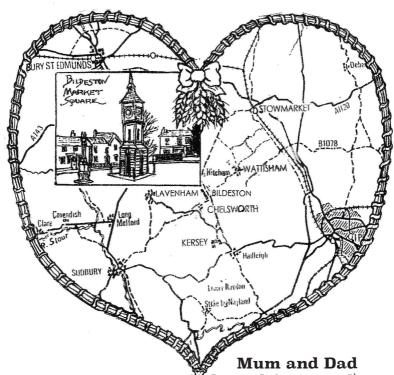

ED'S COMMENT

We have known for some time that viruses have the ability to transfer from animals to humans. That transfer even has a technical name: 'zoonosis' an infectious disease that is transmitted between species from animals to humans (or from humans to animals). We've known because we have lived with rabies for a very long time, thankfully now a rare but very serious infection of the brain and nerves. It's usually caught from the bite or scratch of an infected animal, most often a dog. In recent memory is the terrible impact of mad cow disease and a human version of mad cow disease called Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (vCJD) which was believed to be caused by eating beef products contaminated with central nervous system tissue, such as brain and spinal cord, from cattle infected with mad cow disease. We still remembern the terrible outcome of the recent Foot and Mouth disease which resulted in millions of animals being slaughtered.

A change in our laws concerning the transportation of live stock and pets, the strict identification of all animal livestock destined for the food chain, a massive vaccination programme on some livestock and, controversially sometimes the culling of wildlife deemed to carry diseases thought to be transferred such as TB through badgers, has helped to control these diseases in this country. So it is understandable that we should be incredulous that such strict measures to help protect humans and animals is not applied in the same way elsewhere. Not just that such basic hygiene and welfare standards are not expected or enforced, but changes are not made even after an outbreak with terrible consequences. For example the severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) outbreak in 2002 and 2003 led to more than 8,000 infections worldwide and killed close to 10% of those infected. It was caused by a coronavirus that made a species jump from bats to humans through the host of farmed civet cats bred for human consumption in China, including the area around Wuhan. Yet 20 years later nearly 20,000 wildlife farms raising species including peacocks, civet cats, porcupines, snakes, ostriches, wild geese and boar have only now been shut down across China in the wake of this current coronavirus, in a move that has exposed the sheer size of the industry. Until a few weeks ago wildlife farming was still being promoted by the Chinese government as a way for rural Chinese people to earn money. But the Covid-19 outbreak, which has now led to around 112,000 deaths and 2 million known infections, is thought to have originated in wildlife sold at a market again in Wuhan in early December. Much of the meat from the wildlife trade is sold for medicine and other uses, through online sites or to "wet markets" like the one where the Covid-19 outbreak is thought to have started in Wuhan. The timing could not have been worse. Just as the disease began to be noticed Chinese people began their visits to meet up with families for the Chinese New Year, as well as some going to China for the celebrations from countries across the globe, to return a few days later with an unwanted guest deep within their bodies.

The ease with which we can travel huge distances around the world has brought us face to face with the stark reality of how simple it is in the 21st century for a pandemic to spread. This could have been avoided. Respect for a nation's historic cultural traditions is important, so it is difficult to criticise the Chinese for engaging in alternative medicinal practices that have been going on for centuries. But it will be important to see what response they now make to the selling of wildlife in 'wet markets'. The Chinese sent a large contingent of medical staff and supplies to Italy to help. They continue to supply PPE supplies to us. But they do need to get their own house in order. When this is over there are many questions to ask and answer.

CHAMBERLIN HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE RESPONSE TO THE CORONAVIRUS SITUATION.

Chamberlin Hall Management Committee has taken the decision to cancel events at Chamberlin Hall for the next month or so involving large numbers of people gathering together. 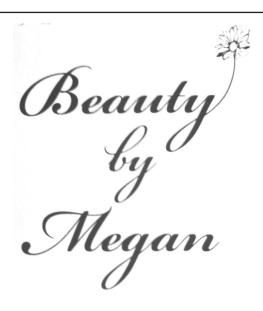

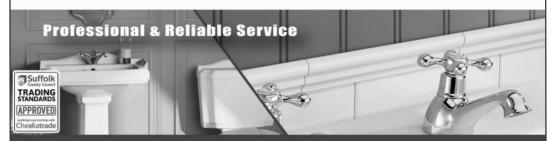

Our operating hours are Mon-Sat 8am-6pm and Sun 9am-2pm.

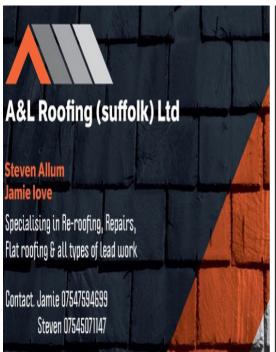

BILDESTON'S WHO'S WHO

Before the lockdown, I met up with Henry Gold who was born in Windsor and brought up in Buckinghamshire. He followed his father and uncles to Eton and after National Service as an infantry officer, serving in Germany, Malta and Cyprus (during the EOKA emergency) he trained to become a chartered accountant, qualifying in 1962. Henry wanted to go into the family international wine and spirits group founded in the mid 1800's (now part of Diageo), but Henry's uncle, vice chairman at the time, recommended that he first obtain a qualification and introduced him to a City of London accountancy. Henry was invited to become a partner in 1967 and stayed on in the firm. This was fortunate because years later the family drinks business was taken over and all the family members were removed. Henry first married in 1966 and moved to East Anglia. His interest in music led him to conduct the Kelvedon Singers in the late 1970's. Henry and his wife had two children. Henry's son is a freelance documentary photographer and his daughter is a management consultant. Henry's work as an accountant included fraud investigation. His biggest case was of a public company whose misdemeanours took Henry in 1970 to the Bahamas, Florida and California, with two Scotland Yard detectives. In 1978 Henry moved to the Royal Dutch/Shell Group. Henry had been the first Technical and Training partner in his firm and the Shell Group job was to research these and develop responses to them. Henry worked with a number of institutions; the CBI, the International Chamber of Commerce, the EU and the UN among them. Henry went on to finance director jobs within the Shell Group and retired as deputy controller of the world wide group at the age of 55.

Henry was then appointed Technical Director of the Institute of Charted Accountants. The new job involved Henry in collaboration with the UK Accounting Standards board, the International Accounting Standards Committee and the U.S. Financial Accounting Board. Henry finally retired in 1994 and since then he has served on a government committee advising on new company law, has been Master of the City Livery Company of Charted Accountants, Treasurer of the Suffolk Preservation Society for 9 years, and more locally, of Keep Bildeston Beautiful Committee, following on from his move to Bildeston in 2003, while auditing the accounts of a small variety of clubs and societies in the area.

Henry was divorced in 1998 and married Susan, who sadly died in 2014. At that time Henry hardly knew Christina, a Bildeston resident, but they married in 2017. He is the Treasurer of the Lavenham Literary Festival. Two of his hobbies were salmon fishing and skiing. For a time Henry was on the Council of the Ski Club of Great Britain. Henry enjoys cricket and has been a member for nearly sixty years of the MCC. Henry continues to enjoy music and quite often is the organist in the Bildeston benefice churches. Henry plays cello in the Bury Friendly Orchestra and for over 20 years the Bildeston annual carol concert. Henry said he particularly likes Bildeston for the intersting variety of its inhabitants.

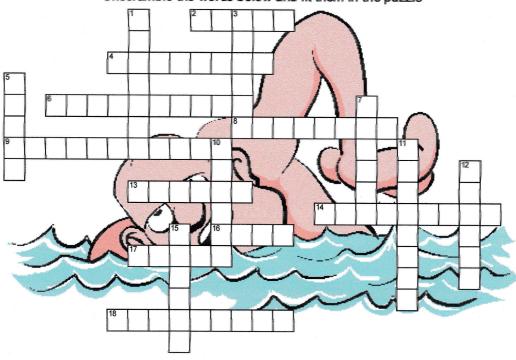

Bildeston Bookworms



Hello Bildeston. I am sorry that I have been remiss in writing my reviews of late, but as with all of us at times, life got in the way. However, I am back and in these times of isolation, reaching out is even more important.

I think many of us are wondering how we will fill the extra 'at home' time. Whilst the World around us feels scary and dark a good book can act as an escape. It is also a time to rediscover our love of books, that many of us may have lost in the humdrum of everyday living. For some, it may be the start of an amazing adventure with books that we have never considered before. A time for us to share books with our children, even more important whilst they are house bound and we all struggle to find our new normal.

Our next read is described as a tale of passion and pianos in 1880s France and Russia. The main protagonist travels from fin-de-siècle in Scotland, to France to work as piano tuner trying to escape his past and his tyrannical father. In Paris, he meets a famous pianist which in turn sparks an obsessive love affair with a beautiful Russian soprano, Lika Blum. Moving from Paris to St Petersburg to Edinburgh and back again, Brodie's love for Lika and its dangerous consequences pursue him around Europe.

'Love is Blind' by William Boyd, is an interesting read, but, and there is often a 'but', the main character, Brodie, is a little dull. Lika isn't particularly 'likable' She is mainly seen through his eyes, an object of desire and mystery. The title says it all, Brodie sees what he wants to see, but maybe many of us do, willing to forgive and forget, when others say this is a foolish road to travel.

Generally, the book was not liked. Described by one member as a litary of tragedy. Despite all this, there were sparks to make it worth a look. Fabulous in-depth descriptions, evocative of a time long gone, where Europe was the domain of the rich and titled.

I have just watched an interesting interview with Stephen Fry talking about the changes to our lives. He suggests that we need to redefine our sense of time. Time has altered and we now have more time to do things. More time to read, to chat about what we have read, to share what we have read with others.

We live in a time of technology and never before has it been more important to stay connected via whatever means we have available in our homes. To realise that for the first time in the World's history we are all in this together.

Our book club will obviously not be meeting in person, but already we have plans for a virtual meet. We are reading our next book and have ways to choose and read the one after that. Books and the worlds they show us may prove to be one of our saving graces.

And remember, as J.K. Rowling says, 'There's always room for a story that can transport people to another place.'

This is a free service to those who feel that they need help in the local community. Shaun is compiling a growing list of volunteers who have come forward to help others within the local community.

Ultimately, it would be useful if a network of volunteers could be established right across the village, encompassing every home in Bildeston so that there is someone looking out for everyone. The arrangements for the volunteering scheme are evolving and could change, of course, if the government implements a lockdown. However, in the meantime, work is being undertaken to ensure that the arrangements implemented are safe for all parties – both volunteers and those self-isolating. Clearly, safe working practices alongside generous community support within the village will benefit everyone.

The scheme will operate independently of the Parish Council but the Parish Council is ready to consider financial support to help in any way it can to provide necessary resources.

Public Health England considers that the elderly and people with chronic conditions such as diabetes, heart disease and lung disease to be at higher risk from the coronavirus. Therefore, it is important that those with lower risks reach out to their higher risk neighbours and community members, and ask how they can help. We do understand that everyone will be concerned about food supplies generally, and we have been in touch with local Tesco, Asda and Sainsburys stores to find out the current situation. We understand that the supermarkets are putting out the stock, as soon as it arrives. As deliveries occur around the clock it means currently, arriving at 9am is no more of a guarantee to get pasta, rice, wipes etc than arriving at 5pm. The food retailers continue to state that there is enough for everyone and if everyone only takes what they need, (hence the new product restrictions), stores will eventually begin to fill back up to normal levels and availability will improve. The "Big Four" supermarket chains are in constant communication to ensure that they adopt consistent measures in response to unfolding events. This is to ensure that they take the majority of decisions as one such as the recent decision to close all counters and cafes within their stores. Please keep informed online of the special arrangements that have been introduced this week by stores to support the elderly, vulnerable and their carers with special shopping hours in place in some stores.

SUFFOLK LIBRARIES

Suffolk Libraries closed the county's library buildings to the public for the foreseeable future from Friday, 20th March, 2020 and the mobile library service will also be suspended. Suffolk Libraries has suspended charges for overdue books and extended reservation and return dates indefinitely, so customers do not need to worry about renewing or returning items. Suffolk Libraries is also promoting its extensive and free eLibrary services during the closure. There are around 60,000 items available including eBooks, eAudiobooks, magazines and newspapers. You can also stream music, films and documentaries. People will still be able to contact Suffolk Libraries' customer service team with any enquiries. The team are available Monday to Friday 9-5 and can be contacted at help@suffolklibraries.co.uk or by calling 01473 351249.

STOWMARKET FOOD BANK

As the virus spreads, the Stowmarket Food Bank based at the Stowmarket Community Centre, faces additional pressure with less donations and greater demand. Please could those who have more than they need consider donating non-perishable products to the Food Bank. These can be dropped off to the local supermarkets during normal opening hours.

There is a small food bank at St. Mary Magdalene Church, located in a cupboard in the chikldren's play area, containing non-perishable items which those who need them are welcome to take. Any donations of in-date non-perishable foods are welcomed throughout the year.

SCAMS

There have been reports in Suffolk of people pretending to be from the British Red Cross, knocking on the doors of elderly and vulnerable individuals, taking their money to do shopping – and then not returning. There have also been reports that cards are being put through doors with the British Red Cross branding, offering help. The British Red Cross are NOT utilising a postcard system currently in connection to Covid-19 and any distribution of these cards locally needs to be reported to Trading Standards via 0808 223 1133.

POWER SUPPLIES

UK Power Networks is responsible for distributing power to over 8.3 million properties across London, the South East and East of England. Its engineers are out as normal continuing their core role in maintaining the electricity network, and fixing any electrical faults that occur. With many of its customers now working from home and to support the wider UK economy from the evening of Friday 20th March, 2020, it will be cancelling most of its lower priority planned maintenance work. This is in order to avoid prolonged planned power cuts for people who are currently working from home. If anyone needs information on a power cut, visit the Power Cut Map for live updates, tweet @UKPowerNetworks or telephone the customer service team, 24 hours a day, on 105 or 0800 3163 105. Calls are free from a landline or mobile phone.

SCHOOLS

Suffolk County Council closed its schools on Friday, 20th March, 2020. The government has asked parents to keep their children at home, wherever possible, and asked schools to remain open only for those children who absolutely need to attend. The fewer children making the journey to school, and the fewer children in educational settings, the lower the risk that the virus can spread and infect vulnerable individuals in wider society. If a child needs specialist support,

is vulnerable or has a parent who is a critical worker and who cannot be safely looked after at home so that the parent can work, then educational provision will be available for them in Suffolk. Take time to call a friend or family member. It's important to stay in touch with others however you do it, and sometimes simply talking about how you feel can make a big difference. If you have a friend or neighbour who may need support or a listening ear, spare some time to talk to them.

2. Be active

Being physically active can have a real benefit to your mental health. If you are not self-isolating, try building in a walk or other exercise during the day. If you are indoors, take regular screen breaks and stretch at least once every hour.

3. Learn

Take the opportunity to think about learning a new skill or pick up something you have enjoyed doing before. Always wanted to read that book, or learn that language? Now is the time. More classes and courses are also available online now than ever before.

4. Take notice

It's all too easy to become immersed in the constant, and ever-changing media coverage surrounding coronavirus (COVID-19). Take a break from watching, listening or reading news stories and use the time for the things you enjoy. Techniques such as mindfulness can be helpful.

5. Give

Giving your time and energy to others is extremely important, never more so than now, and can pay dividends for your mental wellbeing. Whether it's looking out for and helping a neighbour, or registering to volunteer to offer support in your community, there is plenty you can do. The 'Home, but not alone' campaign is one such example, run in partnership between the East Anglian Daily Times, Suffolk County Council, Community Action Suffolk, Suffolk Community Foundation and the Suffolk Association of Local Councils.

SESAW is currently closed however if you have an animal, or know of one, in urgent need please contact us. Ring 01787 210888 leaving your name and most importantly your number then a brief description of the problem. The answer phone is regularly checked and we will ring you back.

Please note, cats cannot transmit COVID-19 to humans but could possibly carry the virus for a short time if someone with it had handled them. If someone in your household is displaying COVID-19 symptoms it is advisable not to let your cat out. Obviously for some cats this could be very stressful and they may need to go out if only for a short time. Entire cats should not be let out at all until they have been neutered to prevent unwanted pregnancies. In all cases after touching your cat, wash your hands.
