


<u>The Wesley Ukulele Band</u> <u>perform for Bildeston Ladies Club</u>

It was a sad day that the baby and toddler group closed at the Sports Pavilion but new funding has been found for both training of volunteers and for the running of a new group which we hope will be opening very soon - full details in May's Bugle and on The Bildeston Noticeboard.

ENERGY FOR BILDESTON - THE FUTURE - YOU DECIDE

As most of the Bildeston residents will be aware of, there is at present a 'Heat Bildeston Scheme' being progressed. In simple terms this would involve deep bore-holes which would pump hot water to the properties in Bildeston via a network of pipework through the village Roads and Estates.

In the long term it is hoped this would provide hot water at a very competitive rate. However, recently where an exploratory bore-hole was being drilled on the Northern edge of the village for this scheme, another form of energy was discovered. A huge deposit of carbon neutral shale gas deep underground was discovered.

Contact has been made with L F Polario the USA Company making the discovery, and who are experts in this type of energy and have several plants like this operating in the USA. We believe within the USA they provide this type of energy free to households within a 2 mile radius of the extraction plant to compensate for any inconvenience caused.

One big advantage of this form of energy is that there would be no need for any pipework as each household would have their own storage tank, similar to an oil or propane tank which would be filled in the same way as oil/propane.

Also as electrical appliances need replacing, these could be replaced mostly by gas appliances, although televisions etc. might be excluded. Theses schemes are in the very early development stages, so it would be good to know what the Villagers thoughts are before either of these schemes are progressed further.





A treat for Easter - Toffee Amaretto Truffles

These truffles are unbelievably good, very easy to make and not even that naughty! Please do try them, you will be very pleasantly surprised. Great for Easter, as they are almost egg shaped (but you could turn them into hearts instead).

The ingredients

soft and fresh medjool dates

60g almond butter

2 tsp Amaretto (or use a drop of almond essence)

150g bar dark chocolate

1 tbsp finely chopped pistachio

sea salt flakes

Mix the Amaretto into the almond butter until smooth. Remove the stones from the dates and fill each date with

the Amaretto almond butter, squeeze the dates shut and freeze them for 5 minutes.



(To make heart shapes, cut the dates on the diagonal and stick them together to form a heart, freeze for a further 10 minutes)

Melt the chocolate and then dip each date into the chocolate, transfer to a wire rack and immediately sprinkle with the pistachios and a few sea salt flakes.

These will keep, when stored in an airtight container in the fridge, for up to a week.

Present: CC/DC Robert Lindsay, Cllr Andrew Guttridge, Cllr Ashley Hubbard, Cllr Sarah Leigh-Hunt, Cllr Richard Lester (Chair), Cllr Virginia Tuck (Vice Chair), 2x representatives from Anglian Water, 1x resident. Clerk – Angela Chapman.

C337/2223 Chairman's Welcome and Apologies: Chairman Lester welcomed all to the meeting. Apologies: Cllr Alex Banks, Cllr Ray McCann. Apologies accepted.

C338/2223 Declaration of pecuniary and non-pecuniary interests. Cllr Richard Lester – Kings Pightle Nature Reserve & St. Mary's Church PCC.

C339/2223 Requests for dispensations in respect of pecuniary interests. None.

C340/22/23 Minutes of Last Meeting held 13 February 2022, approved as true record.

C341/22/23 Adjournments. Meeting adjourned 1906hrs to receive reports from County and District Councillors, and consider any matters raised by local parishioners.

CC/DC Robert Lindsay – report as below.

20mph scheme design

I am told that Highways are aiming to get a firm proposal to put to us by the end of this month (March) and we can then arrange an online call for myself and PC reps to discuss with them.

Dropped kerbs by former Post Office

The cost estimate for this has now gone up because officers tell me a safety audit will need to be done because changing the shape of the junction by "squaring off" the kerb may affect the whole junction.

They have said it could now cost in the region of £5,900 - £7,100 for dropped kerb and £9,450 - £11,250 for a raised platform crossing. They will investigate whether they can reduce this by tying in a road closure with the 20mph scheme and also if they only need to do the Post Office side.

Newberry House

I have asked for a site meeting with highways to discuss with owners. Will update verbally if there is anything. Verbally updated it has been agreed to put a sign on the wall just before the property and warning colours on the porch roof.

Babergh Council to down-size accommodation

Babergh Cabinet voted to give back one of the two floors they rent at Endeavour House from Suffolk County Council, saving approximately £338,000. The majority of staff are now home working with some office visits for meetings etc.

Empty homes funding

Owners of empty homes may be eligible to an Empty Homes Renovation Loan designed to help improve vacant properties across the districts which have been empty for over six months and in need of significant repairs. Empty Homes Renovation Loans of up to £20,000 are interest free and can help to carry out a range of major repairs including installing a central heating system, electrical rewire or fixing a leaking roof.

Suffolk Biodiversity Recommendations

The cabinet approved plans to enhance the biodiversity of at least 30% of its land by 2030. This was a result of a motion we proposed a couple of years back and a cross party panel. Examples include ensuring 30% of council owned land is managed to enhance nature by 2030, planting more hedgerows, improving highway trees, and developing nature-based flood management solutions. Bus Back Better and Bus Recovery Grant

The Government has written to highways authorities, including Suffolk to advise it that it is cutting the pot available for investing in buses from £3bn to £1.4bn. It is not clear whether this will affect the £77m bid for bus improvements from Suffolk County council. Separately the Bus Recovery Grant, which has been helping operators like Hadleigh Community Transport through Covid is due to expire at the end of April. There will be a temporary one off payment to tide them through to the summer holidays and after that funding is yet to be announced.

Bildeston Parish Council Report from Anglian Water

Mark Pryke, Network Manager (Ipswich), Anglian Water representative attended the meeting with Darren Cody, Network Service Support Manager who knows the area well.

They were asked what the plan was for Bildeston.

Mark and Darren gave a comprehensive presentation on how Anglian Water works locally.

Maintenance to the main water pipe in Bildeston is coming to a head, the infrastructure in Bildeston is old, made worse due to climate change and movement of the soil.

The water to the village comes from Semer, and reservoir and tower at Nedging Tye. Water pressure also plays a part; it is very high in Bildeston because of the topography; however, pressure management cannot be used as it would mean the water then wouldn't reach neighbouring villages.

The recent road closure near the Health Centre was discussed, Mark explaining how AW have 15 year contracts with contractors, which gives continuity and co-ordination. However, the Parish Council explained it felt there is a lack of co-ordination between the various contractors and AW. Mark took this on board, explained that a full road closure, which is dealt with by a road traffic management company, has very high restrictions, though, AW acknowledged the works could be managed better and will work on this. Suffolk County Council Highways require the surface to be completely finished in one go, not a temporary fix with a return visit. All works must be carried out under The Red Book regulations.

Mark and Darren's operational team monitor works locally, reporting back to the central team. There are 5-year investments cycles with business plans built, jobs ranked for cost and maintenance, frequency and inconvenience to everyone. Any proposal goes to the repair team from Mark's team for approval.

With regards a timeframe, Mark's team are pushing for the whole main to be replaced. A feasibility study is being held very soon, which may give initial approval to the works subject to funding. There is 650 metres of pipe to be replaced through the High Street under the plan.

The Parish Council agreed to communicate with AW through Facebook, the village website and noticeboards to keep the village updated and informed.
