Whilst there are many old houses in Bildeston with long histories, people with new houses should remember that all these houses are built on sites which have a traceable history. For instance, the house now owned by Bob Halls occupies part of an ancient meadow described in the Court Rolls of the Manor of Bildeston, as follows:

"All that land, meadow or pasture called 'Jarvis's Pightle' and held freely of this Manor by the ancient yearly rent of 8d.

- 1657 Thomas Symonds inherits from Thomas Symonds, his uncle.
- 1664 Richard Symonds inherits from Thomas Symonds, his father.
- 1666 Frances Marven, wife of John Marven of London, inherits from Richard Symonds, her brother.
- 1671 Thomas and Mildred Revett purchase from Frances Marven
- 1714 Susan Hardy, Elizabeth Lasleton and Margaret Revett inherit from Mildred Revett, their mother.
- 1715 Thomas and Susan Hardy buy out Elizabeth Lasleton and Margaret Revett.
- 1740 Thomas Hardy inherits from Susan Hardy, his aunt.
- 1760 John Kemball, baker, purchases from Thomas Hardy.
- 1796 Ann Field inherits from John Kemball, her father.
- 1851 John Kemball Field purchases from the executors of Ann Field
- 1860 Thomas Denny, gentleman of Ipswich, purchases from John Kemball Field
- 1869 Charles Denny, corn merchant of London, inherits from Thomas Denny, his father.
- 1908 Charles Denny, gentleman of Surbiton, inherits from Charles Denny, his father. All freehold rents due to the Lord of the Manor now extinguished.

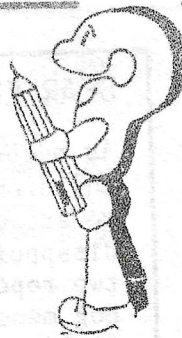
