

Also, please remember that it is your responsibility to clean up your dog's mess and dispose of in a responsible manner. If you let your dog off the lead, then please ensure they don't wander into someone else's garden to relieve themselves. Bildeston has a large population of our canine friends, and the majority of their owners are very responsible and clean up after their dogs. However, there are a few that are not so responsible that spoil it for others, especially when someone treads in the mess, and walks into their house without realising. Please do the right thing and clean up your dog's mess.

Police Connect

Advice for dog walkers in the countryside.

Police are encouraging dog walkers to act responsibly whilst out with their dogs, particularly when around livestock.

If livestock are being worried by dogs it is a criminal offence. Dog owners have a responsibility to ensure that their animals are kept under control and whilst it is appreciated that the vast majority do so, there are a few that are still not getting the message.

Dog owners also need to recognise that a dog's actions reflect on the owner and a lack of control is neglect, and the consequences of neglect is a potential ban on keeping dogs/animals in future, and may result in the handler getting a criminal record.

Sgt Brian Calver of the Rural and Wildlife Crime Team said: "It's the time of year in the countryside where cattle are turned out onto the pastures for the summer. Many of these fields have footpaths going through them. It's against the law to have a dairy bull in a field with a footpath but beef breeds are allowed, with cows.

"The greatest risk is from cows with calves. People must understand that their loving pooch is a natural predator in the eyes of livestock. When cows have very small calves, they'll sometimes leave them hidden against tree lines or in long grass. If this is not known and somebody is walking towards it, the risks are increased hugely, as the cows natural instinct is to protect it's young. All in all, common sense must prevail, with mutual consideration shown for those using the countryside for leisure and those that are trying to earn a living."

In order to avoid these situations arising, police would urge the public to take extra care when out and always ensure your dog is secured on a lead whenever you're near livestock.

Stick to the path and keep your dog on a lead.

If the cattle are on the path, by all means deviate but consider ensuring you have an escape route.

If chased, let your dog go as that's generally what the cattle are after and the dog can run away a lot quicker than you.

Before entering the field, carry out a dynamic risk assessment and if in doubt, choose another route.

Farmers are advised to consider creating permissible rights of way during the time the cattle are in the field and ensure clear signage is put up. If some herds are known to be of greater risk, consider creating safe areas for the public to walk through with extra fencing.







It's asparagus season!

Poached asparagus:
A bunch of asparagus
A handful of rocket
A free range egg
Some parmesan
Oil and lemon

Remove the woody ends from the asparagus and put the whole bunch in a pan of gently boiling salted water. Cook until al dente, this should only take a couple of minutes or so. Heat a frying pan with a little oil next to your asparagus pan. Lift the asparagus out of the



water and dry on some kitchen paper. Break an egg into the barely simmering leftover asparagus water. While the egg is poaching, cook the asparagus in the now smoking frying pan for a few seconds to give a slightly caramelised and charred flavour.

Plate onto a little peppery rocket, shavings of parmesan, a drizzle of olive oil and a small squeeze of lemon, before topping with the poached egg.

C365/22/23 Adjournments. Meeting adjourned 1907hrs to receive reports from County and District Councillors, and consider any matters raised by local parishioners.

Ian Fieldhouse from Orbit Housing, Richard Sykes-Pophham, Popham Ltd gave a presentation for the development on land east of Artiss Close.

Orbit Housing Association purchased the land Oct 2022. The organisation manage approx. 48,000 in Norfolk, Suffolk and Cambridgshire, all are affordable schemes, social rent and shared ownership.

The presentation made clear the scheme of sustainable, high standard houses could be changed to address any issues. Once Reserved Matters application agreed Orbit will apply suitable house types to local architectural styles with Babergh DC housing team. Housing mix will be put forward by Babergh unless the community/ Parish Council comment otherwise.

Orbit Housing advised it is taking the lead from the district housing officer at Babergh, with the emphasis on district need, not local need.

Orbit are receiving a grant from Homes England Strategic Partnership, a Government quango, towards the development. Leases will be 900 years on shared ownership, giving security of tenure.

Management of housing and roads will remain in Orbit ownership, apart from adopted roads. Orbit will manage, not third party.

If technical works go well, works could start next summer (2024), with ecology and archeology works later this summer (2023).

Orbit Housing and Popwood Ltd left the meeting.

Sue Andrews, local historian, who manages and has catalogued the Henry Morphew Archives gave report, attached to these minutes. Sue offered to prepare a Powerpoint presentation, in her own time, which the PC approved, and gave thanks to Sue for all her hard work on Henry's Archives.

With regards the sorting of the boxes, Sue advised she is happy to store these for now at no. 18 Manor Rd, Bildeston. She considers she is holding on trust for village. PC need to make some formal agreement for future storage.

Pastoral Letter – June 2023 from Revd Elke Cattermole 'King Charles III Trooping of the Colour' and 'Father's Day'



King Charles III will continue with the round of doing things for the first time since becoming King on the death of his late mother Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

This year King Charles will celebrate his official birthday on the day of the 'Trooping of the Colour' on 17 June 2023 at Horse Guards parade. It is a historical event and called the 'Sovereign's birthday parade' or also known as the 'King's Birthday.

Parade.'

First performed during the reign of King Charles II (1660–1685), in 1748 it was decided that the parade of Trooping the Colour should mark the official birthday of the Sovereign. In 1760, after the accession of King George III, it became an annual event.

In 1892, the only member of the royal family to attend was Prince George, Duke of Cambridge, due to court mourning for the death of Prince Albert Victor, Duke of Clarence. Queen Victoria herself only attended Trooping the Colour once, in 1895, when it was held at Windsor Castle. Although some elements of the parade have remained constant, the ceremonial seen today was not fixed until 1889.

June is also a time when we annually remember our Fathers as we celebrate Father's Day, this year on Sunday 18 June. Not a church celebration in the same way as 'Mothering Sunday' but the role of father is a significant role. Many fathers will have difficult relationships with their children for a number of reasons. Our King's relationship with his youngest son has taken place in full glare of the public.

Whether any of our relations with our fathers have been good or bad there is one Father. God, who is above all fathers.

So all of you who can enjoy a time with your fathers and grandfathers this year and even have a chance to have a holiday with them, make it an exceptional time.
