ED'S COMMENT

Dr Hainsworth is engaging with patients of the Bildeston Health Centre at public meetings. The news that Dr Beale was leaving has forced the practice to consider all aspects of the way in which it cares for all its patients. Until now patients at Bildeston Health Centre have been relatively fortunate as Drs Hainsworth, Clarke and Beale, have worked hard to maintain a level of service higher than many other practices across the country. The Covid pandemic forced certain changes, introducing phone triage, priority appointments and a reduced number in the waiting room. But Bildeston Health Centre, unlike many others, kept significant face to face appointments with doctors, the Advanced Nurse Practitioner, the Practice Nurse team and the Healthcare Assistant team, brilliantly supported by the Management Team. We also have the wonderful team working the dispensary with a newly appointed Pharmacist.

Dr Beale's decision to go to Australia (where statistically 16 UK doctors a day are going!) has put the issues and challenges facing all GPs front and centre here, prompting the decision by Dr Hainsworth to share with us the need to have a rethink about the way in which the practice needs to be run for the future. It has already advertised for Dr Beal's replacement but the fact is qualified GP Doctors are hard to come by. Dr Hainsworth spoke with clarity and passion, describing the current situation. GP practices across the country are experiencing significant strain with rising demand set against declining numbers of GP doctors. The overall number of GPs has not grown much since 2015. In February 2020, the Government announced a drive to recruit an additional 6,000 GPs by 2024. Despite the promise, as of April 2022 (BMA latest data) there is now the equivalent of 1,622 fewer fully qualified full-time GPs compared to 2015. Between March 2021 and April 2022, the NHS lost 379 GP partners and 364 salaried and locum GPs. The number of fully qualified GPs actually decreased by 743 net in just under a year. Despite there being 1,622 fewer GPs today than there were in 2015, each practice has on average 2,026 more patients than in 2015. For GPs this means increasing numbers of patients to take care of. The average number of patients each GP is responsible for has increased by around 300 since 2015. In this part of Suffolk one GP is caring for around 2000 patients. Bildeston practice alone has increased by 20%.

The practice has no choice but to consider other ways of working to meet the growing demand with fewer doctors. Dr Hainsworth was clear on key points: Bildeston Health Centre will not close; they will appoint replacement doctor/s; Care Navigators will ensure patients receive the best care in the most efficient way; telephone and on-line appointment system will operate by the end of July. We need, therefore, to do what we can, as patients, to work with and support the changes felt necessary, trust in the professionalism of the staff and do our bit to care for the doctors and health centre staff who care for us.







UKRAINE APPEAL UPDATE

Firstly I would like to thank the various organisers of functions in the village where a collection has been made for the Ukraine Appeal and given to EPIC, the charity I work for. I am very grateful for all the gifts and interest shown in this local effort. I have just returned from a trip to Romania and Poland where I visited friends who are helping the refugees and I could see how our funds are being used. From every source it's clear that Ukrainians are trying to return home, or if not to their actual town then to be in the safest part of the country. The friend in the NW of Romania very close to the border, was cooking 60 meals twice a day for 7 weeks and taking them to refugees who didn't have any cooking facilities. Now the number is down to 16 people. Other friends have been bringing refugees from Chernovsky in Ukraine to their home and then taking them to the British Embassy in Budapest, Hungary, to apply for visas and then returning when the visas are eventually issued. This is a 300 mile round trip each time and they are happy to help in this small way. There is a lot of generosity and kindness being shown even after nearly 3 months of the war. When we talk of aid going into Ukraine it's usually food, medicines, hospital equipment etc but last week a commercial size dishwasher was transported across the border from Romania to an orphanage for disabled children inside Ukraine. The number of children has doubled from around 60 to 130 in the last few weeks. There are no extra staff to care for the children and having to wash up by hand after every meal has been taking up valuable time and so we were asked if we could supply a dishwasher. As soon as I transferred the money my friends started looking for a second -hand machine and they found one that came from a factory canteen that had closed down. I had to leave before they could transfer it by van to the orphanage but I now have the photos of it in the kitchen. Last month this orphanage asked for 100 duvets and pillows, and my friends found a lady in their town who made them, so the costs were half those in the shops. There are photos of the children stroking the duvets, they said they had never seen such pretty covers.

Even if the fighting ceases soon, the needs will go on for a very long time, we have all seen the pictures of destroyed houses and hospitals, the people are traumatised, life will never be the same again and I am so thankful that EPIC can help in a small way to make a difference. I shall be returning in the Autumn (if not before) and if you would like to see the photos there will be a display in the Baptist Church Lounge so come and have a coffee one Friday morning and see them.

Recipe of the Month Veggie Tahini Lentils

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients

serves 4

50g tahini
Zest and juice 1 lemon
2 tbsp olive oil
1 red onion, thinly sliced
1 garlic clove, crushed
1 yellow pepper, thinly sliced
200g green beans, trimmed
and halved
1 courgette, sliced into half
moons
100g shredded kale
250g pack pre-cooked puy



Method

- 1. In a jug mix the tahini with the zest and juice of the lemon adding 50 ml cold water to make a runny dressing, season to taste and set aside
- 2. Heat the oil in a wok or large frying pan over a medium-high heat. Add the red onion, along with a pinch of salt and fry for 2 mins until starting to soften and colour. Add the garlic, pepper, green beans and courgette and fry for 5 mins, stirring frequently.
- 3. Tip in the kale, lentils and the tahini dressing. Keep the pan on the heat for a couple of mins, stirring everything together until the kale is wilted and it is all coated in the creamy dressing.

CC/DC Robert Lindsay – Report from District and County Councillor Robert Lindsay **20mph scheme design**

This has just gone through the informal consultation stage. Although I and the parish council were supportive, and no one raised any other objections, the police are still objecting. They want no or shorter buffer zones and the 20mph limit to be along a much-reduced stretch of the High Street. I have asked that the county continue with the formal consultation. It is after all, Highways that have drawn up the design that police seem to be objecting to, so I hope the council can still approve it after formal consultation, even if the police object. In the meantime, I will endeavour to put some pressure on the Police Crime Commissioner and will be doing some publicity about Suffolk police non-cooperation with 20mph limits generally.

Newberry House

I have heard back from the officer on this following our site visit. He states that really the only viable options would be signs, given that utilities and the risk of ripping out utilities under the ground prohibit bollards.

Babergh – approves a five-point plan for cost of living crisis to ensure help gets to the right people.

Babergh – Things finally appear to move on Corks Lane project.

Ever since they moved out of their HQ in Hadleigh, Babergh Council have been trying to redevelop the building for housing, keeping joint ownership so that they can benefit from house sales. They have planning permission and a preferred contractor to convert the site to housing but this contractor has said costs have soared. The Cabinet on 8 June

agreed extra borrowing to finance the deal. Meeting reconvened 1918hrs.

Feasibility study continues, we still expect completion in August 2022.

Questionnaires have been hand delivered to all residential properties in the last 4 weeks (ca.500), via a door-knocking exercise. Many residents were spoken to and nearly 100 completed questionnaires have been returned. This will support a good quality of modelling of the heat demand in the village.

There is a Q&A Engagement and Site Visit session to be held on 25th June in the Chamberlin Hall.

Flyers have been distributed to all residential properties and laminated information notices will be going up in the usual places. SCENE Connect and Townrock experts will be available in Bildeston to make a presentation of Low Carbon Heat Networks and answer questions. BMSDC will be represented by Chris Knock.

Question: Will the Parish Council have any representation at the event? Yes. Budget Approval Process:

3 Payments to SCENE connect ltd, the consultant, are due at 3 milestones in the study. £6,688, £9,825 and £10,687 (Total £27,200 as budgeted). Plus VAT

The engagement agreement commits the Parish Council to make these payments as described. Given this, I'd like to formally ask the PC to pre-approve the Clerk to make these payments to SCENE as requested by Heating Bildeston represented by Gordon Mehrtens and Helen Carey. Approved.

This will avoid timing problems, especially with no PC meeting planned for August. Some other small spend has already been made against the Community Engagement and Technical budgets. Angela Chapman has received invoices for these and I respectfully ask for approval for payment of these amounts from the initial Heating Bildeston grant funding received by the PC in May. Approved.

Interest in the project is widening, with PMJ, The Health Centre, The Crown and The School as well as Babergh and Mid-Suffolk Councils and other village communities and University of Suffolk all keen to interact with Heating Bildeston.

Feedback from the people we speak to in the parish continues to be highly supportive. I am happy to take questions and once again thanks for your continuing invaluable support.

c) Update on village amenities

Village sign – delivered and being stored in a Councillor's garage, the base has been installed, the agreed knapp flints are awaiting delivery next week when the contractor will

finish off the plinth and erect the post and sign. It was agreed to have an official unveiling of the sign and invite James Taylor/ TMJ and James Buckle to attend who have donated the funds for the purchase of the sign. The sign to be covered up until unveiling. A plaque is to be erected. Clerk to arrange date/time for the unveiling ceremony.

The corner junction where the new sign is being erected is messy, District Council don't cut the grass very regularly. Clerk to arrange for PC contractor to cut the grass to keep the area tidy. PC will formalise the cutting and responsibility with BDC and add to PCs maintenance schedule. A site visit with interested parties – Cllrs Virginia Tuck and Ashley Hubbard, and the Clerk to propose a plan for planting for next meeting.

Grove cemetery- Cllr Virginia Tuck previously reported a broken manhole cover and taped off for safety. PC agreed to have the frame and cover replaced. Clerk to arrange.

Sports field & Pavilion -

Jubilee celebrations went off successfully, thanks to Chris Clarke for organising and to Elaine Talbott and Angela Chapman for help and support throughout.

The electricity meter for the pavilion supply has been replaced after vandalism, and the new one was damaged within 48 hours of it being fitted. Vandalism in the village seems to be quite an issue.
