However, alongside the perceived issues and the differences about living in a rural area and community, who would have it any other way? We are either here because we were born and bred in the area, or we made a conscious decision to come and live here when we could have chosen any number of other places. But we chose Bildeston. All the events and activities that go on here, and all those wonderful people who help to make them happen, confirm that was the best choice ever! COUNTRYSIDE OBSERUER

As an island nation we are blessed with stunning coastlines. Wherever you live the coast is no more then a few hours away. I recently returned by air to the Island of Lundy set in the middle of the Bristol channel about 12 miles from Bideford north Devon. Lundy is owned by the National Trust and managed by the Landmark Trust. The two charities have worked together since 1969 to restore and protect Lundy. It really is a gem of a place far removed from anything you may have experienced before. Lundy lies off the coast of North Devon, where the Atlantic Ocean meets the Bristol Channel with nothing between it

and America, a granite outcrop, three miles long and half a mile wide. In the hubbub of the modern world it is a place apart, peaceful and unspoiled. Lundy is never crowded, even in the height of summer when up to five times a week, MS Oldenburg brings visitors who stay for a few hours. At all other times those who are staying in the 23 holiday properties and the residents have the island to themselves. It's a place of wide spaces and big skies, without roads, cars or pollution, simply walking is a profound pleasure. Lundy has a milder climate than the mainland, with more sunshine and less rain. The particular character of Lundy derives from its varied terrain. On the west side, exposed to the Atlantic, there are high and rugged cliffs, on the east, sheltered from the prevailing wind, the coastline is gentler with grassy slopes, trees and many types of wild flowers. This contrast explains the rich diversity of the island's animal and plant life and its attraction to walkers, climbers and divers. People return time and again to the simple pleasures that Lundy affords; the sea is clear, the landscape spectacular, and at night, without competition from street lights, it is truly dark and the stars shine with unfamiliar brilliance. There are 23 self-catering properties, a campsite, pub, church, working farm, three lighthouses and about one thousand acres of unspoilt nature. The range of buildings in which to stay is extraordinarily diverse. There's a 13th century castle, a late Georgian gentleman's villa, a lighthouse, the isolated coastguard watchhouse of Tibbetts, a simple fisherman's chalet. Most of the buildings are constructed from the island's beautiful light-coloured granite. There are no televisions, radios or telephones and the electric supply is usually turned off between midnight and 6am, Wi Fi almost non existent. Lundy's position with the Atlantic Ocean to the west and the Bristol Channel to the east creates a unique combination of environmental conditions that have given rise to a considerable selection of habitats that in turn support a variety of rare and spectacular wildlife. The rugged cliffs of the west coast are carpeted with maritime grass species and are home to important seabird colonies including Puffins and Manx Shearwaters. At the turn of the century, the island's breeding seabird colonies were under threat from large black and brown rat populations who were predating on the nesting seabirds, their eggs and their offspring. Puffin numbers were recorded as approx. 5 in 2003 and a rat eradication programme started. In 2006 the island was declared 'rat free' and since then a steady increase in the number of puffins with a formal count of 80 in 2013. In comparison, the relatively sheltered and calm east coast boasts spectacular displays of wildflowers and provides sanctuary to migrating birds in the spring and autumn. The diversity of the wildlife observed above the waves is mirrored below the waves, with many rare and beautiful species protected in both the reef and sandbank habitats. Not been? Go, you will be enchanted. Mike Biddulph







BILDESTON'S WHO'S WHO

This month I met up with Lynne Edwards MBE, who has a passion for needle craft. Lynne is an internationally known and respected Quilter, Author and Teacher who has lived in Bildeston for 52 years but grew up in Gravesend Kent. Lynne first had an interest in needlecraft when funds were short, so she started making her own dresses and items of clothing to keep costs down, and really enjoyed making things; Lynne even made her own wedding dress and her husband, Brian's jacket for their wedding in 1965. Lynne went on to teacher training college and started working in a school in London. She started a dress making class for her students after school, teaching her students, some as young as 10 years old, to make their own dresses, and Lynne is still in touch with some of those students today. When Lynne and Brian moved to Bildeston, she started teaching patchwork locally and also travelled to Camden to teach. Lynne has also taught at Bildeston primary school for a short while, until she started a family. Lynne would make toys for her children as money was tight and new toys were very expensive and her boys loved their homemade toys and appreciated all the hard work their mum put into them.

By chance, Lynne met a lady from Chelsworth, who suggested she should start teaching needlecraft at Chelsworth village hall to earn some extra money, and to share her knowledge with other ladies. Lynne advertised in shop windows for her course on a Saturday morning and had a good bunch of ladies enrolled on the course. This was 30 years ago and still going strong! Lynne has students who come as far as Huntingdon for her weekly course; many of these ladies have become great friends with Lynne.

Lynne got a scholarship for 'Quilt teacher', and has travelled to Holland, Australia, Singapore and New Zealand to teach students. In 2008 Lynne's students proposed Lynne for a 'MBE' for services in arts and crafts, and was awarded this by Prince Charles who also has an interest in quilts, and he chatted about his collection of Welsh quilts. Prince Charles also asked Lynne if she had made the outfit she was wearing that day!

Lynne has had around 7 quilting books published, one of the well known ones being Cathedral Windows Quilts. Lynne has also written columns for 'Today's Quilter' magazine for 3 years and various other magazines. These are not the only books Lynne has had published, as in 1973 Lynne and her husband wrote the children's 'DoDo' books while Lynne was teaching at primary school.

Lynne gets her fabric from various local shops including the fabric shop in Hadleigh. Lynne seldom sells her work, using it all as part of her teaching before passing quilts on to family and friends. Lynne is still teaching, and is off to Nottingham followed by Cornwall and on to Bristol this month.

Good day Bildeston. I hope I find you enjoying the summer and maybe the chance to read a little more as this is traditionally a time for holidays, which inevitably poses the question, 'What should I take to read?'

I am never without a book, whether the Bookworms choice, or my own and often feel bereft when a book ends. How many of you, I wonder, race through a book you are completely engrossed in and then try to put off getting to the end as you don't want the book to finish?

I know we can re-read, but sometimes the 'I wonder where this is going?' has gone and let's be honest here, there are just so many books to read, that do any of us have time to re visit those we would like?

Our next choice is the story of a young girl in 1939. A time of change, fear, violence and struggle, yet the novel, 'The Book Thief' by Markus Zusak, is often an inspiring story. It looks at this horrific period in our history from the German viewpoint, a real change as we are so accustomed to the British or American stance.

After the death of her young brother and as she moves into a foster home, Liesel begins to not only steal, but to learn to read books and to discover the joy that brings. To develop a love for words and to realise their power, both positive and negative.

This is a time of great danger for all in Germany and when Liesel's foster parents hide a Jew in the basement it brings life changing events to them all and their neighbours.

One of the strangest twists in this book is that it is narrated by Death! A very busy entity and one with a surprising view of humans.

The book is at times dark and sad, but at the same time light and with a view to the future. A surprisingly easy read, that most of us really enjoyed. It certainly led to some interesting conversations as the themes of the Holocaust, love, hate and many other were heatedly discussed.

Initially I had thought this a book for older teenagers, not a reason to avoid it but to wonder at the maturity of the writing, however, this is certainly a book for everyone as we look at humanity in all it's guises and it does make you think that maybe history will/is repeating itself.

Try it for yourselves and as Liesel says, "I have hated words and I have loved them, and I hope I have made them right."

Recipe of the Month Chilli and Tomato Jam

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients

This sweet and spicy preserve is a great way of using up the glut of ripe tomatoes, and is perfect with strong, hard cheeses.

900g Jam sugar

300ml Red Wine Vinegar

- 1.5kg Ripe Tomatoes, peeled and chopped roughly
- 4-6 Red Chillies, halved, seeds removed and finely sliced
- 6 Garlic cloves

1tsp Salt

Pinch of Ground Cloves

Method

- 1 Put the sugar and vinegar in a large preserving pan and stir over a medium-low heat until sugar is dissolved.
- 2 Stir in all the ingredients and bring to a vigorous boil.
- 3 Cook for 15 minutes until setting point is reached and not sticking to the bottom of the pan.
- 4 Remove from heat and leave to stand for 5 minutes. Remove any scum.
- 5 Pour into hot sterilised jars and seal with vinegar proof lids.

The Jam will keep for around six months unopened in a cool dark place. Once opened, store in the fridge and use within 10 days.

PRESERVING KNOW HOW

Sterilise Jars in the dishwasher on its hottest cycle or wash in hot soapy water and put them in the oven for 20 minutes at 150C 130 fan gas mark 2


To test for setting point, pop a few saucers in the freezer to chill before you start. Once you think it is ready to test, drop a teaspoon of the mixture onto the saucer and leave for a minute.

Push with your finger, if it wrinkles it's set. If it doesn't, keep on boiling and retesting every couple of minutes.

To seal preserves, put a waxed disc, wax side down on top while the jam is hot. Cover with a cellophane disc and secure with an elastic band or seal with a sterilised screw on lid.

About five years ago my father-in-law was the victim of a scam artist who fleeced him out of £5,000. Once he realised, he was devastated and we were able to work with his bank to get some of the money back. We thought it was all in the past but in the last six months he's received numerous calls, letters and texts from what look like other scammers. We want to try and keep him safe as his memory isn't the best, what can we do?

Unfortunately, falling victim to a scam once can increase exposure to further scams. Citizens Advice has found that, once someone has responded to a scam, their personal details can sometimes be sold onto other criminals. This then opens the door to more scam mail, emails, phone calls or home visits.

If you recognise a pattern of unsolicited calls, talk to your father-in-law's telephone provider and see if you can get these numbers blocked or if you can get something called a 'standalone call blocker.' If not, register your father-in-law's number with the Telephone Preference Service who can help you to handle unwanted marketing calls.

If your father-in-law is receiving texts it's important that he never replies, as sometimes there can be costly hidden charges. He can report the texts to his mobile phone provider who will be able to block the number. If he's already been stung and call cost information wasn't given, he should report it to Phone-pay Plus.

Mail scammers can often impersonate banks, the local council, or other established and legitimate organisations. You should advise your father-in-law against responding unless he's sure it's legitimate and was expecting a letter. If in doubt he should contact the organisation directly to check the letter's legitimacy. He should be careful to not just ring up the number on the letter as it could be a bogus call centre.

In addition, to safeguard your father-on-law from unwanted marketing material or junk mail, register his name and address for free with the Mailing Preference Service which will take his name off some mailing lists.

Doorstep scammers can often be intimidating, and unfortunately they commonly target older and more vulnerable people. Your father shouldn't be embarrassed turning people away and shouldn't let them in unless he's expecting them. If someone comes to the door saying they are from one of his utility companies for example, he should ask to check their credentials. If in doubt, he should phone the company they represent or check online, but once again make sure to not just use the contact details they provide.

Bildeston has a thriving village community and Chamberlin Hall is very lucky that our trusty volunteers pitch in to bring so many activities for us all to enjoy. 
But in order to continue with our current range of activities and to expand the events on offer at the hall this year, we MUST get some more volunteers.




