

NEW WATER MAIN FOR BILDESTON

Bildeston Parish Council is pleased to announce that Anglian Water are looking to invest in the replacement of the water main along Bildeston High Street. The works are likely to commence between April 2024 and March 2025 and will take approximately sixteen weeks to complete.

The water main replacement will be done in four phases, running continuously:

- 1. Ipswich Road Newberry Road;
- 2. Newberry Road Chapel Street;
- 3. Chapel Street Wattisham Road;
- 4. Wattisham Road northern end of village.

The Parish Council has emphasised the need for the necessary road closures to be clearly signed with the precise location of the closure and notice given prior to any changes. Pedestrian access along the High Street will remain throughout.

All Bildeston residents will shortly receive a letter from Nigel Plumb, Anglian Water Delivery Engineer for the project, regarding a non-invasive Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) survey to be carried out along the High Street on the evening of 31st July as part of the design process currently underway. Please can you assist with this by ensuring that no vehicles are parked in the High Street on the evening of 31st July to ensure that a full survey of the carriageway can be undertaken. Alternative parking is available at Market Place and Chamberlin Hall car park.

In early 2024 a drop-in session will be held in Chamberlin Hall with the Anglian Water team in attendance to answer all your questions. By then the design process should be complete.

The Parish Council has formed an excellent working relationship with members of the Anglian Water team, and we will be keeping in regular contact as the work proceeds.

It is barely more than six months since the Parish Council contacted Anglian Water to complain about the frequency of emergency road closures caused by water leaks along the High Street. When we met Mark Pryke, Network Service Manager, in March, Bildeston was low on Anglian Water's priority list of substantial works and had not yet been approved. We pushed Bildeston's case hard but did not expect a result quite so soon!

providing refreshments for the afternoon.


Panathlon Event






The facility has recently been hired as a wedding party venue as well as for other events and was a great success providing outdoor space as well as licensed premises.





Recipe of the Month

Chicken, Mango & Chilli Salad

Serves 1 1 little gem salad 30ml French dressing Toasted Sesame oil 1 chicken breast, cooked and skinned 1 ripe Mango (or a small pack of fresh mango chunks)

1 spring onion, sliced 1/2 small red chilli, very finely diced Fresh coriander leaves



To serve:

Lime wedges

Warmed bread & Greek yoghurt, sprinkled with a pinch of sea salt (for dipping the pitta in)

Wash and shred the little gem and place it on a deep plate. Measure out the dressing and very carefully add just a drop or two of sesame oil. Cube the chicken breast and mix with about the same amount of mango, it's nice to have similar seize mango cubes, pour the dressing over and mix well. Now pile the chicken/mango/dressing mix onto the salad and sprinkle with chilli, spring onion and coriander

Ex-Suffolk teacher Stephen Lightly from Bildeston raising aphasia awareness

A former maths teacher from Suffolk who had undergone a stroke and struggled with aphasia is now raising awareness of the condition that affects 350,000 people across the UK.

A father-of-three, Stephen Lightly, had to relearn how to speak, write, and work with numbers after a stroke in July 2020.

The 62-year-old man from Bildeston suffers from aphasia, which causes difficulties with language and speech.

Having limited speech after his stroke, the Suffolk man has managed to get back to some of his favourite hobbies, including producing maths worksheets for schools, and even recently Mr Lightly said: "My speech in hospital was terrible, although I thought that it was totally normal myself.

"I would avoid contacting people directly and would try to use email. I soon became really aware of my speech, and it really knocked my confidence.

"I knew I couldn't return to work at the school any time soon, and that was really upsetting.

"My speech improved through talking at home with my family, the help of the Stroke Association, and the people at Livability Icanho Brain Injury Rehabilitation Centre."

Mr Lightly added that his youngest daughter, who is now nine, helped him get back to health.

He added: "I think that she was very deeply hurt by my stroke and near death. "We are just beginning to do things together again, I guess that we are healing together."

Now, Mr Lightly wants to help others understand more about what aphasia is and the impact it can have on those affected.

Stephen is backing the Stroke Association's campaign, which includes a launch of a documentary on Channel 4, showcasing brand-new research into stroke and aphasia.

There are 1.3 million stroke survivors living in the UK, and about 40 % of patients will experience aphasia after their stroke.

Almost half of people in the East of England have never heard of the condition, despite 350,000 people living with it nationwide.

The documentary can be watched online at www.stroke.org.uk or streamed on Channel 4.







Further to report CC Robert Lindsay has received a request for a grant from the Bowls Club for drainage works on the green. DC Saw suggested the club apply to Sport England.

DC Deborah Saw

Report from Babergh District Councillor, Deborah Saw can be seen on www.bildeston.org

Further to the report DC Deborah Saw advised the Neighbourhood Team manager had visited the village and will work towards a tidy frontage at the site in question.

A new grant window opens on 31st July. The grants team will look at a grant for B Natural.

The JLP (Joint Local Plan) will hopefully be approved soon which includes policies. Part 2 of the JLP will be for allocation of sites. The site in Wattisham Rd was brought to Cllr Saw's attention. Cllr Banks to forward consultants report, the Parish Council had carried out, to District Cllr Saw.

EV chargers were mentioned, the PC have applied to SCC but heard nothing for some while. DC Saw will contact the Environmental team at Babergh DC.

PC enquired if a grant was available for a defibrillator as the one at the health centre has been out of order for months. DC Saw will look into.

Gave apologies for September meeting.

Polly Williams and Jamie Watson/Anglian Water Cross Boundary – Hybrid planning application - presentation/ Q&As on the project.

The works area from Bury St Edmunds to Colchester will affect Bildeston along with 12 further planning authorities. They are speaking to all Parish Councils.

Due to climate change, a 20% increase in growth and increase in water need has necessitated these work. The East of England is the driest part of the country and water in this area could run out by 2030 without works being carried out. The license runs out at the end of 2024.

The BSE to Colchester pipe is 88 kilometres, of a total of 330 kilometres.

Planning permission should be granted over the next 2 months. Road closures touch the edge of the parish of Bildeston from a wider transport area. Materials are sourced from Huntingdon and will therefore travel east to west along the A14. There will a pipe store in Hitcham. The Parish Council requested works traffic does not use the High Street in Bildeston. AW advised they ask the drivers, who are sourced from local quarries, not to use certain roads but have no jurisdiction over their route.

Public Rights of Way footpaths that go through the works area will have fenced diversions around.

Hedges have been coppiced at the beginning of the year, trees have been left as far as possible and any trees with TPO (Tree Preservation Order) on will be fenced off. Trees will be replanted with a 5 year maintenance plan, with a 20% enhancement.

There is an ecologist Clerk of Works on site. Ground nesting birds will be discouraged from nesting before the works commence.

Timetable – late summer this year to enable phasing, mitigation ecology works, autumn will see hedgerows and any trees removed; December – road closures for pipe sleeves installation; January/ February – road closures, ensuring signs are as informative as possible.

Any archaeological digs done, AW go above and beyond.

Nigel Plumb – Project Engineer, Lee Forster – Senior Engineer, Gary – Kier/ Anglian Water – Mains water pipe replacement.

Due to the many emergency road closures due to 20-30 bursts/ leaks from the mains pipe in the High Street Anglian Water have approved investing in replacing the 650 metre mains water pipe under the High Street. Initial funding should give the go ahead for works in April 2024, to enable completion of the works before the end of the summer and harvest beginning.

The works will be carried out in 4 phases, a map showing each phase will be available on www.bildeston.org as well as the AW site. The overall works will be approximately 16 weeks. This is subject to works going as planned, if the old mains pipe fails whilst the new one is being installed, this is unfortunate, and will lengthen the works time.

Each phase will be commissioned and then that section completed with properties being connected to the new main before moving onto the next phase.

Access to the health centre and the school will be maintained from one end with a hard closure the other end. SCC Highways are involved with the road closures and both the Parish Council and Anglian Water have requested informative bespoke signs advising the public of the actual roads closed and timings.

All service connections from the mains pipe to all properties on the High Street will be replaced to ensure longevity of the project. There will be an approximate 4-hour interruption of water with a 48-hour notification for this part of the work.

All businesses affected have been contacted and consulted with by Anglian Water.

AW Communications team will keep information updated via AW website, social media, letter drops, and the Parish Council, there will be information on the village website www.bildeston.org

As Bildeston is a medieval village a GPR survey will be carried out one evening to survey the archaeological interests at the end of July/ beginning of August. AW will liaise with SCC Archeological team to share the data. All residents affected will be contacted soon by Anglian Water.

AW are aware of the water courses and culverts under the High Street.

Report from Babergh District Councillor, Deborah Saw - 10th July 2023

Joint Local Plan

BMSDC's modified Joint Local Plan, Part One, was submitted for examination by the Planning Inspectorate and was discussed at hearings two weeks ago. The Part 1 Plan sets out the vision and objectives for development in the two Districts and it contains a set of strategic and local policies to guide development to 2037.

The hearings are on YouTube and can be accessed via the link below and cover the examination plus issues raised by groups such as Natural England, poultry farmers and developers, https://www.youtube.com/@bmsdcilp1676/streams

Part Two of the Plan is critical as it will contain an up-to-date settlement hierarchy and a spatial distribution of any housing allocations. The Council is focused on obtaining Secretary of State approval by the winter of 2025.

Paddocks Way Issue

I raised the issue with Tenancy Services and the Neighbourhood Team who deal with communal places. I have asked for feedback from them, but I haven't heard anything as yet. I will follow-up again Monday, before the PC meeting.

Capital Grants

It was unfortunate that the Sports Pavilion was not successful on this occasion in securing a grant. However, I believe the Babergh Grants Team did give advice as to how you might succeed next time. The next window for applications opens on 31st July and closes on 1st October. One Parish Council received the highest grant of £10,000 to help install solar panels so it can be done!

Tour of Britain, Thursday 7th September

Stage 5 of the Tour will come down from Stowmarket go through Needham and Barking, turn off just before Battisford Tye and go through Wattisham via Weir Road, Hitcham Road, Bildeston Road, Needham Lane, Wattisham Road then into Bildeston and out to Hadleigh. The whole stage will be broadcast on ITV4.

There will, of course, be road closures and parking restrictions but the tour organisers will be sending out estimated times of arrival. The Suffolk Councils have launched a Taste of the Tour website which hosts a Toolkit for local businesses and an Interactive Bike Trail for cyclists and families.

I am meeting with the Grants Team to explore further funding sources. Babergh Councillors can put forward a project for a Locality Award. Each councillor has an annual budget of £2,000 and as NW Cosford contains seven villages that means each donation can only be £285. I have sent the relevant paperwork to Tim Hooper, but I will continue to pursue other sources.

Possible other funding from Sports England

The Small Grants Programme seeks to develop opportunities for communities to get more people physically active. New projects from not-for-profit organisations will be supported through providing National Lottery funding of between £300 and £15,000.

They want to support projects that bring communities together and provide sport and physical activities for people who may be less physically active.

They also particularly want to support projects focusing on environmental sustainability.

Report for Bildeston Parish Council by County Councillor Robert Lindsay – 8th July 2023

Replacing the water main on Bildeston High Street

It was good to meet with the Anglian Water engineer, your clerk and Cllr Tuck last week to hear about the plan to replace the leaking water main on the High Street. He has said he is happy to liaise with parish councils which is good news. Work is scheduled to commence around April 2024 and to last for three or four months, in four phases with closures of different stretches of the High Street at each stage. I will be letting other parishes in Cosford know about this so that people are prepared. The strong message I have had from residents around Bildeston is that they would rather bear with a long, fore-warned closure than continue with the frequent emergency unplanned closures as the ageing Victorian mains pipe springs successive leaks. Bildeston residents on the High Street will need to move their cars out of the closure zone beforehand if they wish to continue using them while their stretch of the High Street is closed.

Libraries funding

In June the county cabinet agreed to plug a £960,000 funding gap for the libraries service until the end of its contract in July 31st 2024. It is this week (Tues 11th July) being recommended to agree to raise the annual funding of library service from £5.992m to £6.842m per year and to seek a competitive tender to run the libraries for the next six years, with an option to renew for another six years. Officers have ruled out taking the service back in house or creating an arms length company to run it, as they say this will increase the running costs. The funding will not be subject to annual inflationary increases, so it will be up to whoever wins the contract to make savings or raise funding to meet inflationary costs. There will be a public consultation for 14 weeks from October this year to January 2024. The existing contract will be extended for 10 months to allow time for the consultation and tender process which will begin June 2024.

New contractor for streetlights

Highways have awarded a new contract for street light maintenance to J McCann for an initial term of 7 years, with the option to extend for a further 3 years. J McCann is based in Nottingham and are part of the McCann Group who have offices located across the UK, with the nearest current office in Brentwood, Essex.

Pastoral Letter – August 2023 from Revd Elke Cattermole
