

Recycling in KS2

We were very lucky to have a visitor into Kestrel Class from the Suffolk Recycling team to talk to the children about recycling in Suffolk. The children were taught about the recycling process and they took part in a quiz to test their knowledge – they all did very well!

Bee Bots in Reception Class

Goldcrest class have been learning how to use Bee-bots. Bee-Bots are an exciting robot designed specifically for use by young children. This colourful, easy-to-operate, and friendly little robot is a perfect tool for teaching sequencing, estimation, problem-solving, and just having fun! The children had to give their Bee-Bot the correct instructions to get to the treasure.

VILLAGE SIGN UPDATE

Bildeston is having a new Village Sign, which will be erected at the junction of High Street and Ipswich Road. Unfortunately, due to Covid 19, the manufacture of the sign has been delayed. Therefore, whilst awaiting the new sign it has been decided to commemorate an event that took place almost two thousand years ago in AD60, which involved Queen Boudicca the warrior Queen leading the British Celtic Iceni Tribe. This tribe defeated the Romans at Camulodunum (Colchester) and also at Londinium (London) who had captured Southern England under the orders of Emperor Nero. However, this was only possible after a failed assassination attempt on her life as she passed through Bildeston, when a Roman spy by the name of Laro Flipo attempted to drag her off her horse and stab her to death. Fortunately her bodyguard soldiers managed to overpower him and hold him captive.

Due to this upheaval they decided to camp for the night in Bildeston, and the following morning it was decided to hang Laro Flipo. Gallows were hastily erected in the vicinity of the High Street and Ipswich Road and the hanging took place of the Roman Spy. There is a possibility this was also the origin of Death's Builders and Undertakers which occupied the site on that junction until recent times!

Whilst awaiting the new village sign it has been decided to erect a temporary set of gallows with a plaque near the junction to commemorate this historic event. For health and safety reasons the gallows will be constructed with balsa wood (which has been donated) so that they cannot be put into practical use.

As a footnote, Boudicca and her army were finally defeated by the Romans led by the Roman Governor of Britain Galius Suetonilis Paulinus in 61AD at what is known as Watling Street in the West Midlands. Her memorial below, by the Thames, faces Suffolk.

Our evening spent with Lynne Edwards was described as one of our 'best ever' by some of those present. Our thanks go to her for an incredibly interesting, engaging




and witty look at her life in patchwork. It certainly has given Lynne a life of companionship and shared skills allowing her to travel around the world as a teacher of this multicultural and







Recipe of the Month Easter Egg Tiffin

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients

CUTS INTO 16 SQUARES

FOR THE TIFFIN

100g chopped butter plus extra to grease

50g sunflower seeds

100g cashew nuts

300g roughly chopped dark chocolate

100g roughly chopped milk chocolate

50g golden syrup

100g raisins

200g roughly broken digestive biscuits

FOR THE TOPPING

100g dark chocolate roughly chopped

100g milk chocolate roughly chopped

30g white chocolate finely chopped

75g chocolate mini eggs



Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180C, 160C fan, gas mark 4. Then lightly grease and line a 20.5cm square tin with parchment paper.
- 2. For the tiffin spread the sunflower seeds and cashew nuts on a separate baking tray then toast in the oven for 8 mins or until golden. Cool completely
- 3. Melt the chocolates, butter, syrup and a pinch of salt in a bowl over a pan of simmering water stirring occasionally. Set the bowl aside for 5 minutes then stir in the raisins, digestives and toasted sunflower seeds and cashews.
- 4. Tip this mixture into the lines tin and roughly flatten with the back of a spoon. Chill for 30minutes.
- 5. For the topping, melt the dark and milk chocolate together as before, followed by the white chocolate in a separate bowl. Spread the dark and milk mixture evenly over the tiffin. Using a teaspoon, dollop on small blobs of the white chocolate then marble them in using a tip of a knife or skewer.
- 6. Arrange the mini eggs on the top and chill and set.
- 7. Soften at room temperature for 10 mins, transfer to a board and cut into 16 squares

C230/21/22 Adjournments. Meeting adjourned 1942hrs to receive reports from County and District Councillors, and consider any matters raised by local parishioners. CC/DC Robert Lindsay –

20 mph – CC R Lindsay chased SCC, they confirmed they have now started on the design and should have it ready by end of March. Squirrells Mill Close & Church Rd – it was difficult to locate the terminal signs for leaving the 20mph zone. Suggestion to make the whole village 20mph so signs not needed in those locations. It was pointed out Squirrells Mill was a private road, and SCC or the PC do not have any jurisdiction over this area. Church Rd and Consent Lane will be Quiet Lanes soon.

Dropped kerb - the cost estimate for this has now gone up because officers advise a safety audit will need to be done because changing the shape of the junction by "squaring off" the kerb may affect the whole junction.

They have said it could now cost in the region of £5,900 - £7,100 for dropped kerb and £9,450 - £11,250 for a raised platform crossing. They will investigate whether they can reduce this by tying in a road closure with the 20mph scheme and if they only need to do the Post Office side. Highways to investigate as no-one wants to pay for something we don't want. CC/DC R Lindsay will try to get price down as PC & RL to pay for it. Currently it seems the cost outweighs the benefit.

Newberry Farmhouse/no. 22 High Street – CC/DC RL has asked for a site meeting, the complaint is now with the Speed & Safety team. The Benton Street bollards used as a similar solution is not ideal as they are difficult for drivers to see, therefore, not recommended.

Save the Water project – couldn't see what was going to be achieved. Flooding not a problem in Bildeston.

Parish Councillors carried out considerable work for the 'Our Water' project for SCC, but received nothing back. Clerk to forward email to CC/DC R Lindsay.

Bus Back Better and Bus Recovery Grant

The Government has written to highways authorities, including Suffolk to advise it that it is cutting the pot available for investing in buses from £3bn to £1.4bn. It is not clear



whether this will affect the £77m bid for bus improvements from Suffolk County Council. Separately the Bus Recovery Grant, which has been helping operators like Hadleigh Community Transport through Covid is due to expire at the end of April. There will be a temporary one-off payment to tide them through to the summer holidays and after that funding is yet to be announced.

The **Go Start bus service** has been put forward for a High Sheriffs Award.

The Parish Council was approached about an accident at end of Wattisham Rd. It was suggested a mirror was located at end of Wattisham Rd to improve visibility. CC/DC R Lindsay will raise with SCC although it was thought unlikely to get approval, as there is nowhere to put it in the right place. Reducing the speed on High Street is a better way forward.

Meeting reconvened 2006hrs.



This year Easter is late, and we enter the month of April with the church still in the season of Lent. Palm Sunday is on 10th April and then we begin Holy Week, Jesus travelling to the cross towards his death on Good Friday.
