

Treasure Island and The Silver Long Johns

Review from NODA - National Operatic and Dramatic Association

Firstly I must welcome The VIP's as a new member to NODA. They are a small group who were only formed a few years ago. Debbie had certainly had her work cut out and been a very busy lady by writing, directing, producing and covered many of the production jobs herself for this Panto.

We took our seats in this lovely village community centre which had been decorated with suitable piratical themed items. While waiting for the curtain to go up there were some old sea shanty songs playing in the background, a nice touch to set the scene. Caroline Gage opened as Luna the mermaid, and narrator who introduced us to the characters. She was sitting on her rock throne to the side of the stage and looked brilliant in her long flowing costume all colour coordinated in sea greens and sparkly make-up. There were 7 young people in the chorus as Pesky Pirates in their opening song 'Happy'. This and indeed all their songs were performed with energy, enthusiasm, plenty of volume and they certainly looked like they were enjoying themselves. Debbie was also in one of the leading roles as Jim Hawkins in this traditional storyline, as we see them go on a voyage to an island to find the treasure and their fun filled adventures along the way. Jim's mother, Hizzy Hawkins, the dame is played by Gray Searle complete with her silver long johns. He captures well the comedy of this outrageous lady with all her colourful costumes. Billy Bones (Colin Bartram) has the role of communicator with the audience. He gives us a flavour of Tommy Cooper with the 'fez' as he tries some magic tricks which all go wrong. His character certainly gave us plenty of laughs and had good comedy timing. Both these two captured their characters well, were confident in the roles and had some great songs.

One-Eyed Willy is the Pirate Captain (Rob England) along with Scarlett O'Scurvey (Hayley Hynard), she plays his admirer who has fun flirting with Willy. Coral Trelawny (Lorraine Pearce) along with her father Squire Trelawny (Dave Bruce) and Dr Liversausage (Kevin Bailey) complete this small cast apart from the delightful Crackers, the puppet Parrot operated by Pete Gamer.

This was a good traditional family village Panto which was well written with all the familiar "its behind you", plenty of comedy and some great spooky skeletons and natives played by the chorus. The set and props were constructed 'in-house'. They were effective and enhanced the production. I have already mentioned some of the costumes, these were locally sourced and all looked good and colourful and just what is required for a Panto. The audience were certainly very appreciative and we all had a very enjoyable evening.

Martin Simmonds talk about refugees was very informative and gave us cause to consider the plight of those seeking refuge in our country at present.

The Suffolk refugee Support charity has been in existence for 30 years and operates with a team of part time staff and volunteers. Their outreach work incudes providing language classes, sports activities and such basics as shoes for those arriving in flip-flops. Many asylum seekers have even had their mobile phones taken away as they entered the country - imagine not being able to contact your family, or view your stored photographs of them. Paperwork for these people can drag on for a year or more and meanwhile, they have no employment and are given an allowance of just £8 a week.

Martin told us the stories of refugee communities over the centuries. For those of you who know Ipswich, you may not have realised that Fonnereau (for whom the road is named) was also the builder and owner of the wonderful Christchurch Mansion - he was a Huguenot refugee 400 years ago! The largest ever influx of refugees into the UK was a quarter of a million Belgians who fled here in 1914, with boatloads of children arriving on our coast at places such as Southwold.

Martin had stories of families from Vietnam, Iran and other countries whom he has supported for years and

seen them and their children go on to own and run successful businesses, or work as doctors for instance. Not every story is the bad image of refugees and asylum seekers that the media present to us.

We started our Book Exchange with plenty of choice for the bookworms amongst us! This will now be a feature of our fundraising for the EAAA so bring along a book next time and take away a good read!





At our March meeting, we will have a visit from the Wesley Ukelele Band. I'm sure this will be a very entertaining evening with a chance to listen to the music making, sing along and even have a go at playing the Ukelele! I wonder if we have any budding Formby types amongst us!


New Planters



My employer asked me to work some extra hours lately, but I don't appear to have received the extra pay. I asked my boss about it and they said they would look into it, but I don't seem to be getting anywhere. What should I do?

If you think your pay is wrong, or you haven't been paid for extra hours worked, the best thing you can do is talk to your employer and find out what's going on. If you and your employer can't agree on how much you should have been paid, you can challenge them. You should act quickly though – it'll be harder to get your money after 3 months from the date the problem arose.

You should start by checking your payslip if you've got one. This will help you see how your pay has been worked out. Check things like:


- Whether you've been paid for the number of hours you've actually worked
- If you've been paid at the correct rate
- If you've been paid overtime, a commission or a bonus
- Whether you've been paid any sick pay
- If your employer has deducted any money that you weren't expecting

Ask your employer to explain anything you don't understand on your payslip or why you haven't been paid what you believe you are owed. If you disagree with anything, explain why. If your employer has made a genuine mistake, ask them to pay you the money you're owed straight away – you should not have to wait until your next pay day.

This delightful girl is friendly and


loving, but occasionally it might be on her terms. She just needs to find that special (preferably adult) home, or with older children where she would become part of the family.



Beetroot Hummus






BILDESTON PARISH COUNCIL

Draft minutes for the Parish Council meeting for Monday 13 February 2023, 19:00hrs, Baptist Hall, Duke Street, Bildeston.

C330/22/23 Minutes of Last Meeting held 9 January 2022, approved as true record with amendment to C314/22/23 road sweeper – corner Church Rd and Consent Lane, not Chapel Street. Minutes of meeting held 16 January 2023 approved a true record.

C331/22/23 Adjournments. Meeting adjourned 1910hrs to receive reports from County and District Councillors, and consider any matters raised by local parishioners.

CC/DC Robert Lindsay – report sent in absence as below – lpswich Road 48 houses

I am told the case officer at Babergh has agreed an extension on the outline planning permission to the end of March to allow time for Orwell to put in new reserved matters application of up to 48 houses. I have been told that if Orwell was to submit a completely new application (with more housing say) it would be judged under current circumstances, ie the fact Babergh currently meets its five year housing land supply target and "any other material change in circumstance" which I take to include the absence of the Joint Local Plan. The JLP, having been rejected by inspectors, is now years away from legal adoption. The JLP had put the site within the village built up boundary, but the Ipswich Road site is outside the boundary in the current local plan on which Babergh must now rely.

Babergh admits failure to meet health and safety standards for its tenants

The council has reported itself to the Social Housing Regulator for failing to keep up with checks on gas, electrical and asbestos safety checks for its council tenants.

Councillors were told at the end of November that the council had begun its own "in depth review" using two outside specialists. The first phase of the review included compliance, we were told. At the end of January they announced that:

- More than 150 properties had not received an annual gas safety inspection. Also carbon monoxide monitors were not yet installed in all relevant properties
- It did not have valid communal asbestos surveys for all its communal blocks. The Council reported over 70 (over 70%) of re-inspection asbestos surveys were overdue.
- More than 150 domestic properties do not have a current electrical condition report (meant to be every five years).
- Overall the council admitted there had been a lack of accurate data and record keeping around health and safety compliance.

The regulator found that there was the potential for serious detriment to Babergh tenants. Because the council had begun an urgent programme to remedy the matter, it would not take statutory action but would monitor the council closely.

The Assistant Director Housing left the council in the summer and a permanent replacement has yet to be found.

The Government tightened rules around council tenant safety after the Grenville Tower fire. I will be asking publicly what triggered the probe and if the backlog of housing repair work is also being investigated, particularly whether outside contractors are completing work in a timely manner.

Close to 40% of housing in Bildeston is social housing (though a big part of this is housing association) so this is relevant to our village.

Floods and drainage backlog

Due to a number of long-running flood issues in our Cosford division, which are not being prioritised by the county's drainage team, I requested details of what jobs had been done. Just 17 of the nearly 1000 flood and drain problems on Suffolk County Council's list have been completed. The extra £10m that was allocated in Dec 2021 to be spent over 3.5 years is being used for "low hanging fruit" — minor civil work — that are not in this list, and that work has been speeded up. Climate scientists have been predicting an increase in rain fall for some time, so it is a shame drainage repairs and maintenance appears to have been underfunded over the years.

County Council budget

For the 2023/24 budget the county council last week (9th Feb) voted to increase the council tax precept by 4%, (2% social care, 2% general tax) below the 5% cap the council is allowed. There are growing pressures from inflation, social care and childrens' services. By not going up to the full cap they are missing out on £3.78million and they will have to part fund a predicted shortfall partly by not budgeting for the extra social workers and occupational therapists they need. This is justified by the argument that in previous years they have not been able to recruit them. Our Green-led group proposed an amendment to go up almost to the 5% cap and use the extra to finance lower speed limits, help for libraries, electrifying community minibuses and extra specialist staff needed in social care. However, this amendment was voted down by the majority Conservative group.

Road re-classification Thorpe Green Lane

At the request of Thorpe Morieux Parish Council, I have asked County Highways to downgrade the classification of Thorpe Green Lane (from C to unclassified), and upgrade that of Bury Road (from unclassified to C) these will go to the Dept for Transport for final sign off and to GeoPlace who will in turn tell Ordnance Survey. The PC felt that satnavs were sending vehicles along narrow Green Lane instead of up the wider Bury Road. However, not all Satnav companies use Ordnance Survey for their information.

Resident – a representative from the Families Together toddler group, which uses the sports pavilion in Consent Lane as its venue, gave a report on the closure of the group. This was discussed at length, it was confirmed the PC are holding a small amount of funds from a previous toddler group. It was agreed and approved the PC would fund the venue for the group until the end of the Summer term, utilising the funds already held, when they will hopefully be able to find funding for the Autumn term. Sports Pavilion to invoice the PC directly.

Mozart imagines a very dramatic end of the world in the Dies Irae, the day of wrath - whilst Lacrimosa, the day full of tears, is very beautiful and sad. Mozart only wrote the first eight bars before he died. However, in composing the remaining parts Süssmayr may well have accessed Mozart's incomplete notes and have recalled previous discussions with the composer. Regardless of who wrote which parts of the Requiem it still sounds wonderful to most of us. As Beethoven said 'If Mozart did not write the music, then the man who wrote it was a Mozart.'



Pastoral Letter – March 2023

from Revd Elke Cattermole



Dear All,

Hope you are all keeping well as there appears to be outbreaks of ordinary 'Flu' and 'Colds.' This is normal at this time of year but left us with a slight apprehension since the pandemic.

March is the month I often think can be a slight crossroad for us all. This March we are into the season of Lent a time each year when we can reflect on what we are giving up or sharing with others. This year we have already seen such devastation in all its forms. Highlighted through the continuation of war in Europe, a natural disaster in the middle east and the concerns surrounding the of cost of living. Centuries ago, the Church developed a tradition of encouraging worshippers to make an annual pilgrimage to their 'Mother' Church on the 4th Sunday in Lent. This would often be at the local Cathedral and a time when people would share refreshments after the service. Local servant girls would be encouraged to attend and meet up with their families and especially their mothers. On the journey to the Cathedral the girls would pick wild spring flowers from the hedgerows and woods to make a posy to give to their mothers.

The tradition of meeting up with your mother's or remembering those mothers who are no longer with us gives a time of reflection. There is sadness when we see the breakup of families through war, natural disasters and through illness or tragic events. Many of you will visit your mothers or remember your mothers who are no longer with you. We can also remember those who have been like mothers to us. Remembering those who find that day very painful for whatever reason. Many though will be looking forward to having the opportunity to hug and enjoy as families that special day. I would like again to share this special prayer with all of you.

Loving God, Thank you for mothers and children and for all the joy of family life. Be with those who are grieving because they have no mother. Be with those who are struggling because they have no children. Be near to those who are sad because they are far apart from those they love. Let your love be present in every home and help your church to have eyes to see and hear the needs of all who come. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.
