ED'S COMMENT

Disappointment sadness or displeasure caused by the nonfulfillment of one's hopes or expectations.

That's the dictionary definition, but being reminded what it means is no help in dealing with the emotion itself. Despite a record number of people having received their vaccinations, Freedom Day and the Covid restrictions being lifted on June 21st has been delayed, due to the impact of the latest variant. Data not dates, so the roadmap now has a diversion taking us on a round journey of another few weeks to enable as many of the eligible population to be vaccinated as possible. Most restrictions still remain in place.

If that wasn't enough of an emotional roller coaster, we might have to prepare ourselves for more massive and traditional disappointment. Traditional? We have learned over many years to cope with the specific disappointment of our national football team qualifying for international competitions and then failing at different points. We haven't won a major tournament since the World Cup of 1966. As for the European Cup, the best most recent 'success' was thirty years later in 1996, when England reached the semi-final. They didn't even have to qualify as they were the hosts, but lost to Germany on penalties – the famous time Gareth Southgate missed his spot-kick. Fate has given him a chance to make amends as manager. There's a man who knows how to cope with disappointment.

The lead up to these competitions is tremendous. Sales of flags shoot up, big ones for the house, small ones for the car. Sales of drink go up. An interesting fact is that the UK is the only country in the whole of Europe which saw sales of alcohol rise during Covid restrictions and the lockdown, with all other continental countries seeing their sales go down! Sales of national football shirts, pennants and banners go up too. All with the heightened anticipation of a good tournament, success and, dare to dream, final victory. The supermarkets win, sports shops win, Off Licenses and the pubs that are left win. Hopefully England will win too, but in case, here is a little Bugle guide to coping with, and getting over, disappointment, if, as history has proved, we need it.

- 1. Face the truth of the situation: Be honest, we haven't won anything since 1966, is this going to be any different? Maybe, it's just a good start!
- 2. Allow yourself to mourn a lost dream: Yes, it would have been brilliant, joyous, amazing, but like all dreams, they end and we wake up to the real world!
- 3. Don't feel like a victim: It wasn't your fault. You didn't play, you're not the manager, you shouted at the TV, but no-one listened!
- 4. Check if your expectations were realistic: Was this time going to be very different? Is our national team as good as or better than 1966?

July's Advice Column

I've been saving up to have my kitchen redone, but I'm a bit worried about it. Last time I had any work done on the house, it took more than double the time I thought it would and ended up costing me a fortune. I'm looking for a different builder this time, but how will I know I can trust them?

Many of us will take advantage of the warmer weather to improve our homes, and it's important to make sure the job goes well. Here are some steps you should take when choosing a trader:

- Find a Trading Standards 'approved trader' use the internet to search for one in your area or the Government's approved trader scheme TrustMark.
- Get references or recommendations ask people you know or ask the person you hire for examples of work
 they've carried out in the past. Try to avoid contractors who won't give references it's a sign they could be
 dishonest.
- Find out if they are a current member of a trade body trade bodies have codes of practice and can help
 resolve problems if things go wrong, so check your trader is a member. Ask who they're registered with and
 then check the trade body's website.
- Only use certified traders for gas and electrics it's dangerous to use someone who doesn't know what
 they're doing. Check the <u>Gas Safe Register</u> for a list of traders and use a <u>registered electrician</u> who can certify
 their own work. When you're having a kitchen fitted, it's worth checking whether the person you've hired will be
 doing the electrical or gas work themselves. If not, check who they will be using and whether they're registered.
- **Get a written quote** this is different to an estimate. A quote is legally binding and the builder can't change it without a good reason for example, if you ask for extra work to be done. Try to compare quotes from a number of contractors to make sure you're getting a fair price.
- Get a written contract this should cover exactly what you're paying for and everything you've agreed on, like timings, payments, who will pay for materials and subcontractors.
- Think carefully about payment opt to pay in stages rather than upfront. Where possible, try to pay by card as
 this can afford you extra safeguards if something goes wrong.
- Keep copies of receipts also keep your written contract as evidence, as well as photos of any problems if they arise.

If you have a problem with a contractor, and you're not sure what to do or where to go, call the Citizens Advice consumer helpline 0808 223 1133. 

Recipe of the Month

Courgette and Ricotta Tarts

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients

serves 2

- 2 large courgettes
- 2 tsp olive oil
- 4 filo pastry sheets
- 100g ricotta
- 50ml milk
- 1 large egg
- Finely grated zest of 1 lemon
- 3 tbsp parmesan style cheese finely grated



Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180C, 160C fan, gas mark 4
- 2. Grease 2 x 10cm fluted tart tins with a little oil
- 3. Trim the filo sheets into 8 23cmx12cm rectangles then cover with a damp tea towel
- 4. Lightly brush the first filo sheet with oil and gently press into a tin, there will be overhang. Repeat with the remaining filo, using 4 rectangles per tin. Lay these 45 degree angles to each other so they don't fully overlap
- 5.Beat together the ricotta, milk, egg, lemon zest, cheese and some seasoning. Spoon into the prepared pastry cases
- 6. Slice the courgettes very thinly into strips and roll one strip into a tight spiral Wrap another strip around the outside of this spiral, then keep going until your courgette flower is large enough to mostly fill the case. Gently sit it into the ricotta mixture.
- 7. Repeat with the remaining courgette to make another flower.
- 8. Brush the courgettes with a little oil
- 9. Cook the tarts for 30 mins or until golden brown and the ricotta mixture is set.
- 10. Cool in their tins for 5 mins before serving warm with new potatoes and a green salad

C150/21/22 Adjournments - meeting adjourned at 1903hrs

County & District Councillor Robert Lindsay: report sent and distributed. CC Robert Lindsay pleased to be re-elected along with 8 other Green councillors. SCC investing in more bus services, but this seems to be more in the towns rather than rural areas. BDC are mapping wildlife corridors/ habitat in the district and have a scheme for planting trees and plants to link up wildlife areas. They are also carrying out a tree cover survey. 20mph update – CC Robert Lindsay advised he met with Parish Councillors Andrew Guttridge, Ray McCann and a representative from SCC Highways, it was a positive meeting. Longer buffer 30mph zones at both ends of the village were suggested by SCC which was welcomed by Robert and the Parish Councillors. The design costs, which will implement the scheme, will cost £9,000, half of this cost will met by Robert, the Parish Council to fund the remaining £4,500 from CIL funds.

Council agreed and approved the spend of £4,500 to implement the design scheme. It was suggested flashing speed signs were used in the meantime, this route had been gone down before, however, there are no suitable sites for the signs.

Public Forum – Representatives from BNatural advised the festival will go ahead this year, celebrating the 10th anniversary of the event (brought forward from last year). The sports field has been booked if the Market Place cannot be used due to the pandemic, both sites may be utilised. It was reported all costs have increased, they have been unable to fundraise for the past 15 months. The festival costs approx. £11,000 to put on over the whole weekend. There was a picnic fundraiser in 2020 (between lockdowns) and 2 further fundraisers this summer, picnic and quiz. A donation from the Parish Council was requested for this year's festival. In 2019 the PC had settled invoices for the stage base and the road closure. Agreed to discuss later in the meeting and email BNatural the outcome.

Comments:

Bildeston Parish Council OBJECTS to the above application on the following grounds:

Housing Design

The proposed design of housing on the site is uniformly bland and uninteresting. There is nothing which echoes the architecture of the existing village or the materials traditional to the area. The houses give the impression of being larger or smaller versions of the same external design and so the overall impression is totally monotonous and characterless. Hence it exemplifies the worst in cost driven, mass-built housing which has no regard for local context.

Additionally, there is inadequate external storage for modern family living. None of the properties have garages. While garages are now seldom used for storing cars, they provide valuable storage for other things. The sheds proposed for each property are unlikely to be an adequate substitute, especially for larger family properties and therefore there is likely to be a proliferation of additional outbuildings after properties are built. It would be much preferable if adequate provision was made in the first place.

Surface Water Drainage

In our representations at previous stages of the planning process, we expressed serious concerns about surface water (and foul) drainage of the site and the potential to cause or aggravate flooding in the existing village. The representation for Suffolk County Council, as Lead Local Flood Authority, appears to show that these concerns were well founded and remain problematic to developing the site.

In particular, the risk of flooding to the existing village was addressed at outline stage though restricting outflow by limiting the size of the outfall pipe. Excess water was to be accommodated in an attenuation pond. The latest comments from SCC suggest that this strategy is fundamentally flawed. SCC indicates that the attenuation pond is expected to overtop during heavy rain and hence houses at the bottom of the site should not be built as proposed due to risk of flooding. The consequences are more serious and far reaching though. If there is uncontrolled discharge of water from the site through overtopping, then the flow of water into the brook is also uncontrolled. This then has serious downstream implications, including to properties which back onto the brook in Newberry Road, which have previously experienced flooding.

Pedestrian and Cycle Links to Village Centre

There remains no proposed direct pedestrian/cycle link to the village centre. This will encourage greater car use for short journeys and is totally counter to sustainability goals. Notwithstanding the outline permission granted, we would urge that a solution is now found to address this major shortcoming.

With this in mind, it is doubly disappointing to note that the developer is attempting to reduce the width of a new footway alongside Ipswich Road required by the outline permission and has omitted one section altogether. We are pleased that SCC is robustly resisting this in its representation, and we would hope that Babergh will be equally robust. We trust that Babergh will give proper consideration to these issues, all of which have serious long term consequences for our community.

How can we be more creative in the way we use our church land?

I will be contacting each of our parishes for discussion and comments, bringing them all together as a benefice and come up with some plans and ideas for the future. It is only by moving forward, involving our church and parish communites that we can help make a difference and show our love for God and our neighbour. Pastoral Letter – July 2021 from Revd Elke Cattermole

"I name you in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy" Matthew 28v19

Naming a person or anything can be an easy or difficult task to do. The decision to change our Benefice name incorporating all the parishes had to go through different processes before being agreed by our Diocesan Bishop, 'Bishop Martin Seeley'.

We name our children, pets, horses, and inanimate object such as our houses, boats, and other items important to us. The reason for the name given often has a special meaning for us, a family member or friend.

Through July a few of our churches will be celebrating what we call their 'Patronal Festival', a special church service that reminds us of why a specific church was named after a specific saint, 'St Peter' (Lindsey), 'St Mary Magdalene' (Bildeston), 'St Margaret of Antioch' (Whatfield), 'St Mary' (Nedging and Naughton).

All our churches were built many hundred of years ago and were dedicated to God. Later it became common practice to dedicate a Christian place of worship to one or more saint. So in the next few weeks we will be reflecting what was important why a specific church was called a specific name.

Patronal Church Festivals are a time for the churches to reflect on what is important for us and our local community. The church building is important as a place of worship, prayer and *for 'Baptism, Wedding and Funeral Services'*, a place I feel that was made by people, dedicated to God, but for the use of the people. Where joy for the future can be celebrated through baptism and weddings, a place for mourning and reflection as well as hope for the future at the time of death, loss and sadness.

These buildings are for today and the future to be used by the local communities they are situated in and for many who may visit it. They are also made up of people who pray for the people who are part of the different communities, those who live or visit the villages and those who are part of the church.

You are all welcome to our services and we pray as we start to open more fully in late July we can rejoice and share more things in our churches for the whole community. Please continue to share and celebrate with us in whatever form to the honour of God.
