ED'S COMMENT

Long ago, when at school, analysing poetry about the legend of King Arthur by Alfred Lord Tennyson we came across the line:

'Mix'd with the knightly growth that fringed his lips.'
Having always been someone who sees the funny side of life I suggested that Ten-

nyson was having a little joke about King Arthur's 'Knightly growth', his moustache growing over night! No, said the teacher firmly and very seriously, it means he is a man of rank, a knight. But couldn't Lord Tennyson be having a little laugh? No, definitley not, said the teacher, as if he knew Tennyson personally. What the lesson demonstrated, though, was how we all see the world through the lens of our own personality, our beliefs and opinions. It also showed how you can use the same piece of evidence and interpret it in many different ways to suit those opinions. It's the same with the recent elections and all the stuff we have endured about Brexit for the past 3 years. Politicians, pundits and people everywhere view the situation through their own eyes and layer upon each event their own firmly held opinion to prove their arguement. To the point where the same piece of evidence ends up with entirely different interpretations. For instance, it is said by some the elections were an example of the 'leavers' punishing Westminster politicians for not delivering Brexit. But some say it was the 'remainers' punishing Westminster politicians for not listening to the demands for another 'people's vote'. Others argue it was the people demonstrating their frustration with the overpowering two main party system, both of whom too wrapped up in their own internal wranglings.

Perhaps the most telling piece of evidence about how so many people feel about the way parliament in general, and the two main political parties in particular, have behaved, is in the record number of deliberately spoiled papers, and the clear messages those spoiled papers contained. From the usual hundreds, the council election saw the number rise into the thousands, and all across the country! Voters took the opportunity to get their feelings across and the messages reflected both camps of 'leavers' and 'remainers'. Mind you, this might have something to do with the fact that a social media site called *hashtag Spoil Your Ballot* was set up, and many people are more influenced by social media nowadays then anything else. I couldn't even find the sign for 'hashtag' on my keyboard!!

The sad fact is that we have got ourselves into a situation where there can be no winners. To have voted to leave in the referendum and then witness a total paralysis by political masters to implement that result and cast doubts about a democratic process they initiated in the first place is bad enough. But to dangle the notion of another referendum, disguised as a 'people's vote' serves to widen the gulf between the sides and makes even more challenging the desperate need to bring the country together, restore some pride in being British and resolve the issue of our place in Europe. Because whatever happens in the near future, whatever is finally decided about the withdrawal agreement, we still belong geographically to Europe.

COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER

Bees are active and starting to collect nectar and pollen on these warmer days. Bees of all varieties live on nectar and pollen. Without bees, pollination would be difficult and time consuming - it is estimated that one-third of the human food supply depends on insect pollination. Bees have a long, straw-like tongue called a probiscus that allows them to drink the nectar from deep within blossoms. Bees are also equipped with two wings, two antennae, and three segmented body parts (the head, the thorax, and the abdomen). Honeybees are social insects that live in colonies. The hive population consists of a single

queen, a few hundred drones, and thousands of worker bees. The honeybees in Bildeston are almost all from locally kept hives and forage for nectar and pollen from flowers in our gardens and fields. They use the nectar collected to create our favourite sweet treat honey! When carrying the nectar back to the hive, their bodies break down the complex sucrose of the nectar into two simple sugars, fructose and glucose. Tucking it neatly into a honeycomb cell, the bees then beat their wings furiously over top of this syrupy sweet liquid to fan out the moisture and thicken the substance. When it is complete, the bees cap that cell with beeswax, sealing the perfected honey for consumption later. Depending on the time of year, between 95-100% of a colony is made up of worker bees. These do everything in the hive from feeding the young to housecleaning, guard duty and foraging. The job they do is partially dependent on the age of the bee. The first job every new worker has is cleaning duty. As the worker ages, she moves into different roles, the last job is a forager, collecting resources for the colony. Prior to becoming a forager, she'll walk out, climb up the outside of the hive, stretch her wings and take her very first flight, known as an orientation flight. These are a normal event in every bee's life, and during the spring and summer, they happen almost every day, thousands of them all taking their virgin flight together at the same time, typically the warmest part of the afternoon.

Male bees are called drones. Their job is to mate with queen bees. If they do, they die immediately afterwards. If they do not mate, they can live up to 90 days (twice as long as a worker bee!) Drones have big round bodies and large eyes and are incapable of stinging. Honeybees make their own special wax (beeswax), which they use to create perfect little hexagons inside their home. These little cubbyholes are called cells, and in them, the bees store everything from eggs, to pollen, to honey. To seal their hive and to protect against diseases, the bees make a substance called propolis a combination of beeswax, honey, and tree resins. It is a anti-bacterial, anti-fungal, and anti-viral. It disinfects and protects their hive. With such a large population all working together, some great communication skills are needed. Bees do their talking in two ways - by scent and by dancing. When a honeybee is warning her sisters about an intruder, or if all the ladies in the hive are particularly happy, honeybees have the ability to release a special hormonal scent called pheromones. The bees can detect these scents and interpret their message. A happy bee pheromone smells suspiciously like lemons, and a warning-smell has a banana-like scent. Sometimes you may find an exhausted bee thats become trapped inside your house and has worn itself out flying against the window desperately trying to find a way out. Put a small quantity of honey in front of it, it will instantly recognise and start to eat. Within minutes its strength will have returned, open the window and away she goes back to her hive. 




On May 9th we presented our cheque for £514 to Ann Morley from SARS. What a fantastic achievement for our small club to



Every Tuesday. They all leave at 6.45pm from the Market Square, back about 8pm. There are two groups of riders.



BILDESTON'S WHO'S WHO

This month I met up in the village coffee shop with Stuart Miller, a retired dentist. Stuart was born in Gloucestershire in 1944, where his parents had moved due to the relocation of the Hoffman Bearing's Chelmsford factory during WW2, away from the risk of German bombing. Stuart attended Colchester Royal Grammar School and after finishing A levels got a place to study dentistry at Durham University. Stuart was sponsored by the Army and qualified in 1967, also the year he married Christine. Stuart became a dental officer in the Royal Army Dental Corps, which entailed providing dental treatment for soldiers in the field as well as in the barracks, and when abroad for their families as well.

Like all service families, Stuart and Christine moved around a lot but always enjoyed the variety of life in the Army, but the downsides include the disruption of any career progression for wives. Christine trained as a zoologist but the regular moves made that hard to follow. She taught biology and science to A level standard whenever they were in the UK. Stuart was lucky enough to be able to practice clinically in lots of countries including Germany, Northern Ireland, Hong Kong, Nepal, USA, Thailand and the Falkland Isles to name a few, Stuart treasures many memories from those exotic places. Stuart has lots of tales about his time in the Army, one of them he remembers was a journey to the Falkland Isles which began in Brize Norton. The plane took off, flying at a very low level for around thirty miles, all on board were wondering why they were flying so low, apparently there had been an IRA warning, so they had to avoid the risk of missiles! They arrived in the Ascension Isles to transfer onto a Hercules fitted out as a flying fuel tank. When almost ready to take off, the plane suddenly stopped and the Air Load Master ran through the plane shouting 'everybody out, there is a fire onboard'! Another plane was found, a noisy Hercules, in which earmuffs had to worn to help deaden the sound, but after many hours, the aircraft had to turn back to Ascension Island as the weather in Port Stanley was too bad to land. The island didn't have nice clean dental surgeries, so he had to improvise a treatment room wherever he could, a school, a farm kitchen or someone's bathroom. Stuart also did some voluntary work in Hong Kong, travelling to remote areas on a little boat with his dentistry kit. The locals would line up waiting for their treatment, watching eagerly to see how the person in front of the queue got on, if they were fine, the rest of the people would wait for their turn!

Stuart retired from the Army in 1995, went into private practice for five years in Chelmsford before fully retiring at the age of sixty. He lived in Suffolk but ended up in Bildeston four years ago. Stuart is involved with managing the Kings Pightle nature reserve, has acquired an allotment, is a keen gardener and likes dabbling in art. Stuart's main hobby for many years has been sailing, both in the forces and at the Royal Harwich Yacht Club at Woolverstone. Stuart and Christine love Bildeston, a wonderfully welcoming community.

Bildeston Bookworms



Salutations Bildeston. We are a relatively new book group full of members from Bildeston and close by.

We began life as a question. I moved to the village and asked, via Facebook, whether there was a book club. Having left my old club I was missing the friendship and mental stimulation and found myself very excited when several people responded saying that they would be interested in starting one. From that one question our group was formed and has now been meeting since September of last year.

It was suggested that we share the books we have read and our discussions, with others in the village via the Bugle So here is our first attempt.

Our first book was 'The Enchanted April' by Elizabeth von Arnim. Written in 1922. It was inspired by a month-long holiday to the Italian Riviera. It tells the story of four very different women in 1920s England who leave their rainy, grey homes to go on holiday to Italy. Rose Arbuthnot, an extremely devout woman, whose husband writes books she does not approve of and Lotty Wilkins, a young housewife in her 20s who is involved in a miserable marriage with her miserly lawyer husband, have never spoken, but begin chatting after reading a newspaper advert for a small castle in the Mediterranean to be let furnished for a month in April. To make it more affordable they extend the booking and so are joined by the cantankerous Mrs Fisher, a much older woman who harps on about her life with her father and her literary connections from her youth and the beautiful but remote Lady Caroline Dester, a 28 year old socialite who is such a beauty that she enchants everyone she meets.

The book follows the women through the holiday as they begin to get to know each other, exploring the development of their characters, their strengths and weaknesses and how they interact, not only with each other, but with the locals and a number of visitors. They leave the castle changed. Was it the magic of Italy in April, or just escaping from their lives and having the chance to reassess? Or maybe it was just living with each other and exploring life from another perspective. The book ends as they leave the castle having rediscovered hope and love.

Did we enjoy the book? Well, as one would expect, it was mixed. It is certainly an easy read, with some amazing descriptions of the surrounding countryside and the castle gardens. The characters are easily understood and you feel that you get to know them quite well, always a bonus in my book (excuse the pun!).

Why not read it for yourself and make up your own mind? The fun of book clubs is that you get to read books you would not normally choose, discovering new authors and sometime genres.

We hope this inspires some of you to consider this book as your next read.

Until our next meet. Read, be inspired and lose yourself in a good book.

Recipe of the Month Asparagus Mimosa

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients

It is the short Asparagus Season so enjoy this wonderful seasonal vegetable as much as you can. The combination of the roasted asparagus and the egg on top finished with the sweet citrusy flavours of the lemon and basil dressing is so delicious. The eggs and dressing can be prepared the day before, so it is quite an easy starter to pull together.

Serves 4

20 asparagus spears, woody ends trimmed 1tbsp olive oil

2 hard boiled eggs

FOR THE DRESSING

Juice of 1 lemon

1tbsp finely chopped shallot
1 tbsp torn basil leaves

1tsp Dijon mustard

Freshly ground pepper

80ml olive oil



Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180c/160c fan/Gas mark 4
- 2. Toss the asparagus spears in 1 tbsp olive oil and season.
- 3. Place on a baking tray and bake for 10 minutes, or roast on a hot griddle pan over a high heat for 5 minutes, turning often until they are evenly cooked.
- 4. For the dressing, whisk the lemon juice, shallot, basil and mustard together in a small bowl and season with salt and pepper. Then add the olive oil in a slow stream whisking constantly.
- 5. Shell and halve the eggs and finely chop into another small bowl.
- 6. Toss the asparagus spears into the dressing bowl, then, divide the dressed asparagus between four plates. Spoon the remaining dressing over the asparagus and sprinkle the chopped egg on top.

On being elected, Councillor Hutchings welcomed the measures that the Parish Council was considering to change its ways of working and engage with the local community.

It was AGREED: That Councillor Lester be elected Vice-Chairman of the Parish Council for the municipal year 2019/20.

Following the appointment of Chairman and Vice Chairman, all Members of the Parish Council joined together in paying tribute to the significant and long-standing contribution that Robin Taylor had made to the Parish Council and to village life.


