ED'S COMMENT

At the same time last month, as the Bugle was thanking all those who give up their time on behalf of the village and work tirelessly to provide it with a wonderful range of facilities, some mindless miscreants broke into the bowls green behind our village hall intent on serious theft. They managed to rip off the heavy iron gates from their hinges and smash open the doors of the shed in order, presumably, to steal the equipment stored inside.

The Parish Council keep the ride on mower there, with its trailer alongside other bits and pieces such as rakes, hoes and all the equipment for the bowling green. Whoever it was, got the mower out of the shed and, perhaps, were in the process of getting it to the car park to their van and trailer and drive off. For some reason that's as far as they got, thankfully. Even so, it has cost our Chamberlin Hall Management Committee considerable time and some expense to put matters right. By the following day the gates had been mended and soldered on to their hinges, new padlocks purchased, steel bars fixed to strengthen and repair the splintered shed door and the whole matter reported to the police.

A sad sign of our times was the fact that the police were less than interested. As nothing was taken the incident slips down the priority list of an over stretched force and the opportunity to collect any forensic evidence to link to any other criminal damage in the area lost. If, in their frustration, the would-be thieves drove away and found a different place to break into and steal someone's expensive garden equipment, the victims have our sympathies and shared anger. This is because these types of break-ins are rarely isolated. Criminal gangs often target an area seeking specific high end equipment to sell on. One incident may well be a low priority, but several together constitute a pattern which could be investigated and, with evidence gathered, go towards convictions. But no officer visited to investigate.

The latest report from the Office of National Statistics declares a 3% decrease in police recorded theft offences (to 422,870 offences). However, it does make one wonder how accurate those figures are when certain categories of theft, or cases deemed to be low priority, are neither acknowledged nor investigated by the police.

This is worrying because theft is the biggest category of crime recorded by any police force, but with the lowest recorded success rate for convictions. For example in Suffolk the charge rate for 'Other theft offences' was just 2.4% out of 4,846 recorded incidents. Charge rate is the total number of charges and summonses as a proportion of total police-recorded offences for the year ending March 2018. Maybe it is not so surprising that criminals feel almost 'conviction proof' as they drive around the county looking for easy pickings from law abiding citizens and communities. The odds are with them not only to not get caught, but not even charged or eventually convicted! The fact is fewer than one in 100 thefts in some police force areas are being solved. While the number of thefts from people have doubled to 100,000 fuelled by the boom in mobile phones, the proportion where the offender was caught and charged have halved since 2014/15.

This has promped criticism of police priorities, and now Chamberlin Hall has direct experience of that policy. OK, nothing was taken. We were lucky, but we might not be so lucky next time. We have one of the best village halls in the county in terms of size, construction and facilities. It is the most valuable village asset Bildeston Parish Council entrust to the Board of Trustees to manage. Perhaps the time has come to help fund strengthening security arrangements for our hall. But what a sad indictment of our times, just like stealing lead from Church roofs, that we have to protect our village halls in a more robust way.



COUNTRYSIDE OBSERVER

Are you like me wondering where the year is going? Next Bank holiday will be Christmas! In mid July I flew with another 12 aircraft to Arras in northern France. Climbing out from Elmsett, Canary Wharf in London Docklands was clearly visible off to my right. Route was south to Clacton climbing to 4500 ft as the Thames Estuary at this point is actually wider then the channel crossing and a dunking in its frigid waters was not planned. We spent a most convivial evening in an Arras restaurant eating food as only the French can do, with the large square behind us beautifully illuminated. After a good night's sleep aided by plenty of "vin

rouge" our group explored the town centre and its gothic cathedral. Within its lobby were a number of large floor to ceiling coloured prints depicting soldiers lost in the great war of 1914-18. Incredibly given the numbers who sacrificed their lives, one poster depicted an Ernest Rush from Capel St Mary, he was killed by an exploding shell May the 28th 1916 As autumn beckons, the English countryside transforms aged 23 not far from the city. into a riot of yellow, red and orange. From September to November entire woods change the colour of their leaves, these fiery landscapes can be viewed all around our county. This is one of the nicest times of the year to put on your walking boots, warm jacket and scarf and set forth to explore our beautiful surroundings. Visit a country pub on route, seek out one with an open fireplace and get cosy as you enjoy a pint of local ale and a hearty meal. Autumn is also the time for foraging, there is so much to be had for free just waiting in and around the hedgerows. Starting with Beech nuts, which were once used to feed pigs. They are ready now and still ripening into October. Scrape off the outer brown skin to reveal the triangular seed. They can be used in a similar way to pine nuts, sprinkled on salads and risottos. Roast in the oven then place between two tea towels and rub to remove shells. Beech nuts can be slightly toxic if consumed in large quantities due to the tannins and alkaloids. Look out for pairs of three-sided nuts in bristly cases throughout October. winter alcoholic beverages try Bullace which is a wild variety of plum. On a good year, bullace fruits can literally weigh down the hedgerow, the fruits are similar to damsons and can be used to make crumbles, jams and preserves, fruit wine and fruit liqueurs (like sloe gin). Small oval fruits varied in colour but usually blue, purple or black. They tend to taste acidic until they're ripe, this is a great late season fruit as it ripens up to six weeks later than many others from October to November. Hazelnuts begin to ripen when the leaves on the trees change colour. It's a common tree in woods, hedgerows and gardens, and bears its crop of nuts also called cobnuts from late August. If you're picking hazelnuts early in the season, when they're still green, the shelled nuts make a tasty nibble to munch on while you're out walking. Collect enough and the shelled nuts can be roasted in the oven or used to make hazelnut butter. Finally look for sweet chestnut trees in woods and by the road. A Christmas classic, sweet chestnut trees were introduced to the UK by the Romans. The nuts can be baked, roasted, boiled or microwaved. Score a cross in them to stop them from exploding when they are cooked. Once cooked and peeled they can be eaten as they are, or used in desserts and stuffings. You can also candy them, puree them or store them in syrup. You'll find the best crop at the foot of large established trees. Trees start dropping nuts from late September early October, into late autumn and early winter. Autumn, the year's last loveliest smile. Mike Biddulph





From the age of sixteen Kate worked at the Hartest Crown as a waitress, she then attended West Suffolk College studying beauty therapy and achieved a NVQ level two and three in beauty therapy but chose not to pursue beauty therapy as a career. Instead Kate worked in a care home until she fell pregnant with her first child Layla. Kate moved to Bildeston in 2010 and soon after had her second child Rhys.

I asked Kate how she had become a Slimming World Consultant. 

Bildeston Bookworms

Hello again Bildeston. Well as summer begins to wane and many of us return to our everyday routines, I bring you another chat about books.

Our next choice is a book set in another time and country and it struck us all that we were looking at this from a very different perspective, now and in the world in which we live. I am sure we have all read books written a long time ago, my favourite all time book is 'Jane Eyre' by the wonderful Charlotte Bronté. A novel of darkness, mystery and of course, love. Jane's choices may seem strange to a modern woman, but she still comes across as strong and a woman that many can relate to today.

Set in C19th Charleston, South Carolina, 'The Invention of Wings' by Sue Monk Kidd is a book about women's emancipation and slavery. Using historical figures at it's heart, it traces the lives, over 35 years, of two women. One, Sarah, the daughter of a slave owner and the other the slave, Hetty, 'given' to her as a birthday present when she was 11.

Another book written in alternating chapters, one for each character. In this way, Kidd compares and contrasts the lifestyles, struggles and accomplishment of the two main characters.

It brings to light the way that many women of the time were hemmed in by convention and as Sarah breaks away, the consequences this had for her and her family. Running parallel is the life of Hetty held back by the colour of her skin. Both strive for lives of their own forming a very complex relationship, both trying to fly on their newly found wings.

Inspired by the real Sarah Grimke and her sister, both early pioneers in the abolition of slavery and women's rights movements, the book portrays life in an easy to read way. The author does not make them close friends, but this adds to the 'real' feel of the novel

Most of our group found it a real page turner, even though there were times when we lacked sympathy for the characters. It gives a clear insight into the life of slaves, as well as the struggles going on regarding the liberation and empowerment of both women in general and slaves. The historical content was fascinating, even dealing with some issues we were unaware of.

Why not read it for yourselves? A book that as Oprah Winfrey says, 'will resonate with anyone who has ever struggled to find her power and her voice'.

Recipe of the Month Courgette and Pesto Tart

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients

This recipe could be Vegan friendly if you used parmesan free pesto Flour for dusting 300g ready- made short crust pastry 2 medium eggs and 1 egg yolk 150 ml double cream 3 tbsp ready-made basil pesto 3 medium courgettes

Fresh basil leaves to serve.



Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 200C, 180C fan, or gas mark 6
- 2. On a lightly floured surface, roll out the pastry to line a base and sides of a 33cm x 10 cm rectangular loose bottomed tart tin
- 3. Leave pastry overhanging but prick the base with a fork then chill for 20 minutes
- 4. Line the pastry with baking parchment and fill with baking beans. Bake for 25 minutes until the sides are crisp. Remove the baking beans and parchment and return to the oven for 5 minutes until lightly golden
- 5. Trim off excess pastry and reduce oven temp to 180C 160C fan gas mark 4
- 6. In a large jug whisk the eggs, extra yolk, cream and 1 tbsp pesto and season
- 7. Peel the courgettes into ribbons, stopping when you reach the seedy middle [discard this] then toss in a bowl with the remaining pesto to coat well.
- 8. With 5 ribbons on top of each other, roll the bundle in to a spiral shape. Repeat with the rest.
- 9. Pour the egg mixture into the base of the tart tin and gently set the spirals in it slightly apart.
- 10. Bake for about 40 minutes until set, serve warm garnished with the basil leaves.

C56/17/18 DISPENSATIONS IN RESPECT OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS

There were none.

C57/19/20

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

It was AGREED: That the minutes of the Annual Meeting held on 10th June, 2019 be signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

C58/19/20 PUBLIC SESSION

There were no items raised.

C59/19/20 SPORTSFIELD MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Councillor Hutchings reported that it was pleasing to see that the Sportsfield Management Committee now comprised thirteen people. Councillor Chapman reported that a range of works were required to the Sportsfield Pavilion which the Committee wished to see undertaken as soon as possible. She enquired about what funds were available to support the Committee. Councillor Guttridge suggested that Community Infrastructure Levy Funding could be used. The Clerk also confirmed that the Parish Council held £5,000 from the Henry Morphew bequest for the Sportsfield.

It was AGREED:

- a. That the sum of $\mathfrak{L}5,000$ be released from the Sportsfield Reserve and transferred to the Sportsfield Management Committee;
- b. That £1,450 be allocated from the Community Infrastructure Levy Reserve to fund the installation of security shutters and hand dryers at the Sportsfield pavilion; and
- c. That further funding be approved in principle for the replacement of the boiler, subject to the cost of supply and installation being submitted to the next meeting.

C60/19/20 BABERGH & MID SUFFOLK JOINT LOCAL PLAN

Councillor Guttridge had circulated a draft response to the consultation on the draft Babergh & Mid Suffolk Joint Local Plan which was considered by Members of the Parish Council. There was a discussion about various aspects of the Plan and its implications for the village. In particular, concerns were expressed about the land allocation for housing off Wattisham Road.

It was AGREED: That Councillor Guttridge finalises the response, reflecting the views expressed at the meeting, and the Clerk submits it to Babergh District Council.



C61/19/20 FORTHCOMING EVENTS

The Chair confirmed that he had ordered wreaths on behalf of the Parish Council. The Clerk would ask the Maintenance Operative to sweep up and weed the Market Square a week before the event. Councillor Lester reported that it was customary for the local vicar to meet with a small committee of interested parties to make arrangements for Remembrance. Councillor Hutchings offered his assistance in the run up to Remembrance Sunday.

It was AGREED: That £100 be donated to the Royal British Legion, to be actioned by the Clerk in accordance with normal practice.

The action plan for Christmas Carols in the Market Square was presented by the Clerk and roles and responsibilities assigned.

It was AGREED: That Christmas Carols in the Market Square be held on Sunday, 8th December, 2019 at 4.00pm and that the updated action plan be circulated by the Clerk.

Councillor Chapman offered to set up a WhatsApp group for the Parish Council to assist with communications for events and other activities.

C62/19/20 COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Councillor Lindsay reported upon the following matters:

- Bus subsidy cuts: The 112 Hadleigh to Sudbury service via Bildeston and 461/462 service between Hadleigh and Stowmarket had been reprieved until March 2020. Monks Eleigh Parish Council were organising a working party to examine funding solutions for the 112 service and Elmsett Parish Council were organising a meeting with regard to the 461/462 route. It was noted that Councillor Tuck was representing the Parish Council in respect of local liaison.
- 20mph speed limit: The Cabinet Member for Highways and a Senior Highways Officer would assess applications. The local County Councillor could appeal any refusal.
- Councillor Guttridge would update the map to show the proposed location for the 20mph sign on Wattisham Road. The County Council would identify the buffer zones between the 60mph and 20mph zones. Councillor Lindsay would then liaise with the Highways Officer confirming his support for the proposal copying in Councillors Powell and Guttridge.
- There was a discussion about the apparent lack of concern shown by County Highways about the impact of the proposed 75 residential dwellings on land to the north east of Brooksfield off Wattisham Road. Councillor Guttridge referred to the responses received from Babergh District Council and Suffolk County Council to the Freedom of Information requests submitted by the Parish Council. It was noted that further information had been requested seeking to clarify the extent of the liaison between the two bodies before the site was allocated within the Joint Local Plan.

County Councillor Lindsay was asked to invite County Council officers to carry out a site visit of the Wattisham Road/High Street, as it appeared that it was desktop research only that had been used to determine the site allocation within the Local Plan.

C63/19/20 PARISH PRIORITY SETTING

Further to Minute C47/19/20, the feedback received by the Community Engagement Working Group was discussed and some suggestions for community projects raised.

It was AGREED: That a workshop be held on Monday, 30th September, 2019 at 7.00pm (venue to be confirmed) to be facilitated by Councillor Sarah Leigh-Hunt to consider priority setting for the Parish Council for the next four years and that the Community Development Worker be invited to attend.

C64/19/20 VILLAGE AMENITIES

Further to Minute C42/19/20, an update was given on steps being taken to address a breach of the cemetery regulations.

Councillor Lester reported that the Parish Church was applying to close the churchyard to new burials.

Councillor Lester said that the hedges at the cemetery required trimming at the end of the growing season and the Clerk was asked to arrange this with the Maintenance Coordinator. He added that the wildflower area also required attention.

Councillor Hutchings indicated that a new pedestrian mower was required for the bowls green. An upgrade to the sound system was also required, a proposal for which, would be presented to the next meeting.

It was AGREED: That £3000 be drawn from the Margaret Bishop Chamberlin Hall Fund for the pedestrian mower on the supply of an invoice to the Clerk.

C65/19/20 CLERK'S REPORT

There were no specific items of report.

C66/19/20 HR MATTERS

The Clerk proposed that the Parish Council should have its HR policies, procedures and contracts of employment for staff and training and health and safety records reviewed by an external HR adviser to safeguard the position of Councillors in their position as employer. The Clerk confirmed that the insurance policy included Employer's Liability cover but this would not cover the Parish Council in every set of circumstances.

It was AGREED: That the Clerk engages the services of an HR adviser to review and update the Parish Council's policies and procedures.

C67/19/20 VILLAGE WEBSITE AND ICT MATTERS

The Clerk reported upon the requirements of the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No.2) Accessibility Regulations 2018 and the need to ensure that the website was accessible. There was a discussion about the provision of a new Village website.

It was AGREED: That the Community Development Worker be requested to research clear, accessible, interesting and informative village websites incorporating the functionality required by the Parish Council to fulfil its statutory/regulatory requirements in making information available to the local community.






