

Mushroom & Lentil Soup with Miso

A very earthy, warming and thick winter soup, perfect for cold January days. Leave out the Crème Fraîche (and milk) and it's vegan.

Olive oil
1 onion, diced
4 cloves of garlic, minced
500g mushrooms, sliced
1 1/2 tsp fresh thyme, finely chopped
950ml vegetable stock
100g brown lentils
1 tbsp Miso paste

fresh parsley crème fraîche

In a large stockpot cook the onion in some olive oil until translucent. Add the garlic and mushrooms and cook for 10 minutes until the mushrooms have reduced and most of the water they release has evaporated Next stir in the thyme and let it cook for a minute or two. Now add the stock and the lentils, then simmer for 25 minutes.

Blend the soup thoroughly, then stir in the miso paste. If the soup is too thick for you, just add some more vegetable stock (or milk! Odd, I know, but it works!) until you have the consistency you like!

Check for seasoning.

Serve topped with some extra mushrooms and a good blob of crème fraîche and freshly chopped parsley.



Find out more about the support in your area

Help to heat your home:

- Prepayment meters if you are unable to top up your prepayment meter, Citizens Advice can offer you advice and may be able to refer you for charitable support. You can also contact Warm Homes Healthy People Suffolk for support, advice and an in home survey from a Pre Pay Coordinator. Call 07769 365796 or email prepay@eastsuffolk.gov.uk.
- Local Welfare Assistance Scheme This hardship grant offers payments up to £300 towards the cost of essentials, including energy. Visit the Suffolk County Council website for more information and to apply.
- Surviving Winter offers help, such as fuel vouchers or support for alternative fuels like oil and LPG, to help
 you heat your home. Apply online via the Citizens Advice Ipswich website or call 01473 298634 to find out if
 you are eligible.

Residents:

Noise nuisance TMJ Interiors – several residents gave their comments to the meeting and to Clare Taylor/ TMJ, advising the noise is disrupting everyday life when residents are in their homes. DC Deborah Saw has been liaising with the Environmental Protection Officer at Babergh, Clare Taylor/ TMJ and residents.

TMJ have been pro-active in trying to solve the problem, fitting a new flexible silencing connection which unfortunately didn't have the desired effect. A bespoke part is now on order, but with no set delivery date from the manufacturer. Acoustic engineers have attended the facility, TMJ are doing all they can to mitigate the issue and whilst this is happening BDC Environmental Protection officer can do no more other than monitor the situation.

Clare Taylor advised they have fired up the old heating system which is used until 10.00am each working day to lessen the noise nuisance early in the morning.

Residents from various places in the village reported hearing the noise, there seems to be no rhyme or reason as to where the noise is heard, it is thought that could be down to atmospheric conditions. Some residents were encouraged by the commitment of TMJ to solve the problem and the fact the company are not using fossil fuels.

TMJ will shut down on 20th December and re-open 2nd January 2024.

From Babergh District Council's Senior Environmental Protection Officer.

Please find below the District Council's position relating to noise from TMJ Interiors.

The Council became aware of reports of a droning/hum from TMJ at the end of September. Since then, we have been in regular contact with TMJ and are fully apprised of the work they have been doing to resolve the matter – all of which has been proactive. They have been open and honest with the Council about the issue and their actions to resolve it.

We understand that the noise has arisen as an unintended consequence of an upgrade to their heating/boiler system (in order to be more environmentally sustainable) and both an acoustician and the system installers have attended to try and resolve the matter. It is thought that the noise is being caused by a section of ductwork vibrating. The acoustician identified that installing a flexible connector to part of the system should improve the situation. The plant is a bespoke system, so it is not possible to obtain an "off the shelf" part. There will therefore be delays whilst parts are ordered and manufactured. A temporary sleeve was installed as an interim measure but unfortunately this has not had the desired effect.

We understand the bespoke sleeve should be delivered shortly and should provide a permanent resolution. The company are also sourcing some additional silencers should this prove necessary and are even looking at an entirely different fuel feed system for the boiler if all else fails.

The Council considers that TMJ are doing everything that could be reasonably expected of them at this time. Whilst we understand residents' frustrations about the noise, we are satisfied that the company are actively trying to resolve it.

We further understand TMJ are operating the boiler at reduced hours in order to provide as much respite for residents as possible. Residents should be assured that the Council will continue to monitor the situation and TMJ's response to it.
