

### **ED'S COMMENT**

Once again the Bugle prints the announcement from Robin Sidgwick about the planned Bildeston Street Party to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. It is repeated to help make sure everyone in the village knows about the party and helps to link together any other planned street parties to complement each other rather than compete. Although celebrations are planned for June, this month is significant as it was 6th February 1952 when Elizabeth became Queen.

The Platinum Jubilee of Elizabeth II will be marked in 2022 in the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth in recognition of the 70th anniversary, an extra bank holiday will be created and the traditional Spring bank holiday will be moved from the end of May to the start of June, to create a special four day Jubilee bank holiday weekday weekend from Thursday 2nd June 2022 to Sunday 5th June 2022. The British government has promised a "once-in-a-generation show" that will "mix the best of British ceremonial splendour and pageantry with cutting edge artistic and technological displays". It will be the first time that any British monarch has celebrated a platinum jubilee.

Elizabeth has been Queen for 70 years as she was just 25 years old when George VI, her father, died in the early morning of 6 February at Sandringham House in Norfolk. A period of national mourning began and Elizabeth II was proclaimed the new monarch by the Accession Council. George VI's coffin lay in St Mary Magdalene Church, Sandringham until 11 February when it was carried, in procession, to the nearby Wolferton railway station. The coffin was taken by train to London King's Cross railway station where another formal procession carried it to Westminster Hall where the king lay in state for three days. Some 304,000 people passed through Westminster Hall with queues up to 4 miles long.

To have been the longest reigning monarch in our history is remarkable in another sense. When Elizabeth was born she was third in line to the throne and not destined to be Queen. The abdication crisis in 1936 ended with her father becoming King George VI in place of his brother and Elizabeth suddenly becoming next in line to the throne. Queen Elizabeth II has been our Head of State for most of people's lives. The longest serving Head of State in the world. Whatever one's views about the monarchy, it cannot be denied that Queen Elizabeth has kept steadfast to the promise she made to the nation when she first became queen 70 years ago. As our monarch and Head of State, Queen Elizabeth has personified the values of duty and service, an example that some public servants of today would do well to learn from. No wonder much has been made of the contrasting images of the Queen alone at Prince Philip's funeral, and 'work events' at Downing Street.

There will be many and various events taking place through the months leading up to June. Several are planned for Suffolk, so our contribution of a Bildeston street party will sit proudly amongst them. Something to make us feel happier, to look forward to in a time full of unhappy news.







### Recipe of the Month Baked Peppers with Tofu and Olives

with thanks to Alison

#### Ingredients serves 3

A red pepper, cut in half is a hollow in which to bake small sweet and sour tomatoes - the juices of both mingling in the bottom with the olive oil. Lumps of sheep's milk feta and a sprig or two of thyme may also be used. This recipe forms a quick supper and serve with chewy white bread to soak up the juices.

3 red peppers
500g tofu
250g cherry tomatoes
100 ml olive oil
10 green olives
10 chives
2 tbsp chopped parsley

#### Method

- 1. Set the oven at 200C (fan 180C) gas 6
- 2. Halve and de-seed the peppers and place cut side up in a baking dish.
- 3. Divide the tofu evenly between the peppers, then cut each tomato in half and tuck these between the tofu. Pour some of the olive oil into each of the peppers.
- 4. Season and bake for an hour or until the peppers are tender.
- 5. Stone and chop the olives and put them in a small mixing bowl, finely chop the chives and mix them with the olives. Toss the parsley over this mix and when the peppers come from the oven scatter over the tops.
- 6. Serve with white chunky bread.

#### C212/21/22 Projects and progress reports

Joint Local Plan examination and representation. Cllr Guttridge updated that inspectors are to consider and improve the interim plan. Key point to note is that district councils will be requested to revert any built-up areas around their boundaries back to where they were located in the original plans, not as shown in latest versions.

- a) **20MPH project/design costs/funding.** Cllr Guttridge reported that there were no further updates from the previous meeting awaiting further news from County Councillor Robert Lindsay at this stage.
- b) 'Heating Bildeston'. Cllr Lester reported that the project is in the process of selecting a consultancy firm to undertake the feasibility study, with shortlisting down to two firms. These two are currently undergoing an interview process. Preapplication documents were submitted last week and progress remains on track. Shaun Moffat will lead on marketing and communications.
- c) 4 Year Work Plan review/update. Cllr Leigh-Hunt updated the meeting on the amendments proposed to the Council's Work Plan, with agreed changes to be incorporated into spreadsheet. Updates will be made latest version uploaded to SharePoint shortly. As the Council moves into the last year of implementing the current Work Plan, it was agreed that it would be review on a quarterly basis.
- d) **Dropped kerb next to Old Post Office**, **High Street**. No further update from last meeting.
- e) **Update on village amenities.** Cllr Hubbard reported that the village sign is in the process of being made. The hedge has now been cut around the cemetery. An application has been made for a memorial tree at the cemetery, which is currently being processed. The subsided grave reported at the last meeting has now been corrected. The current location of the electricity supply at the Sportsfield was discussed and it was agreed that the Parish Council would support the Sportsfield in the removal/reallocation of the electrical supply from the track shed (and the shed's removal). Cllr Banks to confirm next steps after next Sportsfield committee meeting.

- f) **Website.** Cllr Tuck suggested creating a page to update users on items the Parish Council has actioned, for example, the recent reporting of the issue with noise from the bird scarers in the fields. It was suggested that where matters reported were mentioned, a link to self-reporting tools (such as environmental health) should also be included to encourage villagers to act on concerns themselves.
- g) **Electric vehicle (EV) chargers**. Cllr Lester asked the Council to consider investigating the possibility of providing EV charging points in the village. It was agreed that he would investigate further ahead of the next meeting, including reaching out to two independent suppliers who currently provide EV points to other nearby villages.

### LATEST COVID ADVICE

27 January, this guidance applies to ENGLAND

You will not be required to wear a face covering, including in communal areas of schools, but the government suggests you continue to wear one in crowded and indoor spaces where you may come into contact with people you do not normally meet.

You'll no longer need to show your NHS COVID Pass at venues and events by law.

20 January, this guidance applies to ENGLAND

Staff and pupils in secondary schools and colleges will not be required to wear a face covering in classrooms.

19 January, this guidance applies to ENGLAND

You are no longer asked to work from home if you can. Talk to your employer to agree arrangements to return to your workplace.

17 January, this guidance applies to ENGLAND

16 and 17 year olds can now book a booster dose online. Parents and guardians of people at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 between 12 to 15 years old, or those living with people at higher risk, will also be contacted to book a booster.

You can stop self-isolating at the start of day 6 if you get 2 negative rapid lateral flow test results on days 5 and 6 and do not have a temperature. Tests must be at least 24 hours apart. If either test is positive, wait 24 hours before testing again.

I'm a single parent and lost my job during the pandemic. My local Citizens Advice helped me apply for Universal Credit which has been really helpful to cover some of the income I've lost. But I'm very worried about the upcoming £20-a-week cut to Universal Credit - I don't know how I'll be able to pay for the school uniforms and shoes, especially as they grow so fast! Is there any other support out there to help plug the gap?

If you're on a low income or employed, you might be able to get help with some of the costs of sending your child to school, including school meals, transport and uniform. It's always worth talking to your local education authority to see what support is available as some of their resources and offerings can differ. The following information is for England.

#### Free school meals

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically get free school meals. If you have older children you can apply for free school meals if you get certain benefits. In your case as you're on Universal Credit and you applied after 1 April 2018 you would be eligible if you earn less than £7,400 a year without benefits.

To apply for free school meals you need to contact your local authority, you can check the details at gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals by typing your postcode in.

### **Transport**

If your children are aged between five to 16, your local education authority might offer free or lower cost transport if you don't live near school or your child's unable to walk there. You need to apply to your local education authority for help.

#### Uniforms and other costs

Your local education authority might also be able to help with some other costs, like uniforms, music lessons or trips and activities. There may also be local charitable schemes to help with these costs, it's worth checking with the school to see if it knows of any. Schools can also sometimes also advise on finding secondhand uniforms.

#### What's next

If your child is staying in education after year 11, you must tell HMRC's Child Benefit Office if you want to continue receiving child benefit and any extra support for children within means-tested benefits. When your child turns 16, HMRC will send you a letter asking whether your child will stay in education or training. You must reply to this letter to keep getting Child Benefit.



### Pastoral Letter – January 2022

Dear All,





The past year had been one that we thought might be better than the year before. With the rollout of the coronavirus vaccines, there was a hope at last we would be able to fight against this pandemic. Millions have had vaccines and yet the last year has been and remains a bit of a roller coaster. We have had a chance to have holidays and meet family and friends in a way we could not the previous year.
