock to them both! Our couple (Mr A and Mrs C) had both worked full time since leaving school at the age of 15, and managed to save enough money for a deposit for a mortgage, sadly this did mean having to sell their prized mini car and replacing it with a **not** so prized Morris Minor Van (not the most comfortable family transport).

To earn a decent living in those days, it was a case of working as many hours as available, and A frequently worked a 12-hour day plus weekends if available and to supplement the family income. C became the local Avon Lady and also did seasonal field work. Bildeston then was blessed with 3 General Stores; Co-op, Bankhouse and Youngs, 2 Butchers; Co-op and Emmerson's, 2 Hairdresser's; Sylvia's and Michael's also; Lasts the Greengrocers, Blofields Jeweller's, Eades Stationery-Newspapers-Toys, Barton's Fish & Chips, Post Office, Chandler's Hardware Store, Fawley Electric's, Taylors Garage and filling station, Death & Son Undertakers and not forgetting 3 Pubs - all 3 still in existence (that must say something about the people of Bildeston)! In 1971 our couple's family was complete when their second son was born. By this time, they had got to know a lot of people and would say "hello" and chat to people when out for a walk, this doesn't happen so often these days for various reasons, one probably being people looking down to avoid dog poo.

In 1976 A was made redundant, along with lots of other locals when Biggs Wall Civil Engineers closed their Semer branch, this in turn led to A retraining in a different type of work. About this time C enrolled at evening classes in Hadleigh to learn Typing and book keeping, which eventually led to part time followed by full time office work. It was about this time when their first colour television was purchased - great excitement! Sadly, Bildeston succumbed to a big disaster in 1975 when the Church Tower collapsed whilst undergoing renovations, fortunately nobody was hurt. A couple of years later our couple went very hi-tec by having a telephone landline installed, oh what joy! In 1979 the village was fortunate to have the luxury of a new Health Centre, previously the Drs held surgeries in Tower House where they also dispensed the medicines.

It was during the second half of the 1970's our couple became more involved with village life and A joined the original Sportsfield Committee, shortly after he joined the Dukes Hall, then Chamberlin Hall Committees. In more recent times they have both been active with various Village Clubs/Committees i.e. Parish Council, Kings Pightle, Bugle and Allotments and Drama Group. Life carried on through the 1980's with both sons leaving school and finding full time employment/apprenticeships. It was also during this period our couple moved the huge distance to another property in Manor Road, very adventurous! Even more adventurous they experienced their first aeroplane flight for their summer holiday - what excitement - well as the saying goes "life begins at 40". During the 1990's with both sons having flown the nest and married, the first grandchild arrived in 1998 with 4 more arriving by 2004. As the 21st Century progressed our couple began to look forward to retirement, which they are now enjoying, and now being Pensioners they have more time to whinge about anything and everything!!! long may they continue to enjoy "life in Bildeston".

So, if you have managed to read this little article to the end, perhaps you'll make up your minds if you think they are "locals". They think they are????



Bildeston History Quarterly

Issue 30 (Spring 2019)

Have you wondered about the people behind the names listed on the two honours boards displayed in Bildeston Health Centre? 'Medical men of Bildeston from the 16th to the 18th centuries' looks at the first ten doctors, some of whom were also apothecaries so could dispense medicines that they recommended. When Thomas Hill died in 1704, his closet contained drugs, physic mortars, weights and scales, an old still and a book about the medical powers of herbs. With no intention of serving pints, one doctor owned the Crown Inn, while Bildeston Health Centre now stands in what had formerly been part of the grounds once owned by two of them.

I am pleased to say that, together with donations, sales of *BHQ* Issue 28 raised £128 for the British Legion Poppy Appeal. It was a full-colour magazine that remembered the men of Bildeston and Wattisham who lost their lives in the Great War. There are just a few a few copies remaining and if sold, I will pass on those funds too. In the present issue, 'Lest we forget' records the events in Market Place on Sunday 11 November 2018 when many people attended the Remembrance Service. It was pleasing to see that traffic was unofficially stopped on the main road while eleven o'clock was being struck by the bell in the Clock Tower.

Since *BHQ* began in 2011, the cover price has been maintained but now, it is £4. With mobility problems, I do not get out very often and so I can focus all my time on local history research, a very absorbing hobby. I do not make any profit and just about cover costs of printing and sales in local shops. I hope that you feel *BHQ* is worth the extra with lots more interesting tales to come. However, do you have a subject in Bildeston's past that you would like investigated? Do let me know.

Recipe of the Month Cherry Bakewell Loaf

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients - serves 8 - 10

250g softened butter

250g caster sugar

4 large eggs

½ tsp almond extract

150g self raising flour may be [GF]

75g ground almonds

FOR THE STREUSEL

50g melted butter

50g light brown soft sugar

75g self raising flour may be [GF]

25g flaked almonds

200g glace cherries

FOR THE ICING

175g icing sugar

1 tbsp flaked almonds toasted



Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180C gas mark grease and line the base and sides of a 900g loaf tin, allowing it to come 5cm above the top of the tin.
- 2. Beat the butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
- 3. In a small jug beat the eggs with the almond extract. Add the egg mixture, flour and ground almonds to the butter and beat until smooth.
- 4. Turn into the tin and bake for 55 minutes.
- 5. Mix the butter, sugar, flour and flaked almonds for the streusel.
- 6. Remove the cake from the oven and sprinkle the streusel in lumps on top, then scatter over the cherries .
- 7.Return the cake to the oven for 15-20 more minutes until a skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean. When cooled, remove paper lining.
- 8. Mix the icing sugar with 1½ tbsp water to make a thick consistency. Pour over the cake, sprinkle on the almonds and leave to set.



C134/18/19 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

District Councillor Creffield reported upon the availability of high-speed broadband locally at a reasonable cost.

C136/18/19 COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

County Councillor Lindsay reported upon the following matters:
