





Recipe of the Month

Butterkuchen (Butter Cake)

You will need a 300ml pot of double cream for this no fuss, easy and very tasty cake recipe.

Preheat your oven to medium heat. Empty the cream into a mixing bowl, wash and dry the pot, this will now be your measuring pot for all further ingredients.

1 pot of cream

1 pot of sugar

1 pot of flour

4 eggs

2 level tablespoons baking powder

a dash of vanilla



Mix the above together briefly and pour into a deep baking tray lined with baking paper. Bake for about 15 minutes.

Whilst the sponge is baking, melt 250gr of butter in a pan, when melted add 1 pot of sugar, a bit of vanilla and 1-2 tbsp of milk, bring to a very brief boil (make sure the sugar has dissolved) and then add 200gr flaked almonds.

Pour the butter almond mixture onto the sponge, spread it out and bake for a further 10-15 minutes. You are looking for a good golden colour.

Best eaten slightly warm with a dollop of whipped cream! Oh....and the edges, where butter and almonds have gathered in a thicker layer, are the best bits! Enjoy! And show us your results! #bildestoncooks

February 2023 from Revd Elke Cattermole

Dear All,

I am writing this letter for February on a bright January frosty morning. The sun is coming through the trees and how uplifting it feels although cold. We are soon leaving January behind us and as we enter February, there is a slight concern still for what our futures hold. Many events will be happening in this country and over the world this year some good and some remain of great concern.
