ED'S COMMENT

A lad who lived near Chamberlin Hall. penned some sheep in the Square by a wall. But his mind wasn't quite sound. 'cause when he looked around He was the only one there - April Fool!

This is a Limerick, with a nod to last month's April Fool in the Bugle. Wednesday 12th May is National Limerick Day. Limericks are linked particularly with Edward Lear, whose limerick fame rests on four books for children that he wrote and illustrated, the first being 'A Book of Nonsense' in 1846. Lear didn't invent the limerick. In the 1830s, he often stayed at Knowsley Hall, near Liverpool, where he found a book of limericks by John Marshall called Anecdotes and Adventures of Fifteen Gentlemen.

It is probable that the book used a limerick form that was already current in popular culture. They may have given Lear the idea of writing limericks to accompany his illustrations for children. He called them nonsense poems.

But how did the name 'limerick' come into use in the first place? Unfortunately, there is no definitive answer, although there are several theories. The most popular is that it comes from an 18th century song called Will You Come Up to Limerick? At parties, guests would compose verses of this song, with the entire company joining in for the chorus. "...come to Limerick!" Several publications, dating from around this time, refer to this song and its connection to the limerick. Limerick is a style of poetry that traditionally has 5 lines and has an AABBA rhyme pattern. This means that in a limerick, the words at the end of the first, second and fifth sentences rhyme, while the words at the end of the third and fourth sentence rhyme with each other. Traditionally, the first line of a limerick introduces a person and a place and the rest of the poem describes a humorous, often strange, situation involving the subject or the place.

Here are a couple more as the Bugle's contribution to National Limerick Day!

There was a young fellow named Guy Who just saw the world through one eye. He says, if you ask, "It's because of this mask!" And this virus is the reason why!

A young man whose face was bright red Said I feel like I'd rather be dead. Months have gone by And my throat is quite dry, I just need to be in the King's Head!



VILLAGE HALL CLOSED UNTIL 17 MAY

Contrary to the government's announcement on 22nd February, village halls will not be able to reopen after Easter, except for a small number of permitted activities. England's 10,000+ rural community buildings will instead have to wait until 17th May before they can be hired out for many functions including exercise classes, coffee mornings, performances and celebrations such as weddings and birthday parties. Information issued by the charity ACRE is informed by government guidance published 25th February which sits at odds with earlier ministerial statements. Deborah Clarke, ACRE's Rural Evidence and Village Halls Manager explained: "We hope the information we have published will help to clarify the situation for the army of volunteers who manage England's village halls. Many will no doubt be disappointed they cannot reopen after the Easter break, despite what the Prime Minister previously indicated. This may be a blessing in disguise however as they now have more time to prepare for resuming activities in the summer when it is safe to do so."



As part of Step 3, no earlier than 17 May, the government will look to continue easing limits on seeing friends and family wherever possible, allowing people to decide on the appropriate level of risk for their circumstances. This means that most legal restrictions on meeting others outdoors will be lifted – although gatherings of over 30 people will remain illegal. Indoors, the Rule of 6 or 2 households will apply – we will keep under review whether it is safe to increase this.

As soon as possible and by no later than Step 3, the government will also update the advice on social distancing between friends and family, including hugging. But until this point, people should continue to keep their distance from anyone not in their household or support bubble.

Most businesses in all but the highest risk sectors will be able to reopen. In all sectors, COVID-Secure guidance will remain in place and businesses may not cater for groups bigger than the legal limits. Indoor hospitality will reopen – and as in Step 2, venues will not have to serve a substantial meal with alcoholic drinks; nor will there be a curfew. Customers will, however, have to order, eat and drink while seated.

Other indoor locations to open up in Step 3 include indoor entertainment venues such as cinemas and children's play areas; the rest of the accommodation sector, including hotels, hostels and B&Bs; and indoor adult group sports and exercise classes. The government will also allow some larger performances and sporting events in indoor venues with a capacity of 1,000 people or half-full (whichever is a lower number), and in outdoor venues with a capacity of 4,000 people or half-full (whichever is a lower number). In the largest outdoor seated venues, where crowds can be spread out, up to 10,000 people will be able to attend (or a quarter-full, whichever is lower). Up to 30 people will be able to attend weddings, receptions and wakes, as well as funerals. This limit will also apply to other types of significant life events including bar mitzvahs and christenings.

Finally, before Step 4 begins, the government will complete a review of social distancing and other long-term measures that have been put in place to cut transmission. This will inform decisions on the timing and circumstances under which the rules on 1 metre plus, the wearing of face coverings and other measures may be lifted. This will also inform guidance on working from home – which should continue wherever possible until this review is complete.



BILDESTON'S WHO'S WHO

This month I spoke with Kevin Harrison. Kevin was born in November 1940 and should have been born in Coventry, but due to WW2 Bombingwas born in a little village in Warwickshire. Kevin and his Mum returned to Coventry and he was baptised in a Pub. Eventually, bombed out of home, the whole family Mum, Dad, two older sisters Jo (10 years older) and Pauline (exactly 4 years older) moved to Blackburn Lancashire where he grew up. He had a little brother Robin when he was 6. His Mum, Sister Jo and Brother Robin emigrated to Australia in 1959 (His brother became an actor and was briefly in the hit television show Neighbours).

As a teenager Kevin was a keen cyclist and spent most weekends on his bike exploring the Yorkshire Dales. He competed in many races and time trials. He was much better at long distance and so most of his successes were in longer races. He took part in the Milk Race and raced the Tour of Isle of Man which took place a week after the TT on the same route. When Kevin left school at 15 he started an apprenticeship as an Engineer at a local firm. Kevin married his first wife Pauline at 18 and had 6 children.

Having qualified as an engineer he worked on many different projects around the country. Amongst them, the Blue Streak Missile (cancelled in 1960), Deltic Diesel Train (cancelled 1962) and Rolls Royce RB211 jet engine (Rolls Royce collapsed 1971). Eventually when Rolls Royce collapsed he decided that it was time to get out of engineering (He said he was beginning to see a pattern). He decided to work for himself running a small lorry company, general building and plumbing and a DJ in and around London Clubs. Around this time he started playing Rugby and played until he was in his mid 40's.

Kevin married his second wife Jane in 1975 and had another daughter (Libby). Eventually after splitting with his second wife he became a Publican. After running various Pubs, he and his ex wife and her new husband bought The Kings Head in 1984. They ran The Kings Head together until 1991 when Jane and Iain decided to move up to Scotland. Kevin ran The Pub until his retirement in 2008. Kevin met his current wife Jayne in the Pub. She worked as a barmaid and they became a couple in 1998 and married in 2006. Kevin suffered a stroke in 2019 but it hasn't stopped him and he still gets up to his workshop, mostly to supervise now but he says Jayne isn't too bad an apprentice!

I first met Kevin over 35 years ago when he moved to Bildeston and purchased the Kings Head Pub. Kevin worked really hard to turn the pub into 'the place to drink'. He turned one of the side rooms which was derelict into a mini night club called Marilyn's, themed on Marilyn Monroe, the first night they opened Marilyn's to the public the paint on the walls was still wet! Kevin brought a bit more life into Bildeston when he arrived, with live entertainment from various bands and home cooked food available at the pub, and of course his sense of humour.

150g frozen garden peas

300ml milk

30g plain flour

30g butter

1 tbsp medium curry powder

100g grated mature cheddar cheese

2 tsp mango chutney

2 crushed plain poppadums

1 tbsp chopped coriander

2 x 120g packs spinach and rocket salad



Method

- 1. Cook the pasta according to pack instructions, adding the peas for the last 4 minutes, then drain
- 2. Put the milk, flour, butter and curry powder in a pan over a medium heat. Whisk for 3-4 minutes until smooth
- 3. Simmer gently, stirring for another 2 minutes. Stir in the cheese and mango chutney, then the cooked pasta and peas
- 4. Mix the crushed poppadums and coriander together and sprinkle over the pasta mixture, then serve with the salad leaves on the side.


Representing the community



Pastoral Letter – May 2021 from Revd Elke Cattermole
