

You are not in a parallel universe. You have stumbled across the children on their way to school dressed as characters from literature on World Book Day.

World Book Day is a charity funded by publishers & booksellers. Their mission is to give every child and young person a book of their own. Recycling in KS2

We were very lucky to have a visitor into Kestrel Class from the Suffolk Recycling team to talk to the children about recycling in Suffolk. The children were taught about the recycling process and they took part in a guiz to test their knowledge – they all did very well!

Bee Bots in Reception Class

Goldcrest class have been learning how to use Bee-bots. Bee-Bots are an exciting robot designed specifically for use by young children. This colourful, easy-to-operate, and friendly little robot is a perfect tool for teaching sequencing, estimation, problem-solving, and just having fun! The children had to give their Bee-Bot the correct instructions to get to the treasure.

Science in KS2

In Kestrel's science lesson their topic was electricity. They discussed the everyday use of electricity, looking at appliances at home which have cords and plugs. They also looked at cordless and portable appliances which are powered by batteries.

Tractor in School

As part of the Suffolk Agricultural Association's Tractors into Schools initiative, Mr Pratt brought his tractor into Bildeston school for all of the children to see. It was an opportunity for the children to about agriculture and animals and the effect of farming on their daily lives.

French Day in KS2

Kingfisher class have been learning how to order food in French. There was, of course, some taste testing too with lots of different French foods!

Kestrel class also enjoyed a French day, where Coq au Vin was on the menu!

As a bonus you are welcome to listen in if you enjoy all aspects of gardening.



HEATING BILDESTON FEASIBILITY STUDY UPDATE

After three months of intensive work, we have now completed our Heating Bildeston application to the Rural Community Energy Fund and are awaiting imminent approval for funding of a feasibility study that will work out the most suitable and economic way of bringing low-carbon district heating to our homes.

We've analysed the consultant tenders and selected which team of experts offer the best match for our project. If approval is granted, the next stage will be to identify just how much energy all our homes use. Heating Bildeston and our consultants will prepare a questionnaire and approach every Bildeston household for your input. More information to follow in next month's Bugle.

The Heating Bildeston team recently visited Swaffham Prior in Cambridgeshire where a similar scheme is now being installed. coffee, cakes and more.



Recipe of the Month 3 Minute Microwave Chocolate Pudding

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients

Go on, try it!

2 1/2 tbsp cocoa powder

2 tbsp golden syrup

6 tbsp self raising flour

2 1/2 tbsp caster sugar

1 medium egg

1 1/2 tbsp oil

1 1/2 tbsp milk

40g finely chopped white chocolate



Method

- 1. Divide 1 tbsp cocoa powder equally between 2 standard mugs. Add 1 tbsp of golden syrup to each.
- 2. Place flour, caster sugar and remaining 1 1/2 tbsp cocoa powder into a medium bowl. Crack the egg into this and add the oil and milk then stir in the white chocolate.
- 3. Divide this mixture equally and tidily between the mugs and microwave on full for (800W) 1 min 10 secs.
- 4. Serve in the mugs or turn onto plate adding cream or ice cream if you like.

Meeting adjourned 1916hrs to receive reports from County and District Councillors, and consider any matters raised by local parishioners.

CC/DC Robert Lindsay – not in attendance, a report was sent and distributed, a copy of the report can be found on the village website. www.bildeston.org An email was also received about the traffic calming and the Newberry House damage. Cllr Andrew Guttridge briefly went through the report, explaining the options SCC Highways engineer had suggested for signage for Newberry House to avoid damage to the overhanging porch. Cllr Guttridge suggested a meeting with SCC Highways, Newberry House owners and the Parish Council. The PC confirmed it will support the residents.

The 20mph scheme, dropped kerbs and road closures were on the report. Babergh Councillors are considering scrapping the cabinet system and reintroduce committee system. Suffolk CC budget proposals – 4% council precept rise, which is below the 5% cap.

Babergh DC are proposing a 2% rise in their council tax precept equivalent to £3.79 on a Band D property. The Government cap is the highest of 2% or £5 on Band D. SCC are offering to waive road closure fees for the Jubilee events, criteria apply. Details on SCC website.

Resident gave details to the meeting and PC regarding a Funday on the Sports Field/ Pavilion for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee on Sunday 5 June 2022. A letter had also been received from another resident willing to organise the day and requested the Parish Council's permission to carry this out. The PC recommended the Bildeston Sports Field Management Committee to lead the event, with the PC willing to help support with funding, it was suggested the Henry Morphew Trust can also be approached for funding. Organisers outside of the Sports Field/Pavilion committee to be led by the BSFMC meaning the BSFMC insurance and Health & Safety policies can be utilised.

I'm a single parent and lost my job during the pandemic. My local Citizens Advice helped me apply for Universal Credit which has been really helpful to cover some of the income I've lost. But I'm very worried about the upcoming £20-a-week cut to Universal Credit - I don't know how I'll be able to pay for the school uniforms and shoes, especially as they grow so fast! Is there any other support out there to help plug the gap?

If you're on a low income or employed, you might be able to get help with some of the costs of sending your child to school, including school meals, transport and uniform. It's always worth talking to your local education authority to see what support is available as some of their resources and offerings can differ. The following information is for England.

Free school meals

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically get free school meals. If you have older children you can apply for free school meals if you get certain benefits. In your case as you're on Universal Credit and you applied after 1 April 2018 you would be eligible if you earn less than £7,400 a year without benefits.

To apply for free school meals you need to contact your local authority, you can check the details at gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals by typing your postcode in.

Transport

If your children are aged between five to 16, your local education authority might offer free or lower cost transport if you don't live near school or your child's unable to walk there. You need to apply to your local education authority for help.

Uniforms and other costs

Your local education authority might also be able to help with some other costs, like uniforms, music lessons or trips and activities. There may also be local charitable schemes to help with these costs, it's worth checking with the school to see if it knows of any. Schools can also sometimes also advise on finding secondhand uniforms.

What's next

If your child is staying in education after year 11, you must tell HMRC's Child Benefit Office if you want to continue receiving child benefit and any extra support for children within means-tested benefits. When your child turns 16, HMRC will send you a letter asking whether your child will stay in education or training. You must reply to this letter to keep getting Child Benefit.



The Season of Lent

Pastoral Letter - March 2022 from Revd Elke Cattermole

Dear All,

As we enter the month of March, we start the season of Lent where people think of as a time to give things up, whether you go to church or not.

On Wednesday 2nd March we start this season, beginning with Ash Wednesday. Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and finally ending with celebration on Easter Sunday. The 40-day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and where Satan tempted him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year for similar fasting, marking a planned season of focus on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection.

At the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday, during a church service a marking of a cross from ashes may be placed on the foreheads of those attending. The ashes symbolize grief and the acceptance of our sinful state. This year the service of Ash Wednesday in this benefice will take place at All Saint's Church, Semer at 10.30am.

On the Fourth Sunday of Lent there is the service of 'Mothering Sunday' or also known as 'Mother's Day.' Centuries ago the Church developed a tradition of encouraging worshippers to make an annual pilgrimage to their 'Mother' Church on the 4th Sunday in Lent. This would often be at the local Cathedral and a time when people would share refreshments after the service. Local servant girls would be encouraged to attend and meet up with their families and especially their mothers. On the journey to the Cathedral the girls would pick wild spring flowers from the hedgerows and woods to make a posy to give to their mothers.

The past two years we have not been able to celebrate this special Sunday in the way we would have liked. This year we will be celebrating Mothering Sunday in three of our churches in this benefice; St Mary Magdalene, Bildeston, St Mary's Naughton and St Margaret's Whatfield. A time where gifts of flowers or plants are given to those who can attend or to those in our villages, who may still feel lonely and vulnerable.

Many of you will visit your mothers or remember your mothers who are no longer with you. We can also remember those who have been like mothers to us. Remembering those who find that day very painful for whatever reason. This year we will be looking forward to having the opportunity to hug and enjoy as families that special day. I would like again to share this special prayer with all of you.

Loving God, Thank you for mothers and children and for all the joy of family life. Be with those who are grieving because they have no mother. Be with those who are struggling because they have no children. Be near to those who are sad because they are far apart from those they love. Let your love be present in every home and help your church to have eyes to see and hear the needs of all who come. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen

All are welcome to join us at our Ash Wednesday Service and at one of our Mothering Sunday Services.

Blessing and love to you all during this season of Lent, keep safe and take care.
