
BILDESTON COMMUNITY SUPPORT WINTER APPEAL

Recipe of the Month Pumpkin Soup

with thanks to Alison

Ingredients

Whisk up this easy pumpkin soup for a warm Halloween gathering or safely managed fireworks party

For the soup

1kg pumpkin peeled, deseeded and chopped into chunks

2 tbsp olive oil

2 finely chopped onions

700 ml vegetable or chicken stock

150ml double cream

For the croutons

2 tbsp olive oil

4 slices whole meal seeded bread with crusts

removed

Handful of pumpkin seeds

Method

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a large saucepan then gently cook the chopped onions for 5 mins until soft not coloured
- 2. Add the pumpkin chunks to the pan and cook for further 8-10 mins stirring occasionally until it softens and turn golden
- 3. Pour the vegetable or chicken stock into the pan and season with salt and pepper. Bring to the boil then simmer for 10 mins until the pumpkin is very soft
- 4. Pour the double cream into the pan, bring back to the boil then purée with a hand blender.
- *At this point the soup may be frozen for up to 2 months*
- 5. To make the croutons, cut the slices of bread into small squares
- 6. Heat olive oil in a frying pan and fry until it becomes crisp
- 7. Add a handful of pumpkin seeds to the pan for a few minutes to toast
- 8. Serve these croutons and seeds scattered over the soup, drizzled with olive oil if wished



GUIDE TO GET THE BUGLE ON LINE

- Go to the Bildeston village website, type *bildeston.org* in any search engine and it opens on its main page;
- When open, scroll along the line next to the title and click 'news/events';
- Scroll down to the word 'Bugle' and click on it.

This opens the Bugle page. You have **two** ways to read the latest issue.

First, on the right hand side is a list of the years of all the Bugle issues. You can look at any issue by clicking on the *year* and then click on the *month* of the Bugle you would like to read. To read the latest click on 2022 and then the month. Click on the word 'download' and this November Bugle will open. This way opens a very large Bugle where each page fills the screen, and you have to scroll down to read through.

This is not the easiest to read and so we upload another version. This second way is much better. To open this version ignore the year and month list on the right and scroll down to the bottom of the Bugle page where a **picture of the very latest Bildeston Bugle is displayed**. Click on that picture and it opens up the Bugle in a new webpage called Flipbook. This works like a real magazine where you flip through all the pages and turn them as if you are reading a real newsletter, you even hear the pages turning and it is in full colour, so you see all the items, notices and adverts just as they were intended! It is free, no subscription, like some newspapers. If you need a particular advert or notice, you can even print off that page. When you have finished reading just click on the white cross in the top right corner and you are back to the village website. Please try it and use the on-line copy of the Bildeston Bugle as it needs to move in to the digital age and reduce the number of copies printed.

Pastoral Letter - November 2022 from Revd Elke Cattermole

"I thank my God in all my remembrance of you"

Philippians 1:3



It is a lovely feature when remembrance and gratitude are bound up together. In our past personal relationships, it is an important thing to have those special memories.

This year will in a way feel different on Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday. The first year without our previous monarch the late Queen Elizabeth II. The first time many of us will sing 'God Save the King' on Remembrance Sunday or for others who have not sung it since November 1951.

This year of 2022 we have heard how our armed forces are supporting the Ukrainian forces in diverse ways as the Ukrainians fight against their aggressors, Russia. The affect that war has had globally as well as the unbelief that yet again there is a war in Europe.
