### **ED'S COMMENT**

A very happy New Year to you all and good luck for 2022. Who knows, someone in the village might have the biggest slice of luck and win the lottery in 2022. Why suggest this? Because in January in 1569 the first ever lottery ticket winners were announced in England. Who knew the lottery was that old, that the Tudors were the first to try their luck and win a fortune over 600 years ago!

Elizabeth 1 wanted to invest more money in the country's ships, ports and harbours. The problem was, how to pay for it. Elizabeth looked to her Principal Secretary of State, Sir William Cecil. Fortunately, his genius lay in dreaming up innovative ways of raising money for the state. Already, in order to pay German mining experts to work in the Lake District, he had introduced the revolutionary idea of a one penny tax on each household, the so-called 'Peter's Pence.'

He looked overseas for inspiration across the North Sea. English merchants trading there reported that cities such as Ghent, Utrecht, Antwerp and Bruges had developed a particularly clever method of raising public revenues for building fortifications and other municipal projects: a lottery. In 1566, Queen Elizabeth with Sir William Cecil, planned a similar idea to raise funds, whilst managing not to raise taxes. The State would sell tickets to nobles for their chance to win all manner of things that matched the value of the revenue it generated. Winning tickets would then be drawn three years later, securing herself a 3 year interest-free loan.

Thus the English lottery was born. The tickets were available for ten shillings each, about £120 today, a huge amount in the Elizabethan era. The tickets were so expensive to ensure that the rich would enter, generating a load of money for the state and great excitement for the folk who had been lucky enough to enter. Anyone who was anyone simply had to have a ticket, meaning the prizes had to be spectacular in order to make the 400,000 entry vacancies appeal to the rich and successful - and spectacular they were. The prizes ranged from luxury goods such as silver plates, tapestries and cloth, to artefacts belonging to the queen herself. The first prize was £5000 (which would be around £1.2 million today), with subsequent prizes being cash values in descending order. One prize was a week 'get out of jail free card'. You could commit almost any crime and swan off scot-free- well anything except piracy, murder and treason that is. For the poorer section of the Elizabethan middle class, there were syndicates. People would buy tickets and then sell shares. The prizes were announced on scrolls sent up and down the country. On January 11th, 1569 the tickets were drawn by the steps of St.Paul's Cathedral.

The lottery was not a success. Despite everything, it sold fewer than 34,000 tickets instead of the 400,000 originally planned and raised less than £5,000 instead of the £100,000 hoped for. No-one seems to have won very much. Just as in Tudor times with all the horrible diseases around, staying healthy and happy is as good, if not better, than winning the lottery. Look forward to that in 2022!

### **NEW COVID BOOSTER TARGET**

COVID-19 remains a serious health risk, especially with the Omicron variant. The alert level has been raised and the target to provide all adults with a booster vaccination brought forward to the end of December.

You should stay careful to help protect yourself and others and:

- · Let fresh air in if you meet indoors. Meeting outdoors is safer
- You must wear a face covering in shops and on all public transport
- Get tested and self-isolate if required
- · If you haven't already, get vaccinated
- People aged over 30 can already book an appointment in advance using the online service from 2 months after their second dose
- People aged over 18 can now get a booster as long as it has been 3
  months since their second dose. Book your vaccination appointment
  online or find a walk-in clinic. The NHS will contact you when you are
  eligible to book your booster dose. Many local pharmacies are offering
  vaccinations.

Residents across Suffolk and North-East Essex no longer have to wait to receive an invitation from the NHS to have their Covid-19 booster vaccination. Anyone in an eligible group who had their 2nd dose of COVID-19 vaccine six, or even three, months ago can go to a walk-in, no-appointment clinic for a booster vaccination.

#### book via the national NHS website or call 119.

Previously, people had to wait to receive a letter or text from the NHS saying they were eligible. The number of locations where people can have their booster vaccination has also been increased, including many local pharmacies now offering booked appointments, in addition to around 60 walk-in clinics which are taking place locally over the coming weeks.

People are eligible for a booster after receiving their 2nd dose including frontline volunteers and health and social care staff, people with severely weakened immune systems and their resident household contacts and those aged under 50 with an underlying health condition.



### THE KRAY'S CONNECTION WITH BILDESTON

It's Sunday,1st, September,1940 5.30am. Seven-year-old twin boys stand in a crowd being watched closely by their mother, Violet and an older boy. Never ending lines of children fill the platforms, gas masks hanging by their waists, white name labels attached to coats. On board the train the conductor announces their destination, Ipswich. They arrived and were finally told they have been billeted to Hadleigh.

After a short walk they were shown into a red brick mansion and introduced to Dr and Mrs Styles. Amazed by the inside bathroom with hot running water even the boys were silent but not for long.

In 1940, Violet and all three boys were evacuated to Hadleigh, Suffolk where despite Mrs Styles' best efforts they refused to be educated and would not learn to read. A glimpse of the violence in their character was shown when they killed Dr Styles' Cockerel for fun. Despite this they had fond memories of Suffolk and sledging down constitution hill, fighting the locals, apple scrumping and spending hours with Charlie (when he was not working in the chippy) as he coached them in boxing. After a year in the country Violet missing her friends and family took the boys back to Vallance Road. They were devastated and never forgot their love for Suffolk and its locals where they were treated so well without fear or malice as was the case when they were older.

In 1948, Reggie won the Hackney school boys boxing championship, The London school boy and the London juniors titles. The following year he was arrested and charged with GBH but the charges did not stick.

In 1951, the boys were called up for national service and following in their fathers' footsteps they were not going quietly. When they arrived to "sign up" Ronnie punched the Corporal who attempted to stop them leaving! As a result, they became the last prisoners in the Tower of London. This marked the beginning of all three boy's arrests, charges and convictions, spending time in prisons all over the United Kingdom. Amusingly (as Ronnie was not great at doing time) Reggie would go to prison and serve his brothers sentence for him! By 1957, the boys had built an empire called the firm from their snooker club in Bethnal Green taking part in organised criminal activities in London. The Krays owned many of the top clubs in London and rubbed shoulders with all the celebrities of the times, such as Diana Dors and Judy Garland. Reggie even dated Barbara Windsor and Ronnie had a relationship with Lord Boothby.

During all this time Ronnie's behaviour became more of a concern to the family. He had mood swings, would refuse to eat, shave only one side of his face and went from sitting completely still for hours to violent frenzies. Worryingly he was not the first in the family with mental health problems and later in life he was officially diagnosed with Schizophrenia.

At the Krays peak in 1965, Reggie married Frances O'Shea at St James Church in Bethnal Green. Her family were against the match and her mother wore all black at the wedding. On 9th, March, 1966 Ronnie shot George Cornell in the Blind Beggar, a member of the rival gang The Richardson's. Things were getting out of hand with Ronnie's mental health.

Continuing with their love for Suffolk the boys bought Violet a pink house next to the post office in Bildeston and the Brooks close by for them, The locals tell tales of them giving children donkey rides and giving out money for ice creams.

Reggie stabbed Jack the hat Mc Vitie in the stomach. Knowing they had limited time as free men they fled to Suffolk to hide at Bill Whymans new home, Gedding Hall close to Bury St Edmunds and their home in the Brooks. They were arrested in May 1968 and convicted of murder and jailed for life. Violet Kray died of a heart attack 4th August, 1982 in her Bunhill Row flat, Shoreditch. On the 11th August crowds collected outside the flat with wreaths being laid in front. Charles snr died 7 months later they were married over 50 years. Both are buried at Chingford Mount burial ground. Both the boys were allowed to attend their mother's funeral service but not the burial. Ronnie died at Broadmoor hospital in 1995 and Reggie released on compassionate grounds died of cancer 6 weeks later in 2000 both are buried with Francis all the family close to each other. ### Recipe of the Month Leek Cheddar and Smoked Fish Tart

with thanks to Alison

### Ingredients serves 4-6

#### For the pastry

170g plain flour 85g unsalted butter

1 medium egg

Pinch of sea salt

#### For the filling

1 leek sliced

2 tbsp olive oil

30g chopped flat parsley

125g cold smoked haddock or pollock

100g grated mature cheddar cheese

3medium eggs

200g double cream



#### Method

- 1. For the pastry, chop the butter and rub into the flour until breadcrumb like consistency, add the egg and a little cold water to bring it together into a smooth dough.
- 2. Knead for 45 seconds and form into a disc and chill in the fridge for 1 hour. Meanwhile grease and flour a 20cm wide and 3 cm deep tart tin.
- 3. Preheat the oven 180C, 160 fan, gas mark 4. Remove the pastry from fridge. Flour the work surface and roll out the pastry to 3-4mm thick. Line the tin leaving an overhang of 2cms. Line this with greaseproof paper and beans and bake blind for 30 mins.
- 4. Remove from oven and take out the beans and greaseproof. Trim the pastry and return to the oven for 10-15 mins more.
- 5. Once the pastry is dry in appearance, remove from oven and brush with egg wash then return for 2-3 mins
- 6. For the filling, remove the skin from the fish and cut into 1cm cubes. Place the leeks in a saucepan with the oil and cook on a medium heat. Once softened remove from heat, add the parsley and fish then the cheese. Mix together and pour into the tart case.
- 7. In a bowl, beat the eggs and cream together then pour this mixture on top.
- 8. Return tart to oven for 20-25 mins until cooked.
- 9. Serve warm or cold.

I've been living in my privately rented flat for years. I generally have a good relationship with my landlord but I just can't get them to carry out various repairs that have built up. How can I get them to act - and what exactly do they have to do?

This must be a very frustrating situation. The law states that your landlord must provide accommodation that is safe, healthy and free from things that could cause serious harm.

You don't say exactly what repairs are needed. If you have problems such as electrical wiring that you think might be faulty, or there's damp, or an infestation by pests, the landlord has a legal obligation to put things right.

Landlords are also responsible for the maintenance of the general structure, and fittings such as boilers and radiators; basins, baths and toilets; and the drains.

The first step is to contact your landlord again, in writing. Include photographs of the problems. Keep a record of all communications and evidence relating to the disrepair.

If that doesn't prompt any action, the advisers at Citizens Advice can help with next steps. These could include contacting your local council (who will have dedicated officers for dealing with disrepair in private rented properties) or asking for a visit by the environmental health team.

Tenants can take their landlords to court to force them to carry out repairs. However, it's worth getting some advice and thinking carefully before embarking on this route.




